


February After Action Review

Although there have been fewer in-person events, significant progress has been made through dedicated volunteer meetings and a series of training sessions. Notably, 35 volunteers participated in a comprehensive emergency operations and Watch Command Overview at NYCEM Headquarters, demonstrating their dedication to enhancing their skills and preparedness for emergency situations. This level of engagement highlights the collaborative spirit and determination of our volunteers to serve and protect the community, regardless of external challenges.

THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PODCAST

As Black History Month comes to a close, it is important to continue to recognize the achievements African Americans have made over the course of American history and celebrate their contributions. It encourages recognition, from past and current trailblazers, in all traditional and non-traditional fields and careers. By sharing their stories in all forms of media and storytelling, their legacies continue to be woven into American history. These stories will inspire the next generation to create change and foster equality. African American stories, and the larger human experience, deepen our understanding and strengthen our connections with one another.

On this episode of 'Prep Talk,' we are joined by New York City Emergency Management (NYCEM) Deputy Chief Counsel Traci Wheelwright, who shares her story on what inspired her to pursue a career in law, challenges Black women still face in the workplace, and what she hopes to accomplish in her current role. Wheelwright also discusses what led her to choose a career in public service and what she finds most rewarding about assisting New Yorkers during emergencies. Throughout her career she has held leadership roles with the NYC Department of Transportation, the Nassau County Supreme Court, and Amtrak.

"I really take comfort in the fact that in a leadership role I'm able to contribute in a way where my voice is heard, where I'm able to implement change, and effectively. Specifically, here at NYCEM the environment is so intimate that we can rally the troops together, have meaningful discourse and put things into effect relatively quickly," said **NYC Emergency Management Deputy Chief Counsel Traci Wheelwright**.

Community Safety for Houses of Worship Safety and Prep Training



Last week we started adding this new section in our weekly newsletter dedicated to showcasing the incredible impact of NYC CERT volunteers across the city! This section will offer a closer look at the NYC CERT program, highlighting one of the following sections each week including recent trends, the diverse tasks our volunteers undertake to support new initiatives and campaigns, and the valuable resources available to both members and the public. It will also serve as a platform to spotlight the amazing work being done by individuals, divisions, and even entire boroughs, demonstrating the vital role CERT plays in keeping New York City safe and resilient.



As recruitment is a task that both NYC CERT staff and volunteers can accomplish together, we wanted to introduce a new initiative that all CERT divisions can work on each month. We will continue to target certain CERT districts that need an extra boost in 2025 through collaboration with our fellow Community Engagement Bureau staff and external organizations.

How can you help? We are requesting that all divisions work on collecting contact information from local service organizations such as, the Knights of Columbus (K of C), Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH), Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), Lions Clubs International and Rotary Clubs. Our goal is to engage these groups in conversations on emergency preparedness and schedule CERT Recruitment events for their members.

Task: Division Leadership can start this conversation with members at their next division meeting and all volunteers can begin to compile a list of local chapters/posts where they can reach out to collect contact information. All members can participate in this activity and all information can be found via an internet search. At the next division meeting, members can share their contacts, and all can split up the list and

begin contacting (via phone or stopping by the location, if nearby) to introduce themselves and request to do a recruitment tabling and/or mini presentation about the benefits of joining NYC CERT.

Sample script:

Hi. My name is _____ and I am a New York City Community Emergency Response Team Volunteer. We operate under the umbrella of NYC Emergency Management, and we provide emergency preparedness information to residents to ensure they are safe and prepared before an emergency. We also deploy to assist first responders and the public during and after emergencies. We would like to provide some information to on these topics and how to join NYC CERT by scheduling an event at your location. The requirements for membership are simple: Members must be 18 years of age or older, live or work in NYC and pass a NYCEM background check. Who can I speak to from this location to discuss this opportunity?

**Feel free to relay any events you have participated in as a CERT volunteer and the roles you have performed when communicating this information.*



- [AWR-424-W: Pandemic Planning Multilateral Risk Communication](#) provides participants an overview of multilateral risk communications during a pandemic.
- [PER-402-W: Pandemic Planning for Mass Sheltering](#) is designed to help learners plan for mass sheltering operations during multiple disasters.

These trainings can be completed in as little as two hours. Trainings are available for individual learners or can be incorporated into the curriculum for volunteer groups, university courses, healthcare and hospital systems, and more. NYC CERT Orientation Support



Manhattan Division 4





Bronx Division 1





How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:



What is the NYC CERT Uniform?

We are a Team! To ensure we all represent NYC Emergency Management with professionalism, this message serves as a friendly reminder about our uniform policy.

- Event organizer submits an official request using the [NYC CERT External Request Form](#).
- NYC CERT Leadership *should not* submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this [Event Request form](#).

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the [NYC CERT Event Calendar](#) with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.

Whether it's a preparedness event or an emergency response, being in proper uniform allows us to be easily identified by the public and first responders. It signifies our commitment to safety and fosters a sense of unity.

Here's a quick rundown of the NYC CERT uniform:

- Green NYC CERT polo shirt (mandatory)
- Khaki pants (mandatory)
- NYC CERT reflective vest (always most visible outer layer)
- NYC CERT credential on lanyard, visible at all times (mandatory)
- Optional items: NYC CERT baseball hat, windbreaker, green helmet (for emergency responses), green CERT response bag (for emergency responses), NYC CERT branded sweaters/jackets (produced with NYCEM approval)


