

# WEEKLY INCIDENT BRIEF - COVID-19

## 04/06/20 – 04/12/20

### Purpose of Weekly Incident Brief

This Weekly Incident Brief provides resources for businesses seeking economic relief, information for workplaces, and guidance for donating services or supplies. In comparison, the Daily Brief provides more detailed information about the evolving COVID-19 situation, including travel and transit impacts and the number of COVID-19 cases in the City by borough.

### Incident Summary

NYC Emergency Management continues to coordinate with our partners at the City, State, and Federal levels as well as the private sector in response to COVID-19. As of April 5, 2020, there are **64,955** COVID-19 positive cases in New York City, an increase of **4,105** new cases from the previous day. Additionally:

- The CDC advises individuals to cover their mouths and noses with cloth to reduce community-based transmission.
- All non-essential gatherings of individuals of any size for any reason are temporarily banned.
- Per [CDC guidance](#), employers should not require a positive COVID-19 test result or a healthcare provider’s note for employees who are sick to validate their illness, qualify for sick leave, or to return to work.
- In accordance with the New York State Executive Order, every New Yorker must stay at home from work, unless they are an essential worker. More information regarding the New York State Executive Orders can be found [here](#).

There are no specific vaccines or treatments available for this novel coronavirus, or any other coronavirus. However, medication and vaccine research continues.

## Relief For Small Businesses

- The City will provide relief for small businesses across the City seeing a reduction in revenue because of COVID-19. Businesses with fewer than 100 employees who have seen sales decreases of 25% or more will be eligible for zero interest loans of up to \$75,000 to help mitigate losses in profit. The City is also offering small businesses with fewer than 5 employees a grant to cover 40% of payroll costs for two months (an average of \$6,000) to help retain employees. - The **Small Business Administration (SBA)** will offer Small Businesses impacted by Coronavirus (COVID-19) **up to \$2 million in Economic Injury Disaster Loan Assistance (EIDL)**. Under the EIDL program the SBA makes loans available to small businesses and private non-profit organizations in designated areas of a state or territory to help alleviate economic injury caused by the Coronavirus (COVID-19). - The **Small Business Administration (SBA)** will offer loans up to \$10 million to small businesses with less than 500 employees affected by COVID-19 through the **Paycheck Protection Program**. The program is designed to provide a direct incentive for small businesses to keep workers on the payroll. SBA will forgive loans if all employees are kept on the payroll for eight weeks and the money is used for payroll, rent, mortgage interest, or utilities.
