PURPOSE: The New York City Department of Sanitation (DSNY) has prepared this Report on Public Participation Plan (PPP) Completion for the proposed North Shore Converted Marine Transfer Station (Converted MTS) to document and verify its compliance with the PPP, including its efforts to answer questions and address concerns raised and to identify any outstanding issues. DSNY's written certification in the Report attests to the fact that the PPP has been successfully completed for the Converted MTS. The PPP was designed to achieve the goals of the NYSDEC Environmental Justice Policy, an element of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation permit process for environmental permits (Part 360 (Solid Waste Management Facility); Part 201-5 (State Facility Air); Part 661/608 (Marine Resources)) sought by DSNY for the development of the Converted MTS. The PPP was approved by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation on March 8, 2007. The NYSDEC PPP approval letter is provided as **Attachment 1**.

As a general matter, through the implementation of the PPP, DSNY reached out to the MTS EJ community with information about the MTS project proposed for the College Point area of Queens and about the NYSDEC permit process. In addition, DSNY advertised and held an EJ informational meeting in the EJ project area for the Converted MTS, engaged in a dialogue with community stakeholders on the issues of concern, provided information on the Converted MTSs, responded to questions and informed the attendees about the NYSDEC permit process.

Identification of Environmental Justice Areas: With guidance from NYSDEC staff and consistent with the EJ Policy guidance on the use of census and other criteria to identify potential environmental justice areas, in May 2004, DSNY published maps with the Draft Scoping Document of environmental justice areas that would be potentially affected by the proposed actions for long term export. These environmental justice areas, among them the College Point area of Queens, were and continue to be the focus of DSNY's PPP activities.

BACKGROUND: The PPP and this Report are a continuation of the enhanced public participation process undertaken by DSNY during the period of May 2004 through January 2005 to keep all of the communities being considered for SWMP facilities involved in the City's decision making and environmental review process. This outreach process contributed to the endorsement of a Uniform Land Use Review Procedure siting action for the Converted MTSs by three of the four affected Community Boards in early 2005, the approval of the four ULURP siting actions by the City Planning Commission in April 2005, and SWMP adoption by the City Council in July 2006.

The development of the Converted MTS is a component of the SWMP long-term export plan. Among other approvals, NYSDEC environmental permits are required to operate and construct the Converted MTS. The Converted MTS final permit applications can be found in two public repositories described below.

REPORT ON PPP COMPLETION:

Identifying Community Stakeholders

In the initial stages of the public participation process for the Converted MTSs, outreach efforts were designed to identify and inform affected community leaders and local organizations, as well as individuals (stakeholders). Beginning in May 2004, DSNY developed initial contact lists of individuals and local organizations through the affected Community Boards. Thereafter, lists were updated on an ongoing basis through attendance sheets completed at the meetings and hearings described below and through public comments. A Spanish/English hotline (1-888-NYC-SWMP or 1-888-692-7967) has been in place since May 2004 to develop further entries to the Converted MTS stakeholders list and to respond to inquiries. It continues to be an active resource for the MTS EJ community.

The stakeholders list for the Converted MTS was updated as of March 2007 to include new entries in Community Board lists, additional community-based organizations, civic groups, religious groups, neighborhood housing agencies, and schools, among others and updated lists of elected officials. These lists have since been revised to include new stakeholders that participated in the public process described herein. The stakeholders list for the Converted MTS which contains 243 entries as of July 2007 is provided as **Attachment 2**.

Meaningful Opportunities to Comment:

DSNY held an EJ informational meeting in the Converted MTS community. The meeting was held on the date/time and location recommended by the District Manager of Queens Community Board 7, the community board in which the Converted MTS is proposed to be located:

- North Shore Converted MTS EJ Informational Meeting: Tuesday, April 17, 2007 from 6:30 PM until 9:00 PM at the Union Plaza Health Care Facility, 33-23 Union St, Flushing, NY;

