The Twenty-seventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of the North Side Division Long Island Railroad track, from Junction avenue to Flushing Creek; the westerly side of Flushing Creek, from centre line of the North Side Division Long Island Railroad to Horse Brook; the northerly side of Horse Brook, from Flushing Creek to the division line of the land of D. Morrell Boroughs and Henry Euler; the easterly side of said division line to Court street, and the easterly side of Court street, from division line of the land of D. Morrell Boroughs and Henry Euler to the centre line of the North Side Division of Long Island Railroad.

The Twenty-eighth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of the North Side Division, Long Island Railroad, from the main line of the Long Island Railroad to Thompson avenue; the southerly side of Thompson avenue, from the North Side Division, Long Island Railroad, to Cook avenue; the southerly side of Cook avenue, from Thompson avenue to Court street; the westerly side of Court, from Cook avenue to a line dividing the lands of D. Morrell Boroughs and Henry Euler; the westerly side of said division line, from Court street to Horse Brook; the southerly side of Horse Brook, from division line of the lands of D. Morrell Boroughs and Henry Euler to Flushing Creek; the westerly side of Flushing Creek, from Horse Brook to the division line of the former towns of Flushing and Newtown; the westerly side of said line to Union turnpike; the northerly side of Union turnpike, from the division line of the former towns of Flushing and Newtown to Metropolitan avenue; the northerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Union turnpike to Trotting Course lane, the easterly side of Trotting Course lane, from Metropolitan avenue to the main line of the Long Island Railroad, and the easterly side of the main line of the Long Island Railroad, from Trotting Course lane to the north Side Division of the Long Island Railroad.

The Twenty-ninth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Calamus road, from Fisk avenue to the centre line of the main line of the Long Island Railroad track; the westerly side of the main line Long Island Railroad track, from Calamus road to Trotting Course lane; the westerly side of Trotting Course lane, from the main line Long Island Railroad track to Dry Harbor road; the westerly side of Dry Harbor road, from Trotting Course lane to Johnson avenue; the northerly side of Johnson avenue, from Dry Harbor road to Juniper avenue; the easterly side of Juniper avenue, from Johnson avenue to Grand street, and the easterly side of Fisk avenue, from Grand street to Calamus road.

The Thirtieth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Shell road, from Betts avenue to Greenpoint avenue; the easterly side of Greenpoint avenue, from Shell road to Woodside avenue; the southerly side of Woodside avenue, from Greenpoint avenue to Broadway; the westerly side of Broadway, from Woodside avenue



to the centre line of the North Side Division of the Long Island Railroad track; the northerly side of the North Side Division of the Long Island Railroad track, from Broadway to the main line Long Island Railroad track; the westerly side of the main line Long Island Railroad track, from the North Side Division Long Island Railroad track to Calamus road; the north side of Calamus road, from the main line Long Island Railroad track to Maurice avenue; the northerly and westerly sides of Maurice avenue, from Fisk avenue to Betts avenue, and the easterly side of Betts avenue, from Maurice avenue to Shell road.

The Thirty-first Election District is bounded by and within the easterly and southerly sides of Maurice avenue from Jay avenue to Fisk avenue; the westerly side of Fisk avenue from Maurice avenue to Grand street; the westerly side of Juniper avenue from Grand street to the northeast corner of Mt. Olivet Cemetery; thence following property of Mt. Olivet Cemetery until it reaches Mt. Olivet avenue; the northerly side of Mt. Olivet avenue from Mt. Olivet Cemetery property-line to Fresh Pond road; the easterly side of Fresh Pond road from Mt. Olivet avenue to Grand street; the easterly side of Clermont avenue from Grand street to Jay avenue, and the northerly side of Jay avenue from Clermont avenue to Maurice avenue.

The Thirty-second Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Maspeth avenue, from Newtown Creek to Jay avenue; the southerly side of Jay avenue, from Maurice avenue to Claremont avenue; the westerly side of Claremont avenue, from Jay avenue to Grand street; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road, from Grand street to Mount Olivet avenue; the northerly side of Mount Olivet avenue, from Fresh Pond road to Flushing avenue; the westerly side of Flushing avenue, from Mount Olivet avenue to the centre line Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track; the northerly side Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track, from Flushing avenue to Metropolitan avenue; the northerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from the Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad track to Newtown Creek, and Newtown Creek.

The Thirty-third Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Newtown Creek to the Bushwick Branch Long Island Railroad; the southerly side of the Bushwick Branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Metropolitan avenue to Mount Olivet avenue; the southerly side of Mount Olivet avenue, from the Bushwick Branch of the Long Island Railroad to a line through the Baker estate, and westerly side of the line through the Baker estate, from Mount Olivet avenue to William street, the westerly side of William street, from above line to a direct line on the southerly side of Linden Hill Cemetery to Woodward avenue; the westerly side of Woodward avenue, from a point midway between DeKalb street and Stockholm street to Harmon street; the northerly side of Harmon street, from Woodward avenue to a line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and Town of Newtown and along above mentioned line, from Harmon street to Metropolitan avenue.

The Thirty-fourth Election District is bounded by and within the westerly side of Fairview avenue, from Gates avenue to the southerly side of Linden Hill Cemetery; thence westerly to the easterly side of Woodward avenue, at a point midway between Stockholm street and DeKalb avenue; thence southerly on the easterly side of Woodward avenue to Harmon street; the south side of Harmon street to the line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown, and above mentioned line from Harmon street to Gates avenue; thence to Fairview avenue.

The Thirty-fifth Election District is bounded by and within the easterly side of Fairview avenue from Gates avenue to the southerly side of Linden Hill Cemetery, to William street; thence easterly in a direct line through the Baker estate from William street to Mount Olivet avenue; the southerly side of Mount Olivet avenue from line through the Baker estate to Fresh Pond road; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road from Mount Olivet avenue to Gates avenue (or Magnolia street); the northerly side of Gates avenue (or Magnolia street) from Fresh Pond road to Fairview avenue.

