Meeting called to order at 2 p. m.

Minutes of meeting of the 9th instant, on motion, approved as read.

Appeal 121 of 1903 laid over at last meeting.

Mr. Davidson appeared before the Board.

On motion, laid over, pending amendment.

Appeal 123 of 1903.

On presentation of report and on motion, appeal was denied as to the rear windows and approved as to westerly windows.

Appeal 124 of 1903 laid over at last meeting.

On motion, denied.

Appeal 125 of 1903.

On presentation of report and on motion, appeal was approved.

Appeal 126 of 1903.

On presentation of report and on motion, appeal was denied, with recommendation that fireproof shutters be placed on thirty-six (36) unprotected windows in fifteen-foot open court in rear, which are exposed to side windows of livery stable in rear.

Appeal 129 of 1903, new building 320 of 1903, Nos. 144 to 150 West Eighteenth street, Manhattan. Bernstein & Bernstein, architects and appellants.

To allow one continuous line of stairs in each house in place of two, said staircase to be of wrought iron and entirely fireproof and inclosed with 4-inch by 4-inch angle iron partitions filled in with 4-inch thick hollow terra cotta blocks.

Stairs and landings to be 4 feet wide in the clear.

Mr. M. Bernstein appeared before the Board.

On motion, approved on condition that the size of the staircase hall shall be increased by moving back the light court, and that the stairs shall be built with 7½-inch risers and 10-inch runs, and that the stairs and platforms shall not be less than 4 feet in width in the clear; that the treads, risers, landings and platforms shall be of unperforated cast iron; also that the fireproof partition inclosing the staircase halls shall extend on the first story to the street; and that the doors on all floors opening from the staircase halls shall be wood covered with metal.

Appeal 130 of 1903, alteration 235 of 1903, north side of One Hundred and Forty-eighth street, about 40 feet from Morris avenue, The Bronx. Michael J. Garvin, architect and appellant.

To allow me to construct this extension of 6-inch I beams for uprights, as shown on plans, and to have 7-inch steel beams, 15½ pounds, across the top of same for the roof beams to rest upon. This extension will be covered on the exterior with corrugated galvanized iron.

This extension is to be used as a work-shop in connection with present frame building in front of lot.

Mr. F. Hammond appeared before the Board.

On motion, approved.

Appeal 131 of 1903, new building 464 of 1903, south side of East One Hundred and Seventh street, about 150 feet from the East river, Manhattan. A. E. Badt, architect and appellant.

Application is respectfully made to grant permission to erect a coal pocket, as indicated on drawings filed. These pockets are to be located on East One Hundred and Seventh street, adjoining the river, and will be at least 200 feet distant from any other buildings excepting a small one-story office in connection with the same coal yard.

Mr. A. E. Badt appeared before the Board.

On motion, laid over.

Appeal 132 of 1903, new building 441 of 1903, northeast corner Rutgers and Madison streets, Manhattan. A. E. Badt, architect and appellant.

It is respectfully requested that the provisions of the Building Code be modified so far as to allow the omission of the brick partition walls in centre of the building on the second and upper floors, and to provide instead brick-filled fireproof partitions separating each apartment, formed by filling in between the studs with brick and

covering both sides of side partitions with ¾-inch mesh metal lath, securely fastened to each stud with long staples, said partitions to be plastered three good coats of plaster on both sides, and partitions resting on iron girders in first floor of sufficient strength to carry same.

Mr. A. E. Badt appeared before the Board.

On motion, approved.

Appeal 133 of 1903, new building 89 of 1903, south side of One Hundred and Twelfth street, about 175 feet from Amsterdam avenue, Manhattan. Neville & Bagge, architects and appellants.

To allow the construction of the pent house on roof, to be as shown on plans and as approved by the Tenement House Department, the pent house to be constructed as follows:

All outside walls to be constructed of angle iron and hollow terra cotta tiles laid up in cement and covered with sheet metal. The floor will be of cement; all sash, doors, frames and trim will be kalsomined, proper skylights will be provided, highest point of the pent house will not exceed 93 feet from the curb level. No combustible material will be employed in the construction of the pent house. Pent house will be constructed absolutely fireproof.

No appearance.

Proof of new appeal blank submitted to the Board, and, on motion, approved.

Minutes of Adjourned Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, Held at Their Office, No. 280 Broadway, New York City, on Friday, May 22, 1903, at 11 o'clock a. m.

Present—Commissioners Ten Eyck (President), Ryan, Windolph and Curtis and the Chief Engineer.

