In a report submitted to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund in regard to these requests, I recommended that, for the present, authority be granted only for the issue of bonds to the amount of \$2,675,204,54, and stated that later in the year, if it should be found feasible to make further investments in these bonds by the Sinking Fond, another resolution authorizing an additional amount could be presented to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund.

I have now in state that it is possible for the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund to invest surplus revenues of the Sinking Fand in Corporate Stock for the uses of the Department of Docks and Ferries to the amount of \$1,000,000; and that amount of money being required by the Board of Docks for use for the bulance of the year 1898, I recommend the adoption of the following resolution.

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund : GENTLEMES-On June 9, 1898, a resolution was adopted by the Communisoners of the Sinking Fund authorizing a lease to be made for a term of one year from May 7, 1868, of certain robots in the Westmurchaud, used by the Fire Department as night quarters for the Chief ni Department. The previous lease of these rooms expired November 1, 1897. It appears therefore that the Fire Department has been occupying these rooms from November 1, 1897, to May 1, 1898, without a lease, and on this account no payments have been made by the Department of Finance. With the addition of the annexed district, the extraordinary growth in population of this city and the great increase in crime due to the immigration in recent years of a large number of indesirable persons who minter anderstand our language nor our laws, the business of the office of District Automey has increased enormously. My predecessor as District Attorney, the Honorable William M, K. Olcott, saw this as soon as he ended upon the daties of his office, and thus the business of the office was vapidly falling into arrear, and that the staff was not antichent to keep up with accomplating indicaments. He was therefore obligst to greatly increase the number of Deputy Assistant District Attorneys, and to-day there are eight statutory Assistant District Attorneys and filteen Deputy Assistant or Special Deputy Assistant District Attorneys, all dimentity employed, carly and late, in the performance of appropriate duties. With this increase of staff there are not enough rooms. Even as it is, there are two assignments to every one of the heliare-mentioned " prison cells," which greatly retards business, because each of the two Trial Assistants in a room may be preparing cases for trial and require the presence of witnesses, and it is impossible that both can conduct their examinations at the same time in the same room.

The nocessities of the public business have required a large increase in the number of Solptena Servers. Stenngraphers and Messengers, and as to these it is to be said that there is no accommo-dation for half of them.

The Chief Clerk and Deputy Chief Clerk are providently without offices. There is not sufficient space for the vectords of the office, which is a public office and includes, among other matters, Coroners' impacts.

Since January 1 the office has been called upon to consider indictments against over 5,000 persons.

This is a wooderful record of which the Commissioners may well be proud. Mevertheless many of the most eligible rooms necessary in the administration of criminal justice are assigned to the uses of the Board of Health. The presence of the Civil Service Commission is also another anomaly, some of their rooms being upon the top floor and others on the lower—and in the month of June 2,100 people were evanined.

Often recently the ground floor for several days at a time has been blocked by hundreds of laborers in line awaiting to be registered by the Civil Service Commission, so that it has been inconvenient for persons in attendance on the Courts as witnesses to get through the lines to the elevators. The elevators are constantly crowded with all these mixed classes indexed of being devoted exclusively to the uses of those who are in attendance upon the Courts of Jastice. The Clerk of the Court of General Sessions, with the records, is on a meaning floor and in monded quarters.


