
Background on Class Size Calculations

- The New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE) reports on class size twice a year with a preliminary report in November and an updated report in February. This deck reflects the updated report.
- Schools typically update their schedules through the end of each term. Historically, early data analysis includes long-term absences, incomplete scheduling data, and other characteristics that are updated by schools in the February report.
- For grades K-8, average class size is calculated by dividing the number of students as of the audited register date, or "seats filled", by the number of sections as determined by each student's official class (e.g. homeroom/advisory) from the Automate the Schools (ATS) system.
- For grades 6-12, average class size is calculated by the average number of students as of the audited register date in each section of core courses (English, Math, Science and Social Studies) from the STARS system.
- Class size comparisons are made to 2019-20, rather than 2020-21 because during remote and blended learning, new guidance was given to schools to assign students to different official classes depending on their blended/remote cohorts. How schools implemented and documented this change varied, therefore 20-21 class size data may not reflect true class size.



Citywide Class Size Averages by School Type Updated

Across all grades in 2021-22, the average class size is 24.4 students per class. There was 1.7 decrease from 2019-20. Class size comparisons below are made to 2019-20, rather than 2020-21 because during remote and blended learning, new guidance was given to schools to assign students to different official classes depending on their blended/remote cohorts. How schools implemented and documented this change varied, therefore 20-21 class size data may not reflect true class size.






Overall class size averages include general education, Integrated Co-Teaching (ICT), G&T and Accelerated classes. The secondary school category includes four K-12 schools.

Pupil-to-Teacher Ratio by School Type Updated

Across all grades in 2021-22, the preliminary PTR was 12.5. There was a 1.4 decrease from 2019-20.








Schools were categorized into ES, MS and HS based on the highest grade served. The calculation is based on unrounded values.

2021-22 Average Class Size by Program Type *Updated*






ICT stands for Integrated Co-Teaching. Gifted and Talented classes are identified as classes in grades K-5 where students have been placed through NYCDOE's G&T screening process. Middle school accelerated courses are high school credit-bearing courses offered to middle school students. Official class data comes from ATS and core courses come from STARS. 5 Combined ICT and G&T classes are included as ICT classes. Combined ICT and Accelerated classes are also included as ICT classes.
