Probationary Firefighter Gregory Shepherd said serving as a recruiter in the Department is another way for him to give back to the community.

JF: Did you always want to work as a New York City Firefighter?

GS: Yes. It pretty much started when I was in middle school in Flatbush and we took a class trip to Engine 249. I will never forget how those quarters looked and how it felt to be on the rig for the first time. It was exciting. That childhood curiosity for the FDNY only grew a couple years later when there was a fire in the building that I lived in and the Engine 249 Firefighters came to help us. I just remember there being so much smoke and us being in complete darkness in the middle of the night. Till this day, I can still remember the images of the Firefighters coming to make sure that nobody was hurt. Even though I was only 13, I knew I wanted to help people like that someday.

JF: We heard you met your Firefighter Candidate Mentorship Program Mentor Aaron Gardner before you worked here?

GS: Yes, that's true. He recruited me while I was working as a mortgage analyst and he later became my Mentor when I started the hiring process here. As a Mentor, he helped me learn so much about this job. He gave me

Firefighter 101:

Thermal Imaging Camera



uring Probationary Firefighter School, all "Probies" will learn about the Thermal Imaging Camera, which is a valuable tool that can be used for many operations. The camera may be especially helpful in the low visibility environment of structural firefighting and it provides a pictorial representation of temperature differences that are unaffected by smoke. In addition, the camera provides a new perspective of the fire ground that can be beneficial.
