## STATEMENT FROM MAYOR BILL DE BLASIO ON INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

On the International Day of Persons with Disabilities and the 25th Anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act, we join hands with the nearly 900,000 New Yorkers with disabilities and the millions of others around the globe, to remember our past and set goals for our future. The City of New York is renewed in its commitment to making New York City the most accessible city in the world, and I look forward to the day that the U.S. ratifies the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities."