The Thirty-sixth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Mount Olivet avenue, from Fresh Pond road to the line of property of Mount Olivet Cemetery; the southerly side of said line, from Mount Olivet avenue to Juniper avenue; the southerly side of Johnson avenue, from Juniper avenue to Dry Harbor road; the easterly side of Dry Harbor road, from Johnson avenue to Trotting Course lane; the westerly side of Trotting Course lane, from Johnson avenue to Metropolitan avenue; the northerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Trotting Course lane to Fresh Pond road, and the easterly side of Fresh Pond road, from Metropolitan avenue to Mount Olivet avenue.

The Thirty-seventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from the westerly line of Lutheran Cemetery to Grove avenue; the southerly side of Grove avenue, from Metropolitan avenue to the former division line of the towns of Flushing and Newtown; the easterly side of said division line to the former division line of the towns of Jamaica and Newtown; the northerly side of said division line, from the division line of the former Town of Flushing to Fresh Pond road; the easterly side of Fresh Pond road, from the former division line of the towns of Jamaica and Newtown to Cooper avenue; the southerly side of Cooper avenue, from Fresh Pond road to the highway leading to Cypress Hills Cemetery; the easterly side of the highway leading to Cypress Hills Cemetery, from Cooper avenue in a direct line north to the house of Rossinan; the easterly side of said line, from the house of Rossinan north to Metropolitan avenue.

The Thirty-eighth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Metropolitan avenue, from Fresh Pond road to the westerly boundary of Lutheran Cemetery; the westerly side of the line of Lutheran Cemetery south to the house of Rossinan, from Metropolitan avenue to Myrtle avenue; the westerly side of the highway leading to Cypress Hills Cemetery, from Myrtle avenue to Cooper avenue; the northerly side of Cooper avenue, from the highway leading to Cypress Hills Cemetery to Fresh Pond road; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road, from Cooper avenue to the line of the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown; westerly and northerly along said line from Fresh Pond road to Cooper avenue; the southerly side of Cooper avenue, from the former division line of the City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown to Cypress avenue; the easterly side of Cypress avenue, from Cooper avenue to the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad; the southerly side of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Cypress avenue to Fresh Pond road, and the easterly side of Fresh Pond road, from the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad to Metropolitan avenue.

The Thirty-ninth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Gates avenue, from a line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown to Fresh Pond road; the westerly side of Fresh Pond road, from Gates avenue to Manhattan Beach Branch Long Island Railroad; the northerly side of Manhattan Beach Branch Long Island Railroad, from Fresh Pond road to Myrtle avenue; the northerly side of Myrtle avenue, from Manhattan Beach Branch Long Island Railroad to line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and Town of Newtown, and along the above-mentioned line from Myrtle avenue to Gates avenue.

The Fortieth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Myrtle avenue, from the division line of the former City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown to the centre line of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad; the westerly side of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Fresh Pond road to Cypress avenue; the westerly side of Cypress avenue, from the Manhattan Beach Branch of the Long Island Railroad to Cooper avenue; the northerly side of Cooper avenue, from Cypress avenue to the former division line of the City of Brooklyn and the Town of Newtown, and the easterly side of said line, from Cooper avenue to Myrtle avenue.

#### Second Assembly District.

The First Election District is bounded by and within Powell's Cove, Long Island Sound, Little Bay, the northerly side of Thirtieth street, from Little Bay to Thirtieth avenue; the westerly side of Thirtieth avenue, from Thirtieth street to Eighteenth street; the northerly side of Eighteenth street, from Thirtieth avenue to the Boulevard, and the easterly side of the Boulevard, from Eighteenth street to Powell's Cove.

The Second Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Eighteenth street, from Whitestone avenue to Thirtieth avenue; the easterly side of Thirtieth avenue, from Eighteenth street to Thirtieth street; the southerly side of Thirtieth street, from Thirtieth avenue to Little Bay; Little Bay, Long Island Sound, Little Neck Bay to stream running through the lands of J. W. Harway; thence westerly along said stream to the westerly side of Bell avenue; the westerly side of Bell avenue, from said stream to Bayside road; the northerly side of Bayside road, from Bell avenue to Whitestone road; the easterly side of Whitestone road, from Bayside road to Willett's road; the westerly side of Willett's road, from Sixteenth avenue to First street; the northerly side of First street, from Fourteenth avenue to Whitestone avenue, and the easterly side of Whitestone avenue, from First street to Eighteenth street.

The Third Election District is bounded by and within Long Island Sound, Powell's Cove, the westerly side of the Boulevard, from Powell's Cove to Eighteenth street; the southerly side of Eighteenth street, from the Boulevard to Whitestone avenue, the westerly side of Whitestone avenue, from Eighteenth street to Seventh avenue; the northerly side of Seventh avenue, from Whitestone avenue to Twenty-first street; the easterly side of Twenty-first street, from Seventh avenue to Sixth avenue; the northerly side of Sixth avenue, from Twenty-first street to Fifteenth street; the easterly side of Fifteenth street, from Sixth avenue to Fifth avenue; the northerly side of Fifth avenue, from Fifteenth street to Twelfth street; the easterly side of Twelfth street, from Fifth avenue to First avenue; the southerly side of First avenue, from Twelfth street to Thirtieth street; the easterly side of Thirtieth street, from First avenue to Avenue C; the easterly side of College avenue, from Avenue C to Long Island Sound.

The Fourth Election District is bounded by and within Long Island Sound; the westerly side of College avenue, from Long Island Sound to the centre line of Thirtieth street and Avenue C; the westerly side of Thirtieth street, from Avenue C to First avenue; the northerly side of First avenue, from Thirtieth street to Twelfth street; the westerly side of Twelfth street, from First avenue to Fifth avenue; the northerly side of Fifth avenue, from Twelfth street to Flushing Bay, and Flushing Bay.