The Chairman of the Committee of Finance and Audit verbally reported that said committee had examined the bids and checks of the bidders received by the Aqueduct Commissioners May 19, 1903, for cutting timber and clearing grounds on the Croton River Division of the New Croton Reservoir, and that said bids and checks were in the form required, and from the information obtained it appeared that the sureties proposed therein were sufficient.

The report was accepted and ordered spread on the minutes.

The Chairman of the Construction or Executive Committee also verbally reported that said committee had considered and canvassed the bids received May 19, 1903, for cutting timber and clearing grounds on the Croton River Division of the New Croton Reservoir, and, in connection therewith, referred to the Commissioners the following joint report of the Chief Engineer and Secretary:

Report No. 585CC.

NEW YORK, May 21, 1903.

To the Committee on Construction:

GENTLEMEN—In accordance with a resolution adopted by the Aqueduct Commissioners on May 19, 1903, the undersigned have tabulated the bids received on May 19, 1903, for cutting timber and clearing grounds on the Croton River Division, and desire to submit that two bids were presented, as follows:

In view of the excess price of the bid above the estimate of the Chief Engineer, and because of the fact that only two bids were received, we recommend that action upon the bids be deferred until the Chief Engineer can further investigate the matter.

Whereupon, after consideration and discussion, the matter was laid over pending an investigation by the Chief Engineer.

The President verbally reported that on May 20, 1903, he had transmitted to the Mayor the following report of the Chief Engineer in regard to the work done on the New Croton Dam:

NEW YORK, May 19, 1903.

Hon. WILLIAM H. TEN EYCK, President Aqueduct Commission:

DEAR SIR—In regard to the work done on the New Croton Dam for the week ending Friday, May 15, I would report as follows:

The river flow was low during the week.

At the dam, rock excavation work continued as usual on the lower spillway slope. It also continued in the main dam extension bottom at various points along the line of the core-wall location from about Station 2-|-30 to Station 1-|-30, also along most of the length of the bottom on the down stream side, where the work of widening out has progressed, especially between Stations 1-|-60± and 1-|-15± in the granular rock. Here but little increase in the depth of the cut has been made during the week, but some advance has been made into the rock slope in front of Gate House No. 1. This slope continues to develop to the left of the dam line some soft and seamy layers in the rock.

Earth excavation has continued in the refill immediately south of the wing wall and along the slopes of the down stream cut above the bed rock. It has also continued in enlarging the pit at the junction of the dam and core-wall on the up stream side, and on the slopes in the hard pan and refill above.

The steam shovel worked on the day shift and on the night shift since May 11, and the usual number of derricks and cables were employed.

Masonry work continued with three gangs:

One gang between Station 8-|-90 and Station 9-|-35 and on spillway 100 by 200 R.

One gang between Station 9-|-70 and 10-|-12 and on north abutment.

One gang on staircase and guard wall near Gate House No. 2.

Pointing work continued and an increase shows in the number of men employed in it.

The amount of work done was approximately as follows:

Earth and rock excavation, steam shovel, 1,960 cubic yards.
Earth and rock excavation, hand gangs, 4,450 cubic yards.
Rock excavation, spillway, 250 cubic yards.
Masonry laid, main dam, etc., 415 cubic yards.

Which was referred to the Construction or Executive Committee.

The Chief Engineer also presented the following report:

Report No. 586.

NEW YORK, May 21, 1903.

To the Aqueduct Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN—In Report No. 569 I called to your attention the character of the natural foundation disclosed as underlying the core-wall at the south end of the New Croton Dam and to the necessity of making further examinations.

Prof. William H. Burr concurs with me as to the need of driving a tunnel through the rock under Gate House No. 1 in order to determine the character of the rock.

I ask authority to have the work done, the cost of which would be about \$300. I also ask authority to solicit proposals for doing such drilling as may be necessary in making the examination, the cost of which must not exceed \$5,000.

The report was ordered filed and the authority therein asked for was granted by the following vote:

Affirmative—Commissioners Ten Eyck, Ryan, Windolph and Curtis—4.

The Chief Engineer presented Report No. 587, dated May 21, 1903, returning communication of Helen de Veer, dated May 18, 1903, in relation to the removal of an obstruction from the pathway in property near One Hundred and Sixty-fifth street, and stating that the property in question was under the control of the Commissioner of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity.

The report was ordered filed and the Secretary was directed to reply to the letter therein referred to stating the facts.