The EJ informational meeting for the Converted MTS was held in a venue that was familiar (the Community Board meets there regularly), accessible, proximate to the proposed site, and available on the recommended date/time on a weekday non-holiday evening. Stakeholders were notified of the meeting through a trifold mailer sent three weeks in advance of the meeting (mailed at the beginning of the third week of March 2007). Newspaper display ads were published to notice the EJ informational meeting (Notices) in six community newspapers that serve the Converted MTS EJ community: The Queens Courier and The Courier Sun (Sunday edition), Korea Times and Korea Daily News (both in Korean), The Whitestone TimesLedger, the China World Journal (in Chinese) and a free paper, The Bayside West Newsday Marketeer Pennysaver. A copy of the trifold mailer is provided as **Attachment 3**. Copies of the Notices published in local newspapers and an affidavit of publication are provided as **Attachment 4**.

At the EJ informational meeting, DSNY representatives talked with attendees and provided information on the Converted MTS project, permit applications and NYSDEC permit process. Translation services were stated in the trifold mailer to be provided on request, but were not requested. Translated materials, including the PowerPoint handouts, were made available for the meetings (in Mandarin Chinese and Korean). Requests were to be made by calling the hotline at 1-888-NYC-SWMP or 1-888-692-7967. While no requests were made for translated materials, but a judgment was made to provide them. To accompany the handout provided to each meeting attendee at the start of the meeting, a short PowerPoint presentation was made that was followed by a discussion with attendees. The presentation provided an overview of the project including slides on the proposed layout of the building and waste processing diagrams, as well as detailed information on the permit limits for both commercial and DSNY-managed

waste and the time of day proposed for waste deliveries, a summary of the permits sought and a discussion of the permit process. A copy of the 28-page color PowerPoint presentation for the Converted MTS is provided as **Attachment 5**. DSNY provided a stenographer at the EJ Information Meeting for the Converted MTS. The transcript of the Meeting is provided as **Attachment 6**.

At the Informational Meeting, the attendees raised a number of questions and the DSNY representatives and consultants responded. A summary of the issues raised and responses thereto are provided in **Attachment 7**. One issue flagged for follow-up is discussed in **Attachment 8**. **Attachment 9** provides new information about a second issue that was described as resolved at the meeting.

Stakeholders were also notified of the May 16, 2007 NYSDEC issuance of a Notice of Complete Application for the MTS (NOCA) and draft permits through a postcard send to all 243 MTS stakeholders on May 18, 2007, including the delegation of elected officials for the community: Queens CB 7 District Manager Marilyn Bitterman and Chair Gene Kelty, Borough President Marshall, Council Members Avella, Gennaro, Monserrate and Lu, Assembly Members Young, Lancman, Carrozza, Mayersohn, and Weprin, State Senators Stavisky and Padavan and Members of Congress Ackerman and Crowley. The NOCA and draft permits issuance notification postcard is attached as **Attachment 10**.

A legal notice was also published in the New York Daily News Queens edition, as required on May 18, 2007. The Affidavit of Publication for the NOCA notice is attached as **Attachment 11**. The NOCA and draft permit were placed in the public document repositories and on DSNY's website under the heading "NYSDEC Notice of Complete Application and Draft Permit for the Proposed North Shore MTS" at <http://www.nyc.gov/html/dsny/html/reports/guides.shtml>.

Written and Graphic Information

Written information included a copy of the PowerPoint presentation made at the EJ informational meeting detailing the Converted MTS construction and facility operations overview, the NYSDEC permits and permit process, a trifold mailer and newspaper advertisements/notices and web site announcements. This information was concise, but informative and included contact information for obtaining documents. The trifold mailer and written information (but not the NOCA postcard) also referenced the English/Spanish hotline established to receive comments and respond to questions on the Converted MTSS and permit process (1-888-NYC-SWMP or 1-888-692-7967). All relevant written documents and information were submitted to the NYSDEC for review. Display boards containing graphic and written information were used at the EJ informational meetings to depict the site plan and a rendering of each of the Converted MTSS. Written information was posted in the following locations:

1. Posters were placed in key public areas: the Community Board Office and local public libraries in the Converted MTS EJ project area (a reduced size copy of the poster is provided as **Attachment 12**)
2. The Notice of EJ Informational Meetings was placed in the public repositories, publicized in Community Board mailings, local newspapers, such as the Whitestone/College Point editions of the Queens Courier and the Sun Courier, the China World Journal (in Chinese), the Whitestone TimesLedger, the Korea Times and Korea Daily News (both in Korean) and the free Bayside West Daily News Marketeer Pennysavir (see **Attachment 4**).
3. Notices and Posters were also placed in additional public locations, where available, and requests were be made for the placement of EJ informational meeting information in stakeholder organization newsletters/mailings and for postings at stakeholder organization sites in the Converted MTS project areas. **Attachment 13** provides a list of poster placements.