The Fifth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Fifth avenue, from Flushing Bay to Fifteenth street; the westerly side of Fifteenth street, from Fifth avenue to Sixth avenue; the southerly side of Sixth avenue, from Fifteenth street to Twenty-first street; the westerly side of Twenty-first street, from Sixth avenue to Seventh avenue; southerly side of Seventh avenue, from Twenty-first street to Twenty-third street; the westerly side of Twenty-third street, from Seventh avenue to creek; centre line of creek, from Twenty-third street to Flushing Bay, and Flushing Bay.

The Sixth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Seventh avenue, from Twenty-third street to Whitestone avenue; the westerly side of Whitestone avenue, from Seventh avenue to First street; the southerly side of First street, from Whitestone avenue to Willett's road; the easterly side of Willett's road, from First street to Whitestone road; the westerly side of Whitestone road, from Willett's road to Broadway; the northerly side of Broadway, from Whitestone road to Flushing Creek; the centre line of said creek, from Broadway to Twenty-third street, and the easterly side of Twenty-third street, from Flushing creek to Seventh avenue.

The Seventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly line of Broadway, from Flushing Creek to Main street; the westerly side of Main street, from Broadway to Amity street; the northerly side of Amity street, from Main street to Flushing Creek, and Flushing Creek.

The Eighth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Broadway, from Main street to Parsons avenue; the westerly side of Parsons avenue, from Broadway to Amity street; the northerly side of Amity street, from Parsons avenue to Main street, and the easterly side of Main street, from Amity street to Broadway.

The Ninth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Amity street, from Main street to Parsons avenue; the easterly side of Parsons avenue, from Amity street to Broadway; the southerly side of Broadway, from Parsons avenue to Sanford avenue; the northerly side of Sanford avenue, from Broadway to Jamaica avenue; the easterly side of Jamaica avenue, from Sanford avenue to Main street, and the easterly side of Main street, from Jamaica avenue to Amity street.

The Tenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Amity street, from Flushing Creek to Main street; the westerly side of Main street, from Amity street to Jamaica avenue; the westerly side of Jamaica avenue, from Main street to Hillside avenue; the northerly side of Hillside avenue, from Jamaica avenue to Flushing Creek; thence westerly and northerly along centre line of said creek to Amity street.

The Eleventh Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Hillside avenue, from Flushing Creek to Jamaica avenue; the easterly side of Jamaica avenue, from Hillside avenue to Sanford avenue; the southerly side of Sanford avenue, from Jamaica avenue to Broadway; the southerly side of Broadway, from Sanford avenue to Cemetery lane; the westerly side of Cemetery lane, from Broadway to Fresh Meadow road; the westerly side of Fresh Meadow road, from Cemetery lane to a line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica; thence along said town line, from Fresh Meadow road to Flushing Creek; thence northerly and easterly along centre line of said creek to Hillside avenue.

The Twelfth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Broadway, from Cemetery lane to Whitestone road; the easterly side of Whitestone road, from Broadway to Bayside road; the southerly side of Bayside road, from Whitestone road to Bell avenue; the easterly side of Bell avenue, from Bayside road to stream running through land of J. W. Harway; thence easterly along said stream to Little Neck Bay; Little Neck Bay, from above mentioned stream to Little Neck Creek; along centre line of Little Neck Creek, from Little Neck Bay to Alley road, the westerly side of Alley road, from Little Neck Creek to Rocky Hill road; the northerly side of Rocky Hill road, from Alley road to the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica; from Rocky Hill road to Fresh Meadow road; the easterly side of Fresh Meadow road, from said town line to Cemetery lane, and to the easterly side of Cemetery lane, from Fresh Meadow road to Broadway.

The Thirteenth Election District is bounded by and within Little Neck Bay, the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Hempstead, the northerly side of Jericho turnpike from said town line to a line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica; thence along said line to Rocky Hill road; the northerly side of Rocky Hill road to Alley road; the easterly side of Alley road, from Rocky Hill road to Little Neck Creek, and the centre line of said creek, from Alley road to Little Neck Bay.

The Fourteenth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica, from the former city line of Brooklyn to Woodhaven avenue; the westerly side of Woodhaven avenue from the dividing lines between the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue from Woodhaven avenue to the former city line of Brooklyn, and along said line from Atlantic avenue to the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica.

The Fifteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from the former city line of Brooklyn to Morris avenue; the westerly side of Morris avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Liberty avenue; the southerly side of Liberty avenue, from Morris avenue to centre line of the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch of the Long Island Railroad, the westerly side of the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch of the Long Island Railroad, from Liberty avenue to Hawtree creek; the centre line of Hawtree creek, from the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway branch Long Island Railroad to Jamaica bay; Jamaica Bay, Spring creek and a line dividing the former City of Brooklyn and Town of Jamaica, from Spring creek to Atlantic avenue.

The Sixteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Morris avenue to the centre line of the New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway Branch, Long Island Railroad; the westerly side of New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway Branch, Long Island Railroad, from Atlantic avenue to Belmont avenue; the northerly side of Belmont avenue, from New York, Woodhaven and Rockaway Branch, Long Island Railroad, to Van Wicklin avenue; the westerly side of Van Wicklin avenue, from Belmont avenue to Liberty avenue; the northerly side of Liberty avenue, from Van Wicklin avenue to Morris avenue, and the easterly side of Morris avenue, from Liberty avenue to Atlantic avenue.

The Seventeenth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica, from Woodhaven avenue to Myrtle avenue; the southerly side of Myrtle avenue, from said town line to Welling street; the westerly side of Welling street, from Myrtle avenue to Jamaica avenue; the southerly side of Jamaica avenue, from Welling street to Briggs avenue; the westerly side of Briggs avenue, from Jamaica avenue to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Briggs avenue to Woodhaven avenue, and the easterly side of Woodhaven avenue, from Atlantic avenue to the line dividing the former towns of Newtown and Jamaica.

The Eighteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue from centre line of the New York and Rockaway Branch Long Island Railroad to Greenwood avenue; the westerly side of Greenwood avenue from Atlantic avenue to Liberty avenue; the southerly side of Liberty avenue from Greenwood avenue to Van Wyck avenue; the westerly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Liberty avenue to Bergen Landing road; the westerly side of Bergen Landing road, from Van Wyck avenue to Jamaica Bay; a line running southerly from Bergen Landing road to Beach channel; thence westerly along Beach channel to a line opposite Hawtree creek; thence westerly along said line to the centre line of Hawtree creek from Jamaica Bay to New York



and Rockaway Branch Long Island Railroad; the easterly side New York and Rockaway Branch Long Island Railroad from Hawthorne creek to Liberty avenue; the northerly side of Liberty avenue from the New York and Rockaway Branch Long Island Railroad to Van Wicklin avenue; the easterly side of Van Wicklin avenue from Liberty avenue to Belmont avenue; the southerly side of Belmont avenue from Van Wicklin avenue to centre line New York and Rockaway Branch Long Island Railroad; the easterly side of New York and Rockaway Branch Long Island Railroad from Belmont avenue to Atlantic avenue.

The Nineteenth Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Greenwood avenue to Van Wyck avenue; the westerly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Liberty avenue; the northerly side of Liberty avenue, from Van Wyck avenue to Greenwood avenue, and the easterly side of Greenwood avenue, from Liberty avenue to Atlantic avenue.

The Twentieth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former Towns of Newtown and Jamaica, from Myrtle avenue to Newtown road; the westerly side of Newtown road from said line to Van Wyck avenue; the westerly side of Van Wyck avenue from Newtown road to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue from Van Wyck avenue to Briggs avenue; the easterly side of Briggs avenue from Atlantic avenue to Jamaica avenue; the northerly side of Jamaica avenue from Briggs avenue to Welling street; the easterly side of Welling street from Jamaica avenue to Myrtle avenue, and the northerly side of Myrtle avenue from Welling street to the line dividing the former Towns of Newtown and Jamaica.

The Twenty-first Election District is bounded by and within a line dividing the former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica, from the former town line of Newtown to Union avenue; the westerly side of Union avenue from former lines dividing former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica to Fulton street; the northerly side of Fulton street, from Union avenue to Beaver street; the westerly side of Beaver street, from Fulton street to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Beaver street to Van Wyck avenue; the easterly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Atlantic avenue to Newtown road; the easterly side of Newtown road, from Van Wyck avenue to the town lines dividing the former Towns of Newtown and Jamaica; thence along said town line, from Newtown road to the line dividing the former Towns of Flushing and Jamaica.

The Twenty-second Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Van Wyck avenue to Prospect street; the westerly side of Prospect street, from Atlantic avenue to South street; the northerly side of South street, from Prospect street to Rockaway road; the westerly side of Rockaway road, from South street to Three Mile Mill road; the westerly side of Three Mile Mill road, from Rockaway road to Beaver Creek; the centre line of Beaver Creek, from Three Mile Mill road to Jamaica Bay; Jamaica Bay, from Beaver Creek to Bergen Landing road; the easterly side of Bergen Landing road, from Jamaica Bay to Van Wyck avenue, and the easterly side of Van Wyck avenue, from Bergen Landing road to Atlantic avenue.

The Twenty-third Election District is bounded by and within the southerly side of Fulton street, from Beaver street to New York avenue; the westerly side of New York avenue, from Fulton street to Locust avenue; the northerly side of Locust avenue, from New York avenue to Rockaway road; the easterly side of Rockaway road, from Locust avenue to South street; the southerly side of South street, from Rockaway road to Prospect street; the easterly side of Prospect street, from South street to Atlantic avenue; the northerly side of Atlantic avenue, from Prospect street to Beaver street, and the easterly side of Beaver street, from Atlantic avenue to Fulton street.

The Twenty-fourth Election District is bounded by and within the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica, from Union avenue to Lincoln avenue; the westerly side of Lincoln avenue, from said town line to Hempstead and Jamaica Plank road; the northerly side of Hempstead and Jamaica Plank road, from Lincoln avenue to Union avenue, and the easterly side of Union avenue, from Hempstead and Jamaica Plank road to the line dividing the former towns of Flushing and Jamaica.

## AQUEDUCT COMMISSION.

Minutes of Adjourned Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 207 Stewart Building, on Thursday, September 25, 1902, at 11 o'clock A. M.

Present—Commissioners Ten Eyck (President), Ryan, Windolph and Curtis. The minutes of meetings of September 16, 18 and 19, 1902, were read and approved.

The following communication was received from the Law Department:

New York, September 24, 1902.

Hon. Board of Aqueduct Commissioners, The City of New York, Hon. WILLIAM H. TEN EYCK, President:

SIR—The modification contract of The City of New York with McDonald & On-

derdonk, made pursuant to chapter 588 of the Laws of 1902, having been submitted to this office in order that a resolution might be prepared for the adoption of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment as in said chapter 588 is required, I submit herewith a resolution that in my opinion covers the essential points required by said act. In reexamining this important contract I observe two matters which seem to me the subject of serious criticism and to which I think it my duty to call your attention.

Clause (first) does not in terms define the time or date or describe at what stage or period of the work the new prices shall take effect and prevail. The courts would probably hold that the change was to date from the time the contract became effective, but the clause ought to be amended, in order to avoid litigation, by expressing this in so many words. I assume, of course, that an accurate survey or estimate will be made at that date by your Engineers, so as to determine beyond dispute the precise quantities excavated, supplied, built or completed, and which will be certified and paid for at the old contract prices.

