This year's events will be held both in-person and virtually and include a social media engagement campaign. These initiatives will provide the foundation to equip New Yorkers with the necessary tools to prepare their families, pets, businesses, and communities for any emergency.

The best way to prepare is to develop an emergency plan and connect with resources that can help you stay informed during an emergency. We encourage Yorkers to sign up for Notify NYC, the city's free official source for emergency alerts," said **NYC Emergency Management Commissioner Zach Iscol**. Throughout the month, NYC Emergency Management will continue to partner with nonprofit organizations, as well as elected officials, to share critical information with the public. Through partnerships with Community Organizations Active in Disasters (COAD) and Community Emergency Networks, the agency will facilitate seminars and panel discussions that can equip individuals with the tools they need to prepare for, respond to, and recover from an emergency.
