STATE INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION—
DEPARTMENT OF LABOR.

Resolution Adopted.

Whereas, the Bureau of Inspection has submitted to this Commission appeals filed by the appellants noted from orders issued by the Division of Factory Inspection against the premises stated, the granting of which appeals would necessitate a variation of law; and

Whereas, the Division of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made of the premises in each case, and upon the reports submitted gives the existing conditions and recommends as follows:

No. 1. Premises affected, Amsterdam Building, 21; appellant, Stephen Sanford & Sons, Inc. 1—Prohibit occupancy, 2—Additional exit, May 6, 1918. 4-story and cellar nonfireproof mill, constructed before Oct. 1, 1913; open lots; sprinkler; no combustibles; fire alarm; occupancy, 7; above 1st floor, 1; exits, one interior stairway enclosed with fireproof material, doors to which open in and are not self-closing; no egress from roof. There is a large drying machine on 2d floor which makes it difficult to install stairway.

Recommendation: Accept an interior straight ladder through floor at northeast corner of building, extending down to 1st floor, and from 1st floor on outside of building to ground, to which open in and are not self-closing; no egress from roof. There is a large drying machine on 2d floor which makes it difficult to install stairway.

Recommendation: Accept an interior straight ladder through floor at northeast corner of building, extending down to 1st floor, and from 1st floor on outside of building to ground, to which open in and are not self-closing; no egress from roof. There is a large drying machine on 2d floor which makes it difficult to install stairway.

No. 3. Premises affected, Buffalo, 1517 Niagara st.; appellant, Buffalo Ice Cream Cabinet Co. Provide an exhaust system for dust creating machinery. Feb. 21, 1917. When this order was issued there were from 8 to 10 men employed and several machines would be running at the same time, which would fill the shop with dust; for the past few months but two men have been at work, and no work will be done throughout the summer.

Recommendation: While occupancy remains unchanged permit the boxing in of the under part of the dust-creating machines, with a door to be provided so that dust and dirt may be removed daily. If upon next reinspection it is shown that the dust hazard is eliminated to an extent to render same uninjurious to health, order for exhaust system to reissue at that time.

No. 4. Premises affected, Buffalo, 18 Norris st.; appellant, J. G. Davidson. 2—Make roof of stairway enclosure of fireproof material 4 inches thick. 5—Enclosure of stairway fireproof. May 23, 1918. 2-story nonfireproof building, erected since Oct. 1, 1913; divided lots; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; no fire alarm signal system; occupancy, 32-37, 30 of whom are factory employees; above 1st floor, 10; exits, one interior fireproof stairway 42 inches wide, and does not extend to roof; exterior concrete stairs 48 inches wide built at westerly end, but not enclosed; exits remote; no safe egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept present interior stairway as now constructed, and exterior stairway when same has been enclosed with partitions of fire-resisting material in accordance with Rule 504-C of the Industrial Code.

No. 5. Premises affected, Buffalo, 32-34 Churchill st.; appellant, Cutler Desk Co. Provide exits in accordance with section 79-a. Jan. 10, 1918. 2-story building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; measuring 50 by 150 feet, connected at northeast corner with 2-story office building by means of a bridge covered with metal, top, bottom and sides; a stairway at northwest corner enclosed fireproof and an exterior stairway unenclosed and constructed of wood located at southwest corner; at time of inspection 14 were employed in building, 10 on 2d floor.

Recommendation: Accept as exits from building the horizontal exit, the fireproof enclosed stairway, the unenclosed wooden stairway, No. 5. Premises affected, Cadesia; appellant, Cadesia Mfg. Co. 9—Two means of exit from all floors, as per section 79-a. 11—Prohibit occupancy, 2-story nonfireproof building, erected since Oct. 1, 1913; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm signal system; occupancy, 23; above 1st floor, 16; exits, four interior stairways, one enclosed fire-resisting and one enclosed fireproof; doors open outwardly and are self-closing; exits remote; no egress from roof; two imperfect horizontal exits on each floor. All terms of variation granted April 29, 1917—variation. 2-story nonfireproof factory building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm signal system; occupancy, 9; above the 1st floor, none regularly. There is an unenclosed interior stairway, doors to which open outwardly; building measures 36 by 66 feet; used for the manufacture of brush backs; 2d floor used for storage, except occasionally one man works on said floor filing saws; otherwise only visited when removing or placing stock.

