



I. Population Change: DOC Population by Custody Status


Total DOC Population by Custody Status February 26, 2022 – March 4, 2022




City Sentenced Population by Custody Status February 26, 2022 – March 4, 2022






Number and Percent of Patients Ever Confirmed Positive for COVID-19 While in Custody February 26 – March 4, 2022


Number of Incarcerated Patients Ever Confirmed Positive for COVID-19 While in Custody March 17, 2020 – March 4, 2022













III. Housing: Percentage of People in Custody in Housing Areas with a COVID-19 Housing Designation¹