Public Information Materials

This Report contains the public information materials prepared for the Converted MTS EJ informational meeting and include:

- 7 newspaper ads for the EJ informational meeting (**Attachment 4**),
- A PowerPoint presentation/meeting handout that provides details on the MTS project, NYSDEC permit applications and NYSDEC permit process (**Attachment 5**),
- A trifold mailer that will be sent to stakeholders at least three weeks prior to the EJ informational meeting (**Attachment 3**),
- A poster for public bulletin boards to advertise the EJ informational meeting (**Attachment 12**); and
- The July 2007 stakeholders list for the Converted MTS (**Attachment 2**).

Document Repositories

Two public document repositories (see Report p. 5) were established in May 2004 to provide information and documents related to the Converted MTS permit process and continue to be maintained by DSNY and the repository location staff. The repositories, located in a public library and the Queens Community Board 7 Office in the EJ project area for the Converted MTS, offer a place for community residents to review documents during the day and evening hours on both weekdays and weekends. The PPP, the EJ informational meeting PowerPoint presentation, the trifold mailer sent and the poster placed to notify stakeholders of the EJ Informational Meeting, the NYSDEC final permit applications, the draft permit and the Notice of Complete Application (NOCA) for the Converted MTS, as well as DSNY's comment letter to NYSDEC regarding the NOCA and draft permits are all available at the two repositories for the Converted MTS. The public document repositories also contain the approved SWMP, the Draft and Final EIS, FEIS Findings Statement and related documents.

Once approved, this Report of Completion with Attachments will also be placed in the repositories to document and demonstrate DSNY's compliance with the approved PPP. The locations, contact information and hours of each of the eight document repositories for the Converted MTSS are provided below.

The public document repositories will be maintained by DSNY for a minimum of four months after a final decision on each of the Converted MTS permit applications has been made by NYSDEC. DSNY staff and consultants have visited and will continue to visit the repositories periodically to confirm that the above-listed document copies continue to be available and in good condition.

Project Follow Up

Pursuant to the SWMP, DSNY is required to establish a Community Advisory Group ("CAG") for the Converted MTS. The CAG is required to have at least 10 members - 4 appointed by the Mayor, 3 by the Borough President and 3 by the Council Member from the project area - and will advise the Mayor and other elected officials on the development, construction and operation of the respective Converted MTS. To date, Council Member Avella and Borough President Marshall have appointed three members each; the Mayor is reviewing a list of member candidates, but has not yet finalized his appointments. The first meeting of the CAG for the North Shore Converted MTS is expected to be held in August 2007.

Once the Converted MTS is operational, DSNY will ensure that the facility will be accessible to residents and government officials upon prior written request.

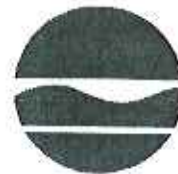

PROPOSED NORTH SHORE CONVERTED MTS FACILITY

QUEENS, NEW YORK

The Proposed North Shore MTS would be located in the College Point section of Queens, New York. The site is bounded by 30th Avenue to the north, 31st Avenue and 122nd Street to the east, and Flushing Bay to the west.

The existing MTS facility is proposed to be demolished and replaced with a new MTS facility that would containerize waste for barge transport to out-of-city disposal locations (the Converted MTS). All waste processing and containerization would be accomplished in an enclosed building. The facility design would include state-of-the-art odor and environmental control systems as well as, on-site ramps and roadways that would provide sufficient space for the queuing of Department of Sanitation collection vehicles on site.