The Chief Engineer also presented Report No. 588, dated May 21, 1903, returning letter of MacArthur Brothers Company, dated May 18, 1903, suggesting that said company be notified that the Aqueduct Commissioners cannot consider its proposition to take material from within the limits of the New Croton Reservoir for use in constructing embankments for raising and changing railroad tracks within the radius of said reservoir until said company has been awarded the contract by the railroad company, and can definitely specify the localities from which it desires to excavate earth and remove stone.

The report was ordered filed and the President was requested to reply to the letter of said company on the lines suggested in said report.

The Chief Engineer also presented Report No. 589, dated May 22, 1903, transmitting a copy of a letter addressed by Division Engineer Wegmann to him under date of May 21, 1903, in regard to certain actions of Mr. John Williams of the firm of Williams & Gerstle, contractors for the Muscote Dam, for the information of the Commissioners, and such action as they may deem proper.

Which was referred to the Construction or Executive Committee.

A communication was received from the Mayor, dated May 21, 1903, acknowledging receipt of report of work done on the New Croton Dam for the week ending May 15, 1903, together with photographs.

Which was ordered filed.

A communication was received from the Secretary, Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, dated May 18, 1903, transmitting copy of a resolution adopted by said Commissioners on May 13, 1903, requesting from "the heads of all departments, offices, boards and commissions a list of houses under their supervision and belonging to The City of New York not in immediate use for departmental purposes, with the information as to whether said premises are occupied by anyone, and upon what terms and conditions, in order that this Board may take such action as may seem necessary for the obtaining of proper revenue for the City."

Which was referred to the Secretary and Chief Engineer for report.

A communication was received from Nelson P. Lewis, Chief Engineer of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, dated May 19, 1903, transmitting bills of Phillips and Worthington for sinking test wells and for materials furnished at the Jerome Park Reservoir, amounting to \$917.08 and \$37.40, respectively, approved by himself and the Chief Engineer of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity.

Which was referred to the Construction or Executive Committee.

A communication was received from N. S. Hill, Jr., Chief Engineer of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, dated May 19, 1903, transmitting bill of Albert E. Wheeler, dated May 18, 1903, amounting to \$125, for services in connection with the test wells at Jerome Park Reservoir, approved by himself and the Chief Engineer of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment.

Which was referred to the Construction or Executive Committee.

An opinion was received from the Corporation Counsel, dated May 20, 1903, in reply to a communication of this Commission, dated May 6, 1903, in reference to the application of the provisions of the Labor Law to the contract of Messrs. Williams & Gerstle, contractors for building the Muscote Dam, and stating that inspectors were not within the provisions of the Labor Law in reference to eight hours' work, and that, therefore, they could be employed and paid for overtime accordingly.

Which was ordered filed and referred to the Chief Engineer for his information.

Printed copy of chapter 26 of the Laws of 1901 was received from the Secretary of State, providing that a leave of absence with pay shall be granted for the twenty-four hours of the 30th day of May, etc., to every person in the public service who served in the army or the navy of the United States in the War of the Rebellion and who was honorably discharged from said service.

Which was referred to the Chief Engineer and Secretary to inform their staffs, and ordered filed.

A communication was received from the Merchants' Association of New York, dated May 20, 1903, requesting a file of the printed minutes of the Aqueduct Commissioners from January 1, 1903, to the present date.

The President stated that he had complied with such request; whereupon the communication was ordered filed.

A communication was also received from the Merchants' Association of New York, dated May 21, 1903, making certain inquiries in regard to the renting of parcels of land known as Nos. 112 and 185, to Nelson Brothers.

Which was laid over pending inquiry from the Corporation Counsel.

A communication was received from the Board of Aldermen, transmitting copy of resolutions adopted by said Board, May 12, 1903, in relation to the commemoration of the establishment of municipal government on Manhattan Island two hundred and fifty years ago, and requesting that the heads of the several departments of the City government close their respective offices on Friday, May 29, 1903.

Which was referred to the Construction or Executive Committee.

A communication was received from the Municipal Civil Service Commission, dated May 21, 1903, certifying Michael R. Ryan, No. 130 East One Hundred and Twenty-seventh street, as eligible for appointment to the position of Inspector of Masonry.

Which was referred to the Chief Engineer for report.

A communication was received from H. T. Dykman, dated White Plains, N. Y., May 22, 1903, in reply to a letter of this Commission of May 20, 1903, in reference to the new highways system, and referring particularly to Roads 5½, 6 and 8.

The President was directed to answer that Commissioners were not intending to build the additional highways mentioned therein.