Clause (second) provides that: "The party of the second part agrees they will comply with the provisions of chapter 415 of the Laws of 1897, as amended, known as the Labor Law; that no laborer, workman or mechanic \* \* \* shall be required to work more than eight hours. \* \* \*"

This is not strictly in terms of the act. It exceeds the requirements of the act in making the contractor comply with chapter 415 of the Laws of 1897, and it falls short of them in not providing that the contractor shall not permit or allow any laborer to work more than eight hours.

"Resolved, That pursuant to the provisions of chapter 588 of the Laws of 1902, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment hereby approves the agreement made and entered into on the day of 1902, by the Aqueduct Commissioners of The City of New York, and the firm of McDonald & Onderdonk, consisting of John B. McDonald and Andrew Onderdonk, contractors, for building the Jerome Park Reservoir, as provided by the said agreement, which is hereto annexed and made a part hereof."

The Secretary thereupon stated that on September 25, 1902, he had requested the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to return the amended contract (in triplicate) providing for an eight-hour workday at the Jerome Park Reservoir, which contract was transmitted to said Board on September 10, 1902; and that the contract had been returned.

Whereupon the following form of letter was presented, and the Secretary was directed to transmit the same to the Law Department, viz.:

Hon. GEORGE L. RIVES, Corporation Counsel:

DEAR SIR—In response to your communication of the 24th instant, we have recalled the amended form of contract in triplicate of The City of New York with McDonald & Onderdonk, from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, which we return herewith for amendment in accordance with your suggestions in said letter.

Our Chief Engineer informs us that the procedure after the execution of the contract would be as follows:

"Upon the execution of this contract the Chief Engineer shall order the contractors to immediately discontinue all work of construction of the Jerome Park Reservoir for such a period as may be necessary to enable the Engineer to make such measurements as shall determine the quantities of all work heretofore done, which work will be paid for at the prices provided for in the contract between the parties hereto, dated August 23, 1895, and all work done after the execution of this contract shall be paid for as herein provided."

After Recess.

Present—Commissioners Ten Eyck, Ryan, Windolph and Curtis.

The Construction or Executive Committee referred to the Commissioners' Reports Nos. 314, dated January 6, 1902, and 389, dated July 15, 1902, of the Chief Engineer, and communication of Edward B. Kear, dated July 2, 1902, said reports and communication being in relation to the construction of a proposed road from the northerly end of Road No. 8 northerly to the Baptist Church, on the Yorktown road. In connection therewith there was also presented communications of Edward B. Kear, dated September 8 and 20, 1902.

Whereupon, the Secretary was directed to inform Mr. Kear that the agreements of Armenia Losee and Aaron Losee, property owners, waiving condemnation proceedings and giving the City the right to take possession of their land, and that they will abide by the decision of the Commissioners of Appraisal as to the amount of damages to be paid by the City for the acquisition of the necessary land was not in accord with what was agreed upon by the Commissioners and Mr. Kear at a meeting of said Commissioners held October 1, 1901; that the records show that the property owners were to furnish to the City, free of all expense, the right of way for the construction and continuation of said Road No. 8; that if agreements to that effect were submitted the matter would be referred to the Corporation Counsel as to the right of the Aqueduct Commissioners to construct the road referred to.

The following communication was received from Williams & Gerstle, contractors for the Muscote Dam:

NEW YORK, September 23, 1902.

To the Honorable President and Board of Aqueduct Commissioners, New York City:

GENTLEMEN—Some time ago we requested an extension of time until November 1, 1903, on our contract for building the Muscote Dam at Katonah, N. Y., and the Commissioners granted us an extension until October 1, 1902. We respectfully ask you to grant us our original request, viz., November 1, 1903, as the uncertainties of work of this kind are such that we have no doubt if your Honorable Body will visit the Muscote Dam they will agree with us that we are doing everything that could be done by any one. Whereupon the following communication was received from the Chief Engineer:

REPORT NO. 407.

NEW YORK, September 24, 1902.

To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—Relating to the progress of the work of constructing the Muscote Dam by Williams & Gerstle, the contractors, I would report that the work was commenced immediately after the execution of the contract, which occurred on May 10, 1901. The work was to have been finished July 1, 1902; at that date the estimate of the value of the work done was \$37,600.60, while the approximate value of all work under the contract is \$209,478.

On June 3, 1902, the Aqueduct Commissioners passed a resolution extending the time to complete the contract to October 1, 1902. Since July 1, 1902, about \$15,000 worth of work has been done, making the aggregate value of all work done to date about \$52,700, leaving about \$156,778 worth of work to be done to complete the contract.

The contract provides that if the work to be done under the contract is not fully completed within the time specified the Aqueduct Commissioners shall have power to place such or so many persons and obtain by purchase or hire such materials, animals, carts, wagons, implements and tools, by contract or otherwise, as said Aqueduct Commissioners shall deem necessary to complete the work. The expense so incurred shall be paid by the City and shall be deducted from such moneys as may be due, or may hereafter become due to the said contractor, and should the expense exceed the last said sums, the contractor shall pay to the City such excess.



From the above it would be optional with the Aqueduct Commissioners either to complete the work under their own supervision or to enter into contract for the same. The latter would be the more practicable method, as it would relieve the City of the responsibility and the difficulty of securing competent superintendents to take charge of the work. To relet the work at least three months' time would be lost and considerable expense would be incurred in making surveys, plans, estimates, preparing a new contract, advertising, receiving bids and awarding the contract. This would bring the date of resuming the work into the middle of winter, which would be a very unseasonable time to work to advantage. Furthermore, I doubt if the work could be relet at as favorable prices as of the present contract.

Under date of September 24, 1902, Mr. John Williams, of the firm of Williams & Gerstle, wrote me that if they were granted an extension of time to complete their contract he will give the work his personal attention, and he stated that he would make better progress than has been made by the superintendents to whom the work has heretofore been intrusted. They are now prepared to lay masonry in three places, and should the work be discontinued it would be apt to result in a loss by the destruction of the cofferdams by the floods in the Croton river.

