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## PERMANENT CENSUS BOARD.

July 28, 1913.

Hon. WILLIAM J. GAYNOR, Mayor, The City of New York:

Sir—The accompanying report of the operations of the Permanent Census Board for the second quarter of the current year, ending June 30, is respectfully submitted.

The work of amending the census as required by law has been prosecuted along the same general lines as conducted during the first three months of the year, except that more diversified interests in connection with the work, a broader scope and a wider range of activity have resulted.

During April and May the work was confined entirely to the Boroughs of The Bronx and Queens, while in June, certain of the enumerators engaged in The Bronx were transferred to Manhattan and others from Queens were sent to Brooklyn. This division of the force proved advantageous and was made possible by reason of the fact that 13 of the 21 census districts in The Bronx have been canvassed, the remaining 8 districts, which are located in the outlying and sparsely populated sections of the borough, have been reserved for enumerators using motor cycles. In Queens, practically the same conditions prevail; 15 of the 25 census districts have been covered, two of the remainder being deferred for later enumeration and the balance for motor-cycle work.

Generally speaking, the work has progressed in a satisfactory manner. Some difficulty, however, has been experienced in certain locations in securing the information which the law demands. Refusals to furnish the same are quite general in certain quarters populated largely by a foreign element, but this condition is not confined entirely to this class—it is encountered in the better residential sections of the outlying boroughs, and may be charged to two primary causes: First, ignorance of the requirements of the law, and, second, to the fact that the suburban sections of the city are over-run with peddlers, agents, hucksters and inspectors from the various city departments, the latter being required to make periodical visits in the performance of their duties. This refusal or failure to secure complete and detailed information during the present quarter is emphasized by the fact that 123 days of this period were taken up in making revisits or on what are designated as call-back cases.

Another contributory cause of the difficulties encountered is the fact that the enumerators are not in uniform, and while they are all equipped with official badges, this is not deemed sufficient evidence of authority by some to comply with the requirements.

Co-operating with the Department of Health there were issued during the period covered by this report 1,040 certificates of age to children whose records of birth were not on file in that Department and who, in consequence, were unable to obtain employment certificates.

Of the number of certificates applied for and issued through this office 869 were found on file and 171 were reported as not located.

An important and interesting feature of the work of this Board is the investigation of the admission of immigrant children, some of whom are admitted under bond Co-operation with the United States Department of Commerce and Labor and with the Bureau of Industries and Immigration, of the Department of Labor of the State of New York, has revealed the fact that within a month or two after arrival not more than 50 per cent. of these children can be located.

All immigrant cases, other than those admitted under bond, are investigated through the various police precincts throughout the City under the supervision of Lieut. Thomas J. Gleason, and the results of such investigation are shown in the following figures:

Presumably this condition obtains because of errors in entry of names, faulty and incorrect addresses, and the further fact that a large percentage of these children make only a brief stay in the City before being transported to relatives and friends in various parts of the country.

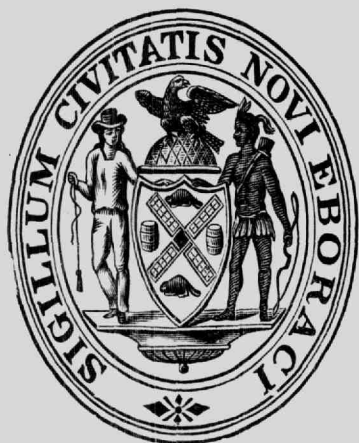

##### Amendment to Sanitary Code.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health held July 30, 1913, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That section 142 of the Sanitary Code be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 142. A public or church funeral shall not be held of any person who has died of small-pox, diphtheria (croup), scarlet fever, yellow fever, typhus fever, Asiatic cholera, measles or plague, but the funeral of such person shall be private, and it shall not be lawful to invite or permit at the funeral of any such person who has died of any one of the above diseases or of any infectious disease, or at any services connected therewith, any person whose attendance is not necessary, or from or to whom there is danger of contagion thereby.

##### Amendment to Rules.

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF Health of the Department of Health held July 30, 1913, the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the following method of procedure in the preparation, treatment and transportation of the remains of persons deceased from infectious diseases will be required to be observed by this Department on and after August 1, 1913:

1. In deaths from infectious disease where the remains are to be interred or cremated within the City limits:

(a) The undertaker shall notify the Division of Infectious Diseases immediately upon receiving notice of a death from smallpox, diphtheria, scarlet fever, yellow fever, typhus fever, plague, Asiatic cholera, measles or any other infectious disease dangerous to the general health of the community.

(b) An Inspector of Division of Infectious Diseases shall visit the premises wherein death has occurred, forthwith, to see that regulations of the Department are complied with as to treatment and enclosure of remains and sealing of coffin or casket.

(c) The certificate of death must be presented at the Department of Health forthwith, and attached thereto an affidavit made by the undertaker to the effect that the body has been properly prepared and enclosed and that the rules of the Department will be strictly complied with as to exposure of the remains, public funeral, burial or cremation within twenty-four hours, use of draperies, rugs, etc.

2. In deaths from infectious disease where the remains are to be shipped by rail or boat:

(a) The Inspector of Division of Infectious Diseases shall determine who may accompany the remains to the place of interment or cremation.

(b) The undertaker, in addition to complying with rules heretofore specified, shall file with this Department a certificate of death and an affidavit to the effect that the rules of the State Department of Health have been complied with as to the preparation, disinfection, embalming and enclosure of the remains, specifying in such affidavit the rule or rules under which the body is being shipped or transported, and he shall notify in the name of the Department of Health of this City, by telegraph and before shipment of the remains, the health officer at point of destination, advising the date and train upon which the remains may be expected.

All such deposits made by bidders whose proposals shall not be accepted by the Commission will be returned to the person or persons making the same within five (5) days after the contract shall be executed and delivered. The deposit of the successful bidder will be returned when the contract is executed and its provisions in respect of the bond or deposit are complied with.

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.**

**THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES** thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a Department, chief of a Bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement, to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders, and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.