Recommendation: Accept present stairway as one means of exit, and as additional exit accept an exterior wooden stairway located at northerly end of building, said stairway to be provided with proper handrails and roofed over; exits to be accepted so long as conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

No. 6. Premises affected, Johnson City (Fibre Board Mill); appellant, Endicott-Johnson & Co. Appeal for variation to permit use of 3d floor for factory purposes on providing a 2d means of exit. This is a 6-story building, used above the 2d floor for storage purposes only. Variation heretofore granted, accepting as one means of exit a fireproof enclosed stairway; on the 1st and 2d floors there is provided a horizontal exit 8 feet wide; on 3d floor is an outside counterbalanced stairway 30 inches wide which reaches to grade at 2d floor; two spiral chutes, 6 feet in diameter, protected at each floor by fire trap doors, which chutes extend from 3d to 6th floors; it is now desired to employ 60 people on 3d floor and continue the use of the 4th, 5th and 6th floors for storage.

Recommendation: Accept as second means of exit from 3d floor a 44-inch exterior screened stairway, said stairway to be located at or near the location of the present counterbalanced stairway.

No. 7. Premises affected, Lynbrook, 47 Broadway; appellant, Atlantic Knitting Mills. 1—Change metal bars at windows so that same will be readily openable. 2—Provide rubber mat at switchboard. May 4, 1918. 2-story building measuring 50 by 100 feet, of nonfireproof construction, with one-story extension; there are 15 females and 10 males on 1st floor; 10 females and 3 males on 2d floor; 2d floor windows unobstructed; stationary iron bars are provided on outside of all first floor windows; exits, two inside and one outside stairs from 2d floor; two exit doors on front and one exit door at side of building to street; one exit door leading to first story extension, and thence to open lot; one 10-foot double door at rear, leading to open lot on 1st floor, flooring of 1st floor is cement.

Recommendation: In view of the fact that there are five exits from 1st floor leading to open area, waive order No. 1 while present conditions obtain; order No. 2 to be complied with.

No. 8. Premises affected, McGraw; appellant, Central Paper Box Co. Provide suitable and convenient inside water closets for use of employees. No sewage in McGraw; number of employees makes it inadvisable to install chemical closets; present facilities located some ten feet from factory proper, and are reached by means of covered passageway; factory proper heated by steam; should pipes be laid to connect with building wherein closets are located they would be apt to freeze during the winter.

Recommendation: Accept a watertight concrete container with a superstructure properly screened at both windows and doors to keep out flies; in the construction, proper ventilation to be provided, and said privy to be located convenient and cleanly as regards both use and cleaning; concrete container to be emptied regularly and proper care taken as to cleanliness and sanitation to avoid possibility of nuisance being created; same to be accepted without providing means of heating in winter until the next regular inspection.

No. 9. Premises affected, Rochester, 158 St. Paul st.; appellant, L. Black Co. Fireproof openings on course of fire escape. 6-story building with a party balcony fire escape with nonfireproof openings; sprinkler heads installed over openings to form an adequate water curtain.

Recommendation: Acceptance of sprinkler heads in lieu of fireproofing openings.

No. 10. Premises affected, Rochester, 158 St. Paul st.; appellant, Goldwater & Co. Fireproof openings on course of fire escape. 6-story building with a party balcony fire escape with nonfireproof openings; sprinkler heads installed over openings to form an adequate water curtain.

Recommendation: Acceptance of sprinkler heads openings to fire escape in lieu of fireproofing said openings.

No. 11. Premises affected, Schenectady, 1 Mill Lane; appellant, Harrington Bros. Waste Co., Inc. 1—Additional exit, May 6, 1918. 3-story nonfireproof building, erected before Oct. 1, 1913; no sprinkler; combustibles carried; no fire alarm signal system; occupancy, 5 to 7; above 1st floor, 5; above 2d floor, 2. This building is 18 feet wide by 56 feet long; owner sorts rags on premises; there is one interior stairway; also extends from 3d floor to flat roof of adjoining building, from which a stairway leads through another building to street.

The time allowed for the performance of the contract is on or before Aug. 31, 1918.

The amount of security required for the performance of the contract is thirty per cent. (30%) of the total amount for which the contract is awarded.





For particulars as to the quantity or quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately.

The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application thereat at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done or the supplies are to be furnished. Plans and drawings of construction work may be seen there.