In view of the above, and inasmuch as the Muscote Dam cannot be put to the use for which it is intended until after the completion of the New Croton Dam and highways and the clearing of the basin of the reservoir, I recommend that the time for the completion of the work be extended to November 1, 1903. If within a reasonable time the contractors should fail to prosecute the work in such a manner as will insure its completion at the time specified, they could be ordered to discontinue the work, as is provided for in the contract.

REPORT No. 408.

NEW YORK, September 25, 1902.

To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—Relating to a communication which you received from the Department of Health, dated August 30, 1902, transmitting copy of letter from William J. Rees, dated August 27, 1902, calling attention to the drainage condition on a farm held by Mr. Bushel near Croton Lake, which was referred to me, I beg to report that the farm in question is located outside of the area of land taken or controlled by the Aqueduct Commissioners and comes within the jurisdiction of the Department of Water Supply.

The Secretary was directed to transmit a copy of the above report, together with copy of letter of Mr. Rees, therein referred to, to the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and to notify Mr. Rees to this effect.

The following communication was also received from the Chief Engineer:

REPORT No. 409.

NEW YORK, September 24, 1902.

To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—Relating to the communication from Mr. J. W. Stevenson, Deputy Comptroller, addressed to Hon. William H. Ten Eyck, President, Aqueduct Commissioners, dated August 8, 1902, transmitting a copy of Claim No. 7071, filed in the Department of Finance by Williams & Gerstle, for the sum of \$3,150, which was referred to me, I would report thereon as follows:

The claim is made for damage, caused by water, to work in the course of construction on the Muscote Dam on the 30th day of December, 1901. At that time the work of construction of the dam proper had not commenced. There was, however, a cofferdam in the course of construction.

In a communication dated January 14, 1902, addressed to the Committee on Construction, I reported as follows:

"The work at the Muscote Dam was almost at a standstill during the week on account of the height of the water in the river.

"On Saturday night, December 28, a heavy rain started at about 10.30 p. m. and continued all day Sunday, December 29. By Monday morning, December 30, the storm had abated somewhat and by noon the rain had ceased. The flood raised the river by 3.30 p. m. on Monday, December 30, to elevation 174, making the depth of water 11 feet.

"The flash-boards and about 60 linear feet of coping of the East Branch Reservoir Dam were washed away on Monday, December 30, at about 6 a. m., releasing a large volume of water and increasing correspondingly the flood at the dam.

"Practically the whole of the west crib of the crib dam at the Muscote Dam was carried away early on January 1. This crib had a length of 240 feet and the total number of feet, B. M., in it was 14,761, costing \$450.18."

Relating to the cofferdam, Mr. Edward Wegmann, Division Engineer, in a communication dated February 21, 1902, addressed to me, reported as follows:

"The contractors place the whole blame for the washing away of their crib during the freshet of December 30 to January 1 on the breach made in the coping of the Sodom Dam on December 30 at about 6 a. m.

"Our levels for the height of the water at the dam show:

"December 30, 1901, 10 a. m., water at elevation 172.8.

"December 30, 1901, 3.30 a. m., water at elevation 174.0.

"December 31, 1901, 9.30 a. m., water at elevation 171.8.

"This would indicate that the breach at the Sodom Dam did not cause the water at the Muscote Dam to raise more than about a foot, as the flats at Purdy's offered ample space for the water from the dam to spread out.

"The crib at the Muscote Dam gave way some time on December 31 or on January 1. The driftwood that washed against the crib may have had something to do with this failure, but I think the main cause was the fact that the contractors had not placed any flooring in their crib upon which stone might have been filled, and relied entirely on the weight of the timber to keep the crib in place. If the crib had been properly loaded down with stone it would probably have withstood the freshet."

I wish to call to your notice paragraph 6, page 13, of the specifications:

"Responsibility of the Contractor.

"The contractor shall do all other work needed to protect his work from water; he shall erect all temporary dams, cofferdams, sheet piling and other devices, take care of the river, and shall be responsible for all damage that may be caused by the action of water, whether from negligence or any other cause. Such damage is to be repaired and the work must be restored and maintained at his cost."

Also paragraph 47, page 21:

"Cofferdams.

"Cofferdam work is to be used for the protection of the excavations in the river and of the masonry built therein. The contractor is to use such methods as he may desire for the protection of the work, provided they are not objected to by the Engineer, but the failure of the Engineer to object to them or any part of them will not relieve the contractor from responsibility for any damages that may be caused by the action of the elements, or from any other cause. If any such damage should occur, the City shall not pay for the materials lost or destroyed, although they may have been previously estimated, but they will be replaced under the terms of the specifications."

The claim does not specify what portion of the work has been damaged.

The report was ordered filed and the Secretary was directed to transmit a copy thereof to the Department of Finance.

A communication was received from the Assistant Secretary to the Mayor, dated September 22, 1902, requesting list of persons employed in this Commission, who are Volunteer Firemen and whose salaries may have been reduced, etc.

The Secretary was directed to obtain the information requested and submit the same to the Commissioners.

A communication was received from Deputy Comptroller Phillips, dated September 22, 1902, transmitting notice of the Superintendent of Buildings, Borough of The Bronx, dated September 17, 1902, of an alleged violation of section 4 of the Building Code, in that plans and specifications for a building in the centre of the Jerome Park Reservoir were not submitted to the Superintendent of Buildings and his approval attached thereto.

The matter was laid over pending the receipt of a reply from the Superintendent of Buildings to a communication of the Secretary dated September 22, 1902, in relation to a similar notice.

The following communications were received from Messrs. Coleman, Breuchaud & Coleman, contractors for the New Croton Dam:

CROTON-ON-HUDSON, N. Y., September 22, 1902.

To the Honorable the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—The following is in answer to your communication of September 19: You refer to the absence in our contract of any provisions respecting the hours of labor of our employees. It is precisely for that reason that we hold that new conditions have been established when the Act of April 14, 1902, approved by the Mayor of the City rendered the eight-hour day mandatory.