The Proposed Converted MTS would handle waste collected from Queens Community Districts 7 through 14. All processed waste would be placed in sealed, leak-proof containers for barge transport.

To build and operate the proposed **North Shore Converted Marine Transfer Station (MTS)**, the Department of Sanitation (DSNY) seeks the following State permits from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC):

- Permit to build and operate a solid waste management facility (Part 360 Permit);
- Protection of Waters Act and Tidal Wetlands permits to dredge for construction and barge operation, to reconstruct the bulkhead, and to build the king pile wall (designed to protect the adjacent marina) (Part 608 and 661 Permits); and
- State Facility Air minor source permit to regulate on-site equipment use (Part 201 permit).

The proposed MTS is one of four Converted MTSs to be built and operated by DSNY as part of the City's approved Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) long-term waste export system. The other three Converted MTSs are: Hamilton Avenue Converted MTS in Sunset Park, Brooklyn; East 91st Street Converted MTS in Manhattan; and Southwest Brooklyn Converted MTS.

DSNY has elected to treat all four proposed Converted MTS communities as Environmental Justice (EJ) communities for NYSDEC permitting purposes. This means that DSNY has developed a Public Participation Plan that focuses on public outreach and will hold an EJ Informational Meeting in each MTS host community to discuss the project, the State permit applications, and the NYSDEC permitting process.

