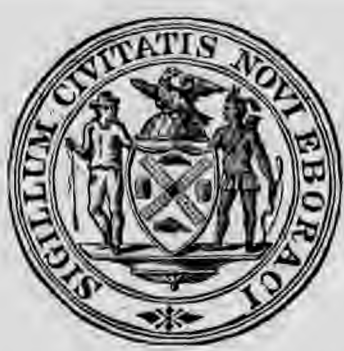

Hon. P. J. SCULLY, City Clerk:

SIR:—In compliance with chapter 3, article 1, section 23 of the Revised Ordinances of 1897, I have the honor to transmit herewith for presentation to the Municipal Assembly statements of all contracts made by The Mayor, Aldermen and Community of the City of New York and the municipalities, corporations, etc., consolidated therewith, prior to January 1, 1898, and The City of New York (Greater New York) since January 1, 1898, or directed or authorized by the Common Council of said corporations and not performed or completed, or upon which any moneys remain unpaid on each on December 31, 1899.

These statements show the payments made on account of the various contracts to December 31, 1898, inclusive, the payments on account thereof during the year 1899; the total amounts paid thereon to December 31, 1899; the balances remaining unpaid thereon, December 31, 1899, and the funds or accounts against which said contracts are chargeable.

STATEMENT "A" shows the contracts executed prior to January 1, 1898, by The Mayor, Aldermen and Community of The City of New York.

STATEMENT "B" shows the contracts executed prior to January 1, 1898, by the municipalities, corporations, etc., consolidated with The Mayor, Aldermen and Community of The City of New York.

GENTLEMEN—I am in receipt of a communication from the Corporation Counsel, dated January 14, 1901, advising me that the report of the Commissioners of Estimate in the proceeding taken pursuant to the provisions of chapter 293 of the Laws of 1895 and chapter 320 of the Laws of 1887, to acquire title to lands bounded by Hester, Essex, Division, Norfolk, Suffolk, Canal, Rutgers and Jefferson streets and East Broadway for a public park, was confirmed by an order of the Supreme Court dated January 10, 1901, and filed January 11, 1901.

The title to the property acquired in said proceeding vested in the City on June 22, 1897, pursuant to chapter 676 of the Laws of 1897.

The awards to property-owners and interest thereon are payable, according to law, by the issue of Corporate Stock of the City of New York.

Chapter 293 of the Laws of 1895 limits the amount of bonds to be issued for the acquisition of the title to and the construction of the public parks provided for in said act to the sum of \$5,000,000.

The Board of Estimate and Apportionment has heretofore authorized the issue of bonds provided for in said act to the amount of \$2,341,351.28, leaving a margin of \$68,648.72 available for the expenses of the present proceeding. This will leave a deficiency which is shown as follows:

After due consideration, the Board directed the Secretary to refer the matter to the Corporation Counsel, with the following statement, and the request that this Department be informed what action the Board should take in the premises.

Mr. White, in explaining his reasons for the increase in the amount required by him to carry out the contract, states that they are based upon an actual outlay incurred by the adoption in the Borough of Manhattan of a night collecting system for the removal of dead animals, etc., from premises (dwellings, theatres, hotels, etc.), and the new method of loading the vessel employed in the removal of this material at night, so as to permit the vessel to leave the offal dock at daylight, and pass through the bay at an early hour.

In the Borough of The Bronx the extra amount required by him is caused by the expense incurred in the increased number of men, trucks and wagons found necessary to do the work, over an area of 27,317 acres, or 42.5 square miles. Within the past two years there has been a large increase in the number of inhabitants, making the number of small settlements greater in different sections of the borough, and so scattered as to require long distances to be traversed in the removal of dead animals, etc., consuming time and wear of material.

During the year 1899, 1,115 horses and 3,216 cats and dogs were collected and removed, in addition to the offal, decayed material, etc. This exceeds by nearly 4,000 the number of animals removed during the previous year.

The increase for Manhattan is based upon an actual outlay incurred by the adoption of a night-collecting system for the removal of dead animals, etc., from the Borough of Manhattan, placed of advertisement and prominent thoroughfares. We have also arranged to haul the vessels employed in the removal of this material at night, so as to permit her to leave the offal dock at daylight and pass through the bay at an early hour. These improvements were found necessary in order to satisfy public sentiment, and since their adoption the system has met with general approval.

The increase asked for the Bronx is based upon the actual expense incurred in the increased number of men, trucks and wagons found necessary to do the work. For the past two years Rapid Transit has built up in this district quite a number of small settlements in different sections, which are so scattered as to compel us to make a large number of separate runs of very long distances for the removal of dead animals, etc. During the year 1899 we collected and removed 1,115 horses and 3,216 cats and dogs, in addition to the offal, decayed material, etc. This exceeds by nearly 4,000 the number of animals removed during the previous year.