Two communications were received from H. T. Dykman, dated White Plains, N. Y., May 22, 1903, acknowledging receipt of letters of this Commission dated May 15 and 16.

Which were ordered filed.

The Commissioners then adjourned.

Present—Commissioners Ten Eyck (President), Ryan, Windolph, Curtis and the Chief Engineer.

The minutes of meetings of May 19 and 22, 1903, were read and approved.

The Committee of Finance and Audit reported the examination and audit of bills contained in Vouchers Nos. 15200 to 15213 inclusive, amounting to \$2,457.12.

Which were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment by the following vote:

Affirmative—Commissioners Ten Eyck, Ryan, Windolph and Curtis—4.

Report No. 584 of the Chief Engineer, dated May 21, 1903, transmitting copy of Report No. 3, dated May 15, 1903, of Professors Kemp and Stevenson, upon the character of the material underlying the foundation of the core wall removed at the southerly end of the New Croton Dam, was received from the Construction or Executive Committee with the recommendation that it be referred to the Chief Engineer and Professor William H. Burr, Expert Engineer, for their information.

The recommendation was approved and it was so ordered.

Report No. 589 of the Chief Engineer, dated May 22, 1903, transmitting copy of a letter addressed to him by Division Engineer Wegmann, under date of May 21, 1903, in regard to certain actions of Mr. John Williams, of the firm of Williams & Gerstle, contractors for the Muscote Dam, was received from the Construction or Executive Committee with a recommendation that the President be requested to communicate with said contractors and request that Mr. John Williams of said firm be relieved from the superintendence of the work at said dam, and a more competent man placed in charge.

The recommendation was approved and it was so ordered.

A resolution of the Board of Aldermen, adopted May 12, 1903, in relation to the commemoration of the establishment of Municipal Government on Manhattan Island two hundred and fifty years ago, and requesting that the heads of the several departments of the City Government close their respective offices on Friday, May

29, 1903, was received from the Construction or Executive Committee with a recommendation that the same be complied with so far as practicable.

The recommendation was approved and it was so ordered.

The President presented a communication of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, dated May 22, 1903, in reference to the classification of the position of Consulting Engineer, and stated that he had replied thereto on May 25, 1903, and also that he had appeared before said Commission and advocated the placing of said position in the exempt class.

The action of the President was approved and the communication was ordered filed.

The Chief Engineer presented the following report in regard to the work done on the New Croton Dam:

NEW YORK, May 26, 1903.

Hon. WILLIAM H. TEN EYCK, President, Aqueduct Commission:

DEAR SIR—In regard to the work done on the New Croton Dam for the week ending Friday, May 22, I would report as follows:

The river flow was low during the week.

Rock excavation continued as usual on the lower spillway slopes, but with fewer men, and on the rock face back of the north abutment of the bridge.

On the Dam, extensive excavation, rock and earth work continued, the former being confined principally to deepening the bottom work from the old wing wall face to Station 1 x 50± and to widening the cut along most of its length, the same steam shovel being at work at the level 80±, between Stations 1 and 2.

Between the wing wall and Station 2x80± the rock exposed continues to be shelly and seamy, and between Stations 2x80± and 1x50± to show solid, but with blocky ledges in some points. Approaching Gatehouse No. 1, soft rock continues to show and a tunnel has been ordered at this point to investigate the material under Gatehouse No. 1.

Preparations are being made to start a new shovel cut along the extension bottom at Elevation 65, starting at the wing wall and running towards Gatehouse No. 1. This it is considered will expedite the work of lowering the cut at the south end.

Earth excavation has continued at various points along the slopes on both sides of the main cut, and particularly in the bottom on the up-stream side at the junction of the main dam and the core wall, where the area has been extended, the cut still remaining at the bottom at about Elevation 45.

One cable, four derricks and the steam shovel have continued work on the excavation as usual, the cable and the shovel working also in the night shift.

Work continued on the test pit south of Gatehouse No. 1, a depth of 19± feet having been reached.

Three gangs have continued on the masonry work.

One gang on north abutment.

BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE Erie Railroad Company the right or franchise to construct and operate a railroad in and upon Thirtieth Avenue and the marginal wharf or way lying between Thirtieth Avenue and the waters of the Hudson river, between Twenty-seventh and Twenty-ninth streets, in the Borough of Manhattan, City of New York.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen of The City of New York hereby grants to the Erie Railroad Company, subject to the conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth, the franchise, right and privilege to construct and operate a double-track surface railroad, with a single switch connecting the two tracks, to be operated by steam locomotives or other motive power which may be lawfully employed, except horses or the overhead system of electricity, across Thirtieth Avenue and the marginal wharf or way extending from the westerly side of Thirtieth Avenue to the waters of the Hudson river, between Twenty-seventh and Twenty-ninth streets, in the Borough of Manhattan, City, County and State of New York.

