**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 87**  
**JULY 11, 1977**

**TRANSFER OF FUNCTIONS, POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL  
AGAINST POVERTY OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK TO THE ADMINISTRATOR  
OF THE HUMAN RESOURCES ADMINISTRATION**

Whereas, The Community Services Administration has withdrawn its recognition and approval of the Council Against Poverty as the administering board of the community action program in The City of New York and requested that The City of New York, as grantee, directly administer The City of New York's community action program on an interim basis until a new administering board is constituted and until the boards of directors of community corporations are reconstituted in compliance with requirements of the Community Services Administration; and

Whereas, It is necessary and desirable to transfer all functions, powers and duties of the Council Against Poverty to the Administrator of the Human Resources Administration in order to provide for direct administration of the City of New York's community action program for an interim period;

Section 1. The Administrator, Human Resources Administration of The City of New York, is hereby appointed interim administrator ("Interim Administrator") for the community action program of The City of New York ("Community Action Program"), to serve in such capacity until such time as a new administering board for the Community Action Program is constituted (the "Interim Period").

Section 2. All of the functions, powers and duties of the New York City Council Against Poverty created by Executive Order No. 28 of August 15, 1966, as amended by Executive Order No. 84 of July 1, 1968, such Executive Order No. 84 having been amended by Executive Order No. 34 of August 26, 1975 and Executive Order No. 67 of August 16, 1976, are hereby transferred to and vested in such Administrator during the interim period.

Section 3. Except to the extent that they may be inconsistent with this order, all determinations, authorizations, regulations, writing, certificates, orders, directives, agreements, and other actions made, issued or entered into with request to any function, power or duty affected by this order and not revoked, superseded or otherwise made inapplicable before the effective date of this order shall continue in full force and effect until amended, modified or terminated or suspended by the Interim Administrator.

Section 4. The Interim Administrator shall adopt such procedures and establish such staff and committee as he deems necessary to carry out the functions ordered herein.

Section 5. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