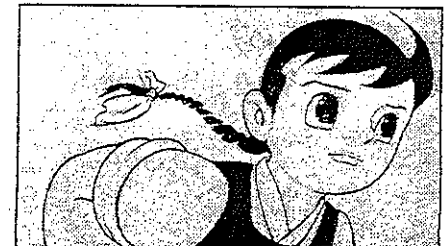

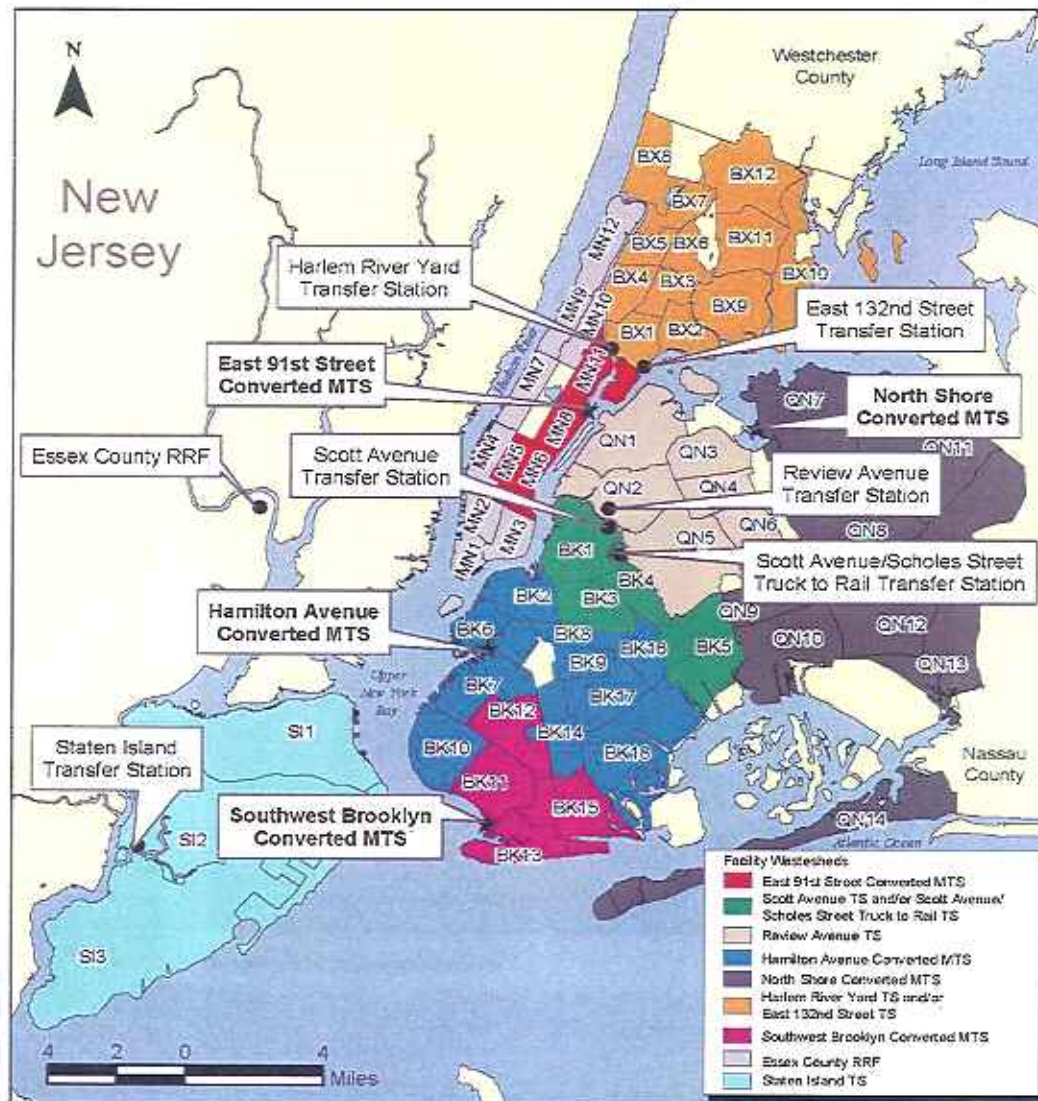

Site Plan

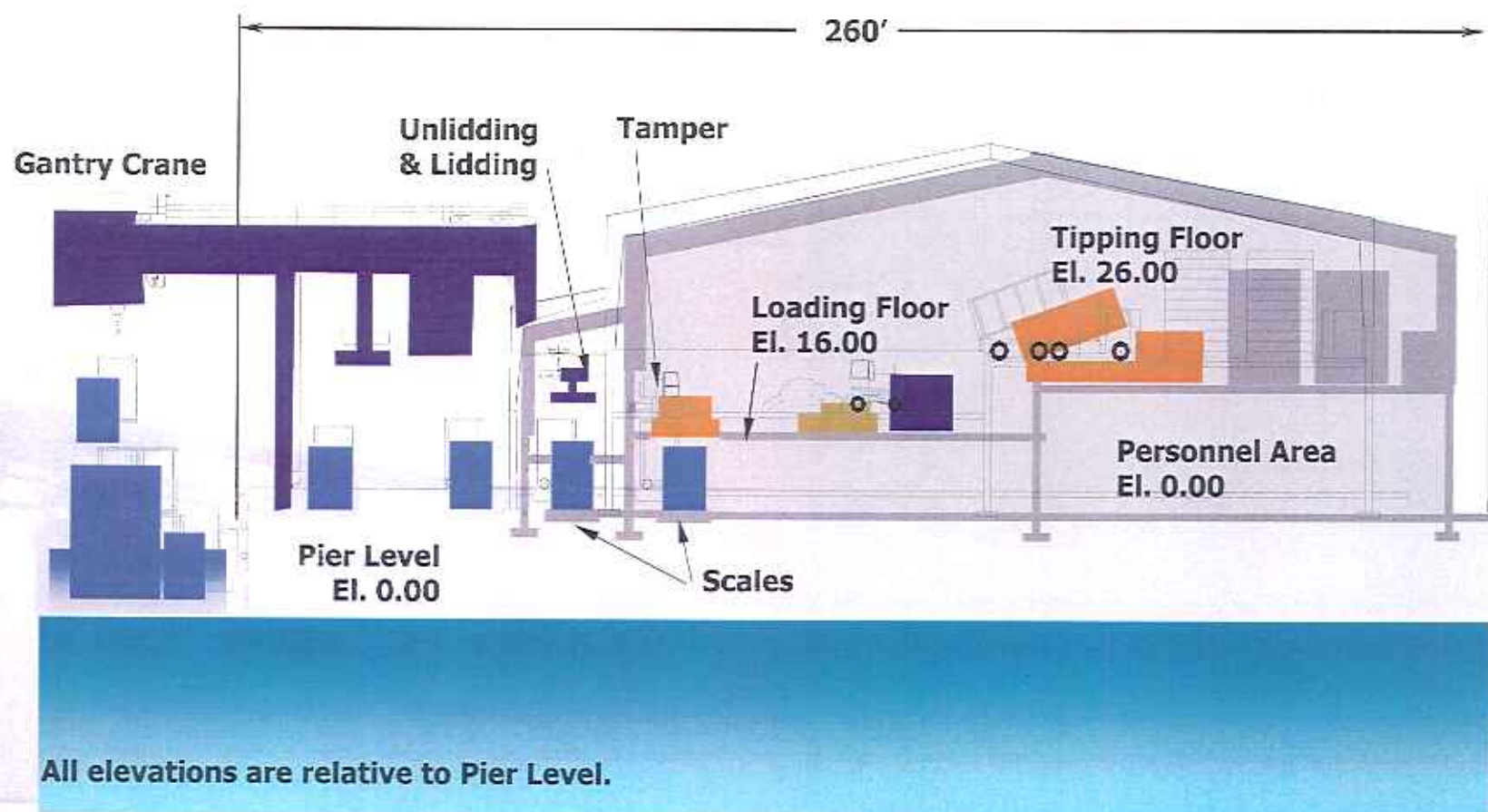

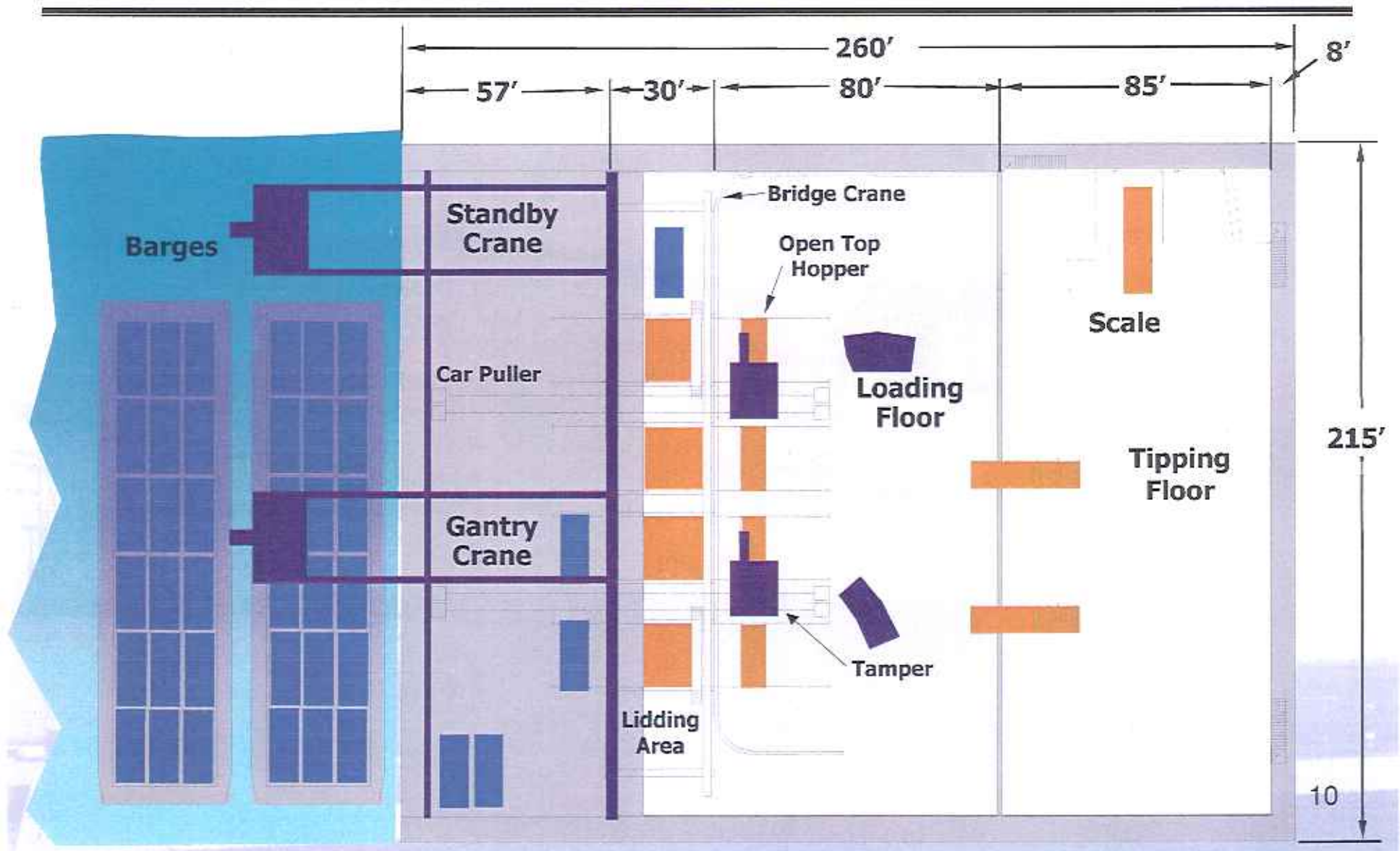
Typical Proposed MTS Cross Section

- All waste processed in enclosed building that maintains negative air pressure to prevent escape of odors.
- Treatment system neutralizes (not masks) odor in building exhaust air.
- All waste leaves MTS in sealed, leak-proof containers.
- FEIS found no significant adverse impacts from MTS construction or operation.

Acceptance of Commercial Waste

- To avoid noise impacts, Commercial Waste would be limited to 1,000 tons (91 trucks) over the 12-hour, 8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. shift.



Proposed MTS Permit Status

- DSNY has submitted Permit Applications to NYSDEC for:
 - Part 360, Solid Waste Facility Permit;
 - Part 608/681 Marine Permits (construction in public waters/protection of public waters) and Section 401 Water Quality Certification; and
 - Part 201 State Facility Air Permit (minor source).

Part 360 Solid Waste Facility Permit

- Required to construct and operate the proposed MTS.