As to the impossibility of prosecuting the work under present circumstances, in regard to which you desire a "definite statement," we have to state as follows: Since the eight-hour law was passed many of our men waited patiently for the application of it to the work on the dam, but a large number of them, attracted by the shorter hours obtaining elsewhere, left us. It is with extreme difficulty that we have succeeded in keeping the work going, but during all the summer, notwithstanding our efforts, we have been short-handed, thus working at a disadvantage and to the detriment of the progress of the work.

We have already reported to you that our men asked for the application of the eight-hour law and that, after waiting a month for an answer, which we could not at that time obtain from your Board, they struck.

Desiring to avoid delay we have tried to resume work with willing men. Last Wednesday a working party was assailed and dispersed by armed strikers and a man was wounded. To-day we have succeeded in working fifty (50) men on the highway, but we are unable to resume work at the dam.

We have read the terms of the act and we entertain the opinion expressed by Chief Engineer Nelson P. Lewis of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of July 15, 1902 (page 179 of the printed minutes of the Aqueduct Commissioners), that "The intent of the law doubtless is that the working time of the men now employed upon any of these contracts may be reduced from ten to eight hours a day, and that the contractor shall be reimbursed for the additional cost of doing the work on an eight hour basis."

We respectfully maintain that our case is absolutely parallel with that of the contract for the Jerome Park Reservoir, for the reasons that all the arguments on the strength of which the Aqueduct Commissioners resolved to recommend to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment the necessary amendments to the Jerome Park Reservoir can apply equally well in our case. The aforesaid arguments are mainly contained in the communication of the Secretary of the New York Central Federated Union and in the resolutions of the Aqueduct Commissioners of July 20, 1902, the statements in which apply equally well for the contract for our work (with the exceptions of dates, names, schedule of prices, mention of public hearing, etc., which obviously apply only to Jerome Park Reservoir).

The only difference verbally mentioned by one of the Commissioners was that Jerome Park Reservoir is within the boundaries of New York City. We fail to see how this fact can affect the question at hand, inasmuch as New York City is our labor market.

It may not be out of place to state here that the eight hour work system would expedite the work, as in the most favorable season it would be possible to work two shifts of stonecutters and masons.

In conclusion, and in conformity with our communication of September 17, we respectfully request that the Aqueduct Commissioners recommend to the Board of Estimate and Apportionment for the New Croton Dam amendments similar to those recommended for Jerome Park Reservoir.

CROTON-ON-HUDSON, N. Y., September 25, 1902.

To the Honorable the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—We respectfully submit that since our last letter matters at the New Croton dam are in the same condition. The men will not go to work, nor allow others to go to work on the ten hour system.

These conditions exist because of the laws passed by the State authorities making eight (8) hours a day's work on all public works in the State of New York.

Therefore we suggest that it would be for the best interests of The City of New York, as well as for the early completion of the work, to apply the law signed by the Governor, April 14, 1902 to the New Croton Dam contract.

The Commissioners had under consideration the following communication, laid over July 29, 1902:

REPORT No. 394.

NEW YORK, July 29, 1902.

To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—Relating to the communication of Robert L. Luce, counsel for the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company, dated July 16, 1902, informing you that the railroad company desired to purchase 100,000 cubic yards of sand, to be taken from the hill on the City's property opposite the Katonah depot, I beg to report that Mr. Luce informs me in a communication dated July 28, 1902, that the railroad company would like to be granted a period of ten years to remove the sand. This, I think, would interfere with keeping the property inclosed for sanitary purposes, hence I recommend that you decline to dispose of the sand.

The recommendation of the Chief Engineer was approved and adopted, and the Secretary was directed to so notify Mr. Luce.

A communication was received from the Purchasing Agent, dated September 25, 1902, reporting in relation to two horses that the Board of Education desired to dispose of.

Which was ordered filed.

The Secretary presented a circular letter received from the State Commission of Prisons, dated Albany, September 2, 1902, requesting a report to said Commission on or before October 1, 1902, and estimate for the ensuing year of the amount of supplies of different kinds required to be purchased by the Aqueduct Commissioners that can be furnished by the penal institutions of the State.

The Secretary was directed to comply therewith.



The Secretary verbally stated that, by direction of the President he had transmitted to the Mayor the following report of the Chief Engineer on the New Croton Dam:

NEW YORK, September 23, 1902.

Hon. WILLIAM H. TEN EYCK, President Aqueduct Commission:

DEAR SIR—In regard to the work done on the New Croton Dam for the week ending Friday, September 19, 1902, I would report as follows:

A strike occurred on Tuesday morning, September 16, and for the rest of the week no work was done at the dam, although some work was done on Wednesday, September 17, by the stonecutters at the quarry.

On Saturday and Monday, September 13 and 15, the following work was done: The steam shovel continued the earth excavation both day and night in the side hill, at the south end of the dam, and three shovel gangs continued excavating above and below the main dam, near the south end.

Work on the removal of the core wall and wing wall at the south end of the dam was continued.

(The location of all the above-mentioned work is shown in Photographs Nos. 28, 29 and 30, submitted with this report.)

The total amount of earth excavation at the south end of the dam, including the material removed from the core wall and the wing wall, would approximate 2,200 cubic yards for the two working days.

The laying of masonry continued on the dam for two working days, with three gangs of masons working, distributed as follows:

- One gang between Stations 7 + 35 and 7 + 75.
- One gang between Stations 8 + 90 and 9 + 25.
- One gang between Stations 9 + 60 and 10 + 00.

The work of pointing the facing of the down-stream side of the dam was continued.

The total amount of masonry laid on the dam during the two working days approximated 170 cubic yards.

Rock excavation for widening the spillway channel at the north end of the dam, near its junction with the river channel, was continued. (The location of this work is shown in Photograph No. 1, previously submitted.)