Sec. 2. The grant of this franchise is subject to the following conditions:

First—This ordinance as to the marginal wharf which extends from the westerly line of Thirtieth Avenue to the waters of the Hudson river shall not be operative and no rights thereunder shall vest in the grantee, its successors or assigns until the Commissioner of Docks, under the provisions of section 819 of the Charter of The City of New York, shall approve by resolution, license or otherwise, the use of such marginal wharf by the grantee in the manner herein provided, or in such other manner as he may prescribe, not inconsistent with the terms of this ordinance.

Second—The said right, privilege and franchise to construct and operate such railroad shall be held and enjoyed by the grantee, its successors or assigns, for the term of twenty-five years from the date when this ordinance is signed by the Mayor, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided, with the privilege of renewal of the grant for a further period of twenty-five years, upon a fair revaluation of said right, privilege and franchise, but such renewal shall not provide for any further renewal. Such revaluation shall be of the right, privilege and franchise to maintain and operate said railroad by itself, and is not to include any valuation derived from the ownership, operation or control of any other railroad by the grantee, its successors or assigns. It shall be made in the following manner:

One disinterested freeholder shall be chosen by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment or its successor in authority; one disinterested freeholder shall be chosen by the railroad company; these two shall choose a third disinterested freeholder, and the three so chosen shall act as appraisers and shall make the revaluation aforesaid. Such appraisers shall be chosen at least six months prior to the expiration of the grant, and their report shall be filed with the Comptroller or his successor in authority within three months after they are chosen. They shall act as appraisers and not as arbitrators. They may base their judgment upon their own experience, and upon such information as they may obtain by inquiries and investigations without the presence of either party. They shall have the right to examine the books of the railroad company. The valuation so ascertained, fixed and determined shall be conclusive upon both parties, but shall not in any event be less than the minimum amount fixed as the sum to be paid annually for the last five years of the original franchise.

Provided, however, and this grant is upon the express condition that the right, privilege and franchise conferred by this ordinance may be cancelled and annulled upon one year's notice in writing to the grantee, its successors and assigns, by the joint act of the Commissioner of Docks of The City of New York and of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, or their respective successors in authority, and thereupon all the rights of the grantee, its successors or assigns in and upon the street and marginal wharf or way aforesaid shall cease, and the railroad and its structures thereon shall be forthwith removed and the pavement of the street or wharf restored under the same conditions and covenants as are contained in the following paragraph of this section, designated third:

Third—Upon the termination of such franchise, right or privilege, whether original or by way of renewal, the plant and property, with its appurtenances of the Erie Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, in the street and upon the marginal wharf or way aforesaid, shall be forthwith removed by the grantee, its successors or assigns, and the surface of the said street or marginal wharf or way upon which such railroad was laid shall be restored to a condition equal to that of the surrounding surface and pavement of such street and wharf. In default of the performance of this condition by the grantee, its successors or assigns, the proper legal authorities may cause such property and plant to be removed from the street and wharf aforesaid and the surface thereof to be restored in the manner above described at the expense of the grantee, its successors or assigns, and such expense shall be recovered by The City of New York by action or otherwise.

Fourth—The grantee, its successors or assigns shall pay for this franchise to The City of New York the following sums of money:

During the first term of five years the annual sum of \$675.

Such sums shall be paid into the Treasury of The City of New York on November 1 in each year.

Fifth—The rights and franchises granted hereby shall not be assigned either in whole or in part, or leased or sublet in any manner, nor shall title thereto, or right, interest or property therein pass to or vest in any other person or corporation whatsoever, either by the act of the Erie Railroad Company, its successors or assigns, or by operation of law, whether under the provisions of the statutes relating to the consolidation or merger of corporations or otherwise, without the consent of The City of New York, acting by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, or its successors in authority, evidenced by an instrument under seal, anything herein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding, and the granting, giving or waiving of any one or more of such consents shall not render unnecessary any subsequent consent or consents.

Sixth—The said railroad may be operated by locomotive steam power or by any other motive power which may be approved by the Board of Railroad Commissioners in accordance with the provisions of the Railroad Law, excepting overhead electrical power and horse power, provided, however, that the locomotive steam engines used shall be housed or boxed so as to conform to the type commonly known as the dummy engine.