- The Engineering Report in the Permit Application defines the Permit requirements.
- The draft permit imposes conditions on construction and operation consistent with Part 360 regulations.

Part 608/661 Marine Permits and Section 401 Water Quality Certification

Required for:

- In-water construction to remove existing access ramp/platform, construction of new ramp and platform, barge fendering, rip rap replacement and a retaining wall (to protect a Con Edison transformer building to be located south of the access ramp);
- In-water filling to protect the Con Edison building; and
- Dredging proposed using protective environmental method to enable barge transport operations.

Part 201: State Facility Air Permit

- This permit establishes the facility as a minor source of air emissions. Emissions result from equipment used at the proposed MTS.

SWMP Long Term Export Goals

- End use of long-haul trucks for waste transport.
- Stabilize waste disposal costs.
- More fairly site waste transfer facilities among the City's boroughs.
- Containerize waste to achieve flexible transport and disposal options.

SWMP Long Term Export Initiatives

- Use private transfer stations to rail containerized waste from the Bronx, North Brooklyn and part of Queens.
- Open (December 2006) the Staten Island TS for transport/disposal of that borough's containerized waste.
- Enter into a long-term agreement for disposal of part of Manhattan's waste at the Essex County Resource Recovery Facility in Newark, NJ.
- Move forward to obtain permits to construct the East 91st Street, North Shore, Hamilton Avenue and Southwest Brooklyn Converted MTSs.

SWMP Recycling Goals

- Stabilize long-term costs of the Curbside Program.
- Meet a 25% recycling goal for DSNY Curbside Program.
- Meet a 35% recycling goal for entire DSNY-managed Waste stream.

SWMP Recycling Initiatives

- Enter into a 20-year contract for metal, glass and plastic (MGP) at a processing facility to be built at the South Brooklyn Marine Terminal.
- Enhance composting and waste prevention programs.
- Develop an electronics recycling program.
- Establish a recycling education and acceptance facility for the Curbside Program, potentially at the Gansevoort Peninsula or at an alternative Manhattan site.

Queens Recycling
