

New York City Department of Correction Quarterly Emergency Lock-In Report FY20 Quarter 4 (April 1st-June 30th)

This report provides information regarding the rate of emergency lock-ins that the New York City Department of Correction (DOC or Department) is required to report pursuant to New York City Administrative Code §9-155. This reporting time frame is from April 1st – June 30th, 2020.