The force of men employed on the dam and at the quarries averaged 488, while at work.

I submit with this report the following photographs:

No. 28—View of the work of excavation in the south side-hill and removal of core wall and wing wall. Excavation of the refill is shown in the left foreground. This view is taken from below the dam.

No. 29—General view of the dam down-stream side, looking from the south end towards the north, showing progress in masonry work and in excavation for the modified section. Excavation in refill shown in right foreground.

No. 30—Shows excavation in refill on up-stream side of the dam near beginning of core wall. Core wall partially removed appears on extreme left of picture. General view of spillway in the background. View taken from south end of dam.

No. 31—General view of the down-stream side of the dam, looking from the north, showing progress of masonry work.

The Commissioners had under consideration report of the Secretary, dated September 5, 1902, stating that the sum of \$147.25 had been received from Division Engineer Wegmann for rents collected on the Croton River Division during July and August, 1902, and that said amount had been transmitted to the City Chamberlain for the credit of the "Additional Water Fund," etc.; which was laid over September 19, 1902.

Whereupon the action of the Secretary was approved and the communication ordered filed.

The Commissioners had under consideration communication of the Commissioner of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, dated August 6, 1902, transmitting triplicate forms of contract, specifications, plans, proposal and bond for building fourteen highway bridge superstructures across the Croton lake and river and its tributaries in the towns of Yorktown, New Castle, Somers, Lewisboro, Bedford and North Salem, Westchester County, New York, and communication of the Corporation Counsel, dated August 12, 1902, approving of said forms of contract, specifications, proposal and bond "as to form."

Whereupon the communications were referred to the Chief Engineer for report as to how many of the bridge superstructures are to be constructed on the New Croton Dam Division and on the Croton River Division, respectively.

The Secretary presented a communication received from the Municipal Civil Service Commission, dated September 23, 1902, stating that before eligible lists for Assistant Engineer, Computer, Superintendent of Dam Construction and Rodman could be transmitted said commission desired to be advised of the salaries intended to be paid; also if there were any persons who are eligible for promotion to the positions of Computer and Rodman.

The Secretary was directed to reply thereto, stating that the salaries intended to be paid were as follows:

Assistant Engineer.....	\$1,800 00
Computer .....	1,250 00
Rodman .....	900 00
Superintendents of Dam Construction, per day.....	4 50

The Commissioners adjourned until to-morrow (Friday), September 26, 1902, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Whereupon the following form of letter was presented and the Secretary was directed to transmit the same to said contractors:

NEW YORK, September 26, 1902.

COLEMAN, BREUCHAUD & COLEMAN, Croton-on-Hudson, N. Y.:

GENTLEMEN—We have received your communications of September 22 and 25, 1902, and have carefully considered them. We cannot undertake to change the terms of

your contract for the construction of the New Croton Dam upon the applications therefor submitted by you. There is nothing in the contract which prevents your acceding to the alleged desire of your employees that their working hours be reduced and no statement from you that the effect of so doing would cause you any injury. No facts are stated as a basis for a proposed modification, nor is any sufficient reason given why such a modification would be for the best interests of The City of New York. The Act of the Legislature referred to is in no sense mandatory, and in our opinion you have not presented a case which would enable us to exercise a discretion in accordance with its terms. We must therefore insist upon your proceeding with the work without further delay.

Whereupon the following preamble and resolutions were offered:

Whereas, Application has been made by Williams & Gerstle, contractors, in a communication dated September 23, 1902, for an extension of time until November 1, 1903, in which to complete their contract for building the Muscoot Dam, on Croton river, at Muscoot Mountain, in the towns of Somers and Bedford, Westchester County, N. Y., said contract being dated May 10, 1901; and

Whereas, The Chief Engineer of this Commission has submitted his report thereon, being No. 407, dated September 24, 1902, wherein he recommends that, for the reasons set forth, an extension of time to November 1, 1903, be granted to said Williams & Gerstle in which to complete their contract above referred to; therefore be it

Resolved, That an extension of time to November 1, 1903, be and hereby is granted to Williams & Gerstle, contractors, in which to complete their contract for building the Muscoot Dam, on Croton river, at Muscoot Mountain, in the towns of Somers and Bedford, Westchester County, N. Y., provided their bondsmen, on or before October 1, 1902, shall enter into stipulations continuing their obligations for and during the completion of said contract under said extension of time, which is hereby allowed to them as further time for the performance of said contract and any instruments necessary for this purpose are properly executed; and be it further

Resolved, That if the rate of progress of the work of building said Muscoot Dam by said Williams & Gerstle at any time during the period covered by this extension of time is not satisfactory to said Aqueduct Commissioners and does not show the utmost diligence, said Commissioners reserve to themselves the right to readvise and relet the work, as provided in chapter 490, Laws of 1883. The modification of said contract is to be without prejudice to any of the rights of the said Commissioners or The City of New York as they now are or may hereafter exist.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—Commissioners Ten Eyck, Ryan, Windolph and Curtis—4.

The Secretary was directed to transmit to the Corporation Counsel a copy of the above resolutions granting an extension of time until November 1, 1903, to Williams & Gerstle, contractors, in which to complete the Muscoot Dam on the Croton river, at Muscoot Mountain, in the towns of Somers and Bedford, Westchester County, New York, and request his opinion as to whether or not it is necessary that a form of amended contract be executed by the Aqueduct Commissioners, the contractors and their sureties, to make operative the terms and conditions set forth in the resolutions above referred to; and, if so, to prepare such form of amended contract in triplicate.

The following communication was received from the Chief Engineer:

REPORT No. 410.

NEW YORK, September 26, 1902

To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—Relating to the communication received from the Civil Service Commissioners, dated September 13, 1902, submitting a list of names from which appointments of Axemen can be made. I beg to report that I communicated with all the persons named therein and that up to this date Francis X. The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the department, at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said department, and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the board of aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.
