SIR—There were 584 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, December 2, 1882, which is an increase of 31, ascompared with the number reported the preceding week, and 80 less than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1881. The actual mortality for the week ending November 25, 1882, was 573, which is 43.2 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 23.02 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,294,464.

Alderman Kirk in chair. Roll called, and quorum being present, the minutes of last meeting were read and, on motion, approved.

The Chair announced that he had been served with a writ of mandamus, returnable this day, 10.30 o'clock A. M., before Judge Donohue, on the relation of John H. Carl against August Fleishbein, candidate for Alderman in Tenth Assembly District.

Alderman Hall moved that the Inspectors be sent for and the return on County Clerk in Sixth Election, Twenty-second Assembly District, be sent to Committee on Corrected Returns. Which was carried.

The Committee on Protests then presented the following report, which was read:
The Committee on Protests, to whom were referred the annexed protests of James Oliver, John H. Carl, John Gillen, G. C. Kirschmann, Charles S. Bliss, and Henry L. Sprague, respectfully

REPORT:

That your committee are convinced and have been so from their appointment, that the duties expected of them were unmistakably beyond their power to perform. The law clearly defines the powers and duties of the Board of County Canvassers and confines them simply to a comparison and powers and duties of the Board of County Canvassers and confines them simply to a comparison and computation of the returns or statements from the several election districts, and a declaration of the result. Where errors or discrepancies occur in any of the statements, or irregularities even in the manner of conducting the election at the polling places, the County Canvassers are powerless to do anything other than return the statements to the District Inspectors to correct the errors or discrepancies. Irregularities, even when they affect the result of the voting, can only be remedied by the parties aggrieved in the courts, or in cases affecting candidates for legislative offices, in the bodies to which they claim to have been elected. The District Inspectors alone are responsible.

It being clear that your Honorable Body does not possess the power to investigate any of the allegations contained in the several protests presented, it therefore necessarily and logically follows that you could not delegate to a committee a power not possessed by you; even the eligibility of

you could not delegate to a committee a power not possessed by you; even the eligibility of candidates cannot be determined by your Honorable Body; this inability arises not from positive prohibition but from lack of power or authority. The Legislature of this State never conferred either upon Boards of County Canvassers.

Your committee therefore ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the several

protests and other papers herewith accompanying.

ROBERT HALL, FREDERICK FINCK, On MICHAEL DUFFY, Protests. Committee

Alderman Levy moved that the report of the committee be received, printed and placed on

Alderman Levy moved that the report of the committee be received, printed and placed on file, with accompanying protests.

Alderman Waite moved as an amendment that the matter lie over until the full Board be present, and demanded the ayes and nays. Alderman Finck, McClave, McLean, Waite and Wells voting in the affirmative, and Aldermen Brady, Duffy, Hall, Kirk, Levy, McAvoy and O'Neil in the negative, the amendment was lost.

Alderman McClave moved as a further amendment that the report of the committee be amended by adding the words "that the Inspectors of the Third Election, Tenth Assembly District, appeared before the Committee and certified that the Inspectors' return was correct," and demanded the ayes and nays. Aldermen Finck, Fleishbein, McClave, McLean, Waite and Wells voting in the affirmative, and Aldermen Brady, Duffy, Hall, Kirk, Levy, McAvoy and O'Neil voting in the negative, the amendment was lost.

The question now recurred on the original motion, and Aldermen Brady, Duffy, Hall, Kirk, Levy, Martin, McAvoy, O'Neil and Strack voting in the affirmative, and Aldermen Finck, Fleishbein, Hawes, McClave, McLean, Waite and Wells in the negative, the motion was carried.

The Committee on Corrected Returns reported that the Inspectors of Election in the Fourteenth Election, Thirteenth Assembly District, had appeared before the committee, were examined and retired for consultation, but were unable to agree as to the vote for Assembly in that District.

The report of the committee was received and adopted.

On motion of Alderman McAvoy, the Board took a recess until Friday, 24th instant, 3.30 o'clock P. M.

Roll called, and a quorum being present, the minutes of last meeting were read and, on motion, approved.

The Chairman announced that he had been informed that the writ of mandamus in Carl vs.

Fleishbein was quashed.

Alderman McClave moved that the canvass sheets for Alderman in the Eighth Election District, Seventeenth Assembly District, be corrected so as to read 49 votes for John Fitzpatrick, instead of 59, as recorded.

Which was carried.

Alderman McClave moved that the canvass sheets for Alderman, Twenty-first Election District, Seventeenth Assembly District, be corrected so as to read 23 votes for John Fitzpatrick, instead of 33 votes, as recorded.

Alderman McClave moved that the canvass sheets and official statement of votes cast be corrected so as to read 1,181 votes cast for John Fitzpatrick for Alderman, Seventeenth Assembly District, instead of 1,201 votes, as recorded.

Which was carried. Alderman Strack moved that the word "defective" in the official statement of votes cast for

Alderman, Tenth Assembly District, be stricken out and the statement corrected so as to read, "of which George Wallheimer received 77 votes."

The Clerk then proceeded with the reading of the official statement of votes cast at general election held in New York City on the 7th day of November, 1882.

Alderman Hawes moved that the statement and declaration of votes cast in the Eleventh

Assembly District be amended so that the votes cast for John C. O'Connor for Alderman be credited to John C. O'Connor, Jr. Which was carried.

The reading of the official statement being concluded, the Clerk proceeded with the reading of the official declaration

The reading of the official declaration being concluded, the minutes of meeting were read and, on motion, approved.

There being no further business, the Board of County Canvassers, on motion of Alderman Wells, adjourned sine die