The number of cars to be included in any train operated upon the railroad shall be limited to ten, and the speed of the engines and cars shall never exceed six miles per hour. No car or engine shall be permitted to remain stationary within the limits of Thirteenth avenue, or upon the marginal wharf or street at any time.

Seventh—The railroad constructed under this ordinance shall be maintained and operated solely for the purpose of the transportation of goods, wares and merchandise and for no other purpose, and especially for no purpose in connection with the passenger traffic as commonly understood.

Eighth—Such railroad shall be constructed and operated in the latest improved manner of street railroad construction and operation, and solely upon the terms and according to the lines and surveys and of the character of the rails and other parts of the construction approved by the Commissioner of Docks of The City of New York and the President of the Borough of Manhattan. Such railroad of the grantee, its successors or assigns shall be maintained in good condition throughout the term of this grant.

Ninth—Said railroad shall be constructed, maintained and operated subject to the supervision and control of all the authorities of The City of New York who have jurisdiction in such matters under the Charter of The City of New York, and especially shall in all respects be subject to the power and authority of the Commissioner of Docks to regulate and control the uses of the marginal wharf or way above described, and the transportation of property thereon.

Tenth—The grantee, its successors or assigns, shall at all times keep the street between the tracks, and for a distance of two feet beyond the rails on either side thereof, free and clear from ice and snow.

Eleventh—The grantee, its successors or assigns, shall keep in permanent repair the portion of the surface of the street and of the marginal wharf or way between its tracks, the rails of its tracks and two feet in width outside of its tracks, under the supervision of the proper local authorities, and whenever required by them to do so, and in such manner as they may prescribe. And The City of New York shall have the right to change the material or character of the pavement of the street and marginal wharf or way, and in that event the grantee, its successors or assigns shall be bound to replace such pavement in the manner directed by the proper City officer at its own expense, and the provision as to repairs herein contained shall apply to such renewed or altered pavement.

Twelfth—In case of any violation or breach or failure to comply with any of the provisions herein contained, this grant may be forfeited and annulled by The City of New York by an action brought by the Corporation Counsel on ten days' notice to the grantee, its successors or assigns.

Sec. 3. This grant is upon the further and express condition that the provisions of the Railroad Law applicable thereto, and all laws or ordinances now in force or which may be adopted relating to surface railroads operating in The City of New York shall be strictly complied with.

Sec. 4. The grantee, its successors or assigns shall commence the construction of the railroad under this franchise and complete the same within six months from the date when it has obtained the necessary permits and resolutions of the City officials and Departments, and on or before January 1, 1904, otherwise this grant shall be forfeited forthwith and without any proceedings either at law or otherwise for that purpose, provided, however, that such time may be extended under and for causes specified in section 99 of the Railroad Law, by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, for a period not exceeding six months.

Sec. 5. This grant is upon the express condition that the grantee, within thirty days after it has been duly authorized to construct or operate its railroad hereunder, and before anything is done in exercise of the rights conferred hereby, shall deposit with the Comptroller of The City of New York the sum of \$1,500, either in money or in securities, to be approved by him, which shall be security for the performance of the terms and conditions of this grant, especially those which relate to the payment of the annual charge for the franchise, the repairs of the street pavement and the removal of snow and ice, and the quality of construction of the railroad. In case of default in the performance by said company of such terms and conditions, The City of New York shall have the right to cause the work to be done and the materials to be furnished for the performance thereof after due notice, and shall collect the reasonable cost thereof from the said fund without legal proceedings, or after default in the payment of the annual charges, shall collect the same with interest from such fund after ten days' notice in writing to the said company.

In case of any drafts so made upon this security fund, the said company shall, upon thirty days' notice in writing, pay to the Comptroller of The City of New York a sum of money sufficient to restore the said fund to the original amount of fifteen hundred dollars, and in default thereof the grant hereby made may be canceled and annulled at the option of the Comptroller of The City of New York, acting on behalf of said City. No action or proceeding or rights under the provisions of this section shall affect any other legal rights, remedies or causes of action belonging to The City of New York.

Sec. 6. This grant shall not become operative until said railroad company shall duly execute, under its corporate seal, an instrument in writing wherein said company shall promise, covenant and agree on its part and behalf to conform to and abide by and perform all the terms and conditions and requirements in this ordinance fixed and contained, and file the same in the office of the Comptroller of The City of New York within thirty days after the signing of this ordinance by the Mayor.

Sec. 7. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
