Wickersham, under date of 9th September, a request that the Board consent to a continuing deposit of securities in lieu of a continuing bond or cash under contract for the Brooklyn-Manhattan Rapid Transit Railroad.

The following resolution was thereupon moved:

Resolved, That the President and the Secretary be, and they hereby are, authorized in the name and under the seal of the Board, to execute with the Interborough Rapid Transit Company and the Rapid Transit Subway Construction Company, a contract substantially in the form following:

This agreement made this day of September, 1902, between Interborough Rapid Transit Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York (hereinafter called "Interborough Company"), party of the first part, Rapid Transit Subway Construction Company, a corporation likewise organized and existing (hereinafter called the "Construction Company") party of the second part, and The City of New York (hereinafter called the "City"), acting by its Board of Rapid Transit Railroad Commissioners, party of the third part, witnesseth:

Whereas, John B. McDonald heretofore entered into a contract with The City of New York, bearing date the 21st day of February, 1900, for the construction, equipment and operation of a rapid transit railroad in The City of New York, now called the Manhattan-Bronx Rapid Transit Railroad, which contract was thereafter modified by certain agreements supplemental thereto and amendatory thereof; and

Whereas, Subsequently the said John B. McDonald duly assigned to the Interborough Company so much of said contract as provided for the maintenance and operation of the railway therein described and the Interborough Company is the owner of the leasehold interest in such railroad for the period of the lease included in the said contract of 21st February, 1900; and

Whereas, The Construction Company has entered into a contract with The City of New York for the construction, equipment and operation of a rapid transit railroad called the Brooklyn-Manhattan Rapid Transit Railroad, which will connect with the said Manhattan-Bronx Rapid Transit Railroad, at or near the City Hall, in the Borough of Manhattan, and will thence extend to a point at or near South Ferry, in the said Borough, and thence under the East River into and in the Borough of Brooklyn, upon certain routes described in the said contract, which contract contains a lease of the said Brooklyn-Manhattan Rapid Transit Railroad to the Construction Company, for the period of thirty-five years from the date of the completion of the said railroad, together with a right to a renewal of the said lease for a further term of twenty-five years; and

Whereas, It is provided in the said contract last mentioned and in the proposal made by the Construction Company to the said City upon the competition for the said contract as part of the consideration to the said City for the making of the said contract with the Construction Company, that this present passenger traffic agreement should be entered into between the parties hereto,—

Now, therefore, it is agreed as follows:
 First—That during the said term of thirty-five years of the lease included in the said contract between the said City and the said Construction Company, and the term of any and every renewal thereof, the Interborough Company will provide for every passenger over the said Brooklyn-Manhattan Rapid Transit Railroad or any part thereof, who shall desire the same, transportation over all lines owned or leased by the Interborough Company, without change of cars, and for a single fare not exceeding five cents for one continuous trip, but subject to the provisions of the next article.

Second—That in case the Construction Company shall enter into an agreement with any railroad company owning a line connecting with any line of the Construction Company whereby the Construction Company shall agree to carry each passenger received from or to be delivered to such connecting line over the lines of such Construction Company without change of cars for a single fare of which, under the said agreement, the Construction Company shall receive less than five cents, then and in such case the Interborough Company will carry such passenger without change of cars and without further charge to the passenger and upon a continuous trip upon the lines of its railroad, but not to a point north of Fifty-ninth street, in the Borough of Manhattan.

In Witness Whereof, the parties of the first and second parts have caused these presents to be executed by their proper officers under their respective corporate seals, and The City of New York has caused these presents to be executed by its Board of Rapid Transit Railroad Commissioners, executing the same by the President and Secretary of the said Board under the seal of the said Board, the day and year aforesaid.

Counsel reported that since the previous meeting of the Board three suits had been brought to enjoin the construction of the railroad along Park avenue; that in the action brought by Charles T. Barney in the Supreme Court, on June 17, Justice Giegerich had refused to grant the injunction asked by Mr. Barney; that in a suit brought in the United States Circuit Court by Mrs. Arabella D. Huntington, Judge Lacombe had granted a temporary order restraining the construction of the railroad in front of her premises, but that upon the argument Judge Lacombe had dissolved the order staying the construction on the ground that the Court was without jurisdiction, and at the same time had dissolved a similar order which he had granted in a similar suit brought in the United States Circuit Court by Mr. Barney; that Mrs. Huntington had also brought a taxpayer's action in the Supreme Court similar to the one brought by Mr. Barney.

Counsel reported on the necessity of having an insurance of the title of the property at Forty-second street and Park avenue. The following resolution was moved:

Resolved, That the counsel be authorized to contract with the Lawyers' Title Insurance Company for the insurance of the title of the property at Park avenue and Forty-second street, easements of which are granted to the City by the Subway Realty Company, such insurance not to cost more than \$175.

Whereas, Upon each map or plan so made there has, by authority of the Board, been placed a memorandum as part thereof, clearly indicating the particular estate or estates, rights, terms, privileges, franchises or easements to be acquired or extinguished for the purposes of such construction and operation in relation to such parcel of property, such memorandum being substantially in the form following, to wit:

"Board of Rapid Transit Railroad Commissioners for The City of New York. Memorandum: Indicating the particular estate, rights and easements to be acquired for the purposes of the construction and operation of the Rapid Transit Railroad in relation to the piece or parcel of property shown upon this map. August 28, 1902. A permanent and perpetual underground right, easement and right of way for the construction, operation and maintenance in perpetuity of a Rapid Transit Railroad

McDonald, bearing the same date; the subway or subways for such railroad to be constructed substantially as shown upon the plan above, the same being marked 'Rapid Transit Commission, Chief Engineer's Office, Drawing No. 750, dated August 28, 1902.' The base of rail in subway to be not more than twenty-one (21) feet nine (9) inches below the established grade of Forty-second street at its intersection with Broadway, such rights and easements including the right to permanently and perpetually maintain and operate a railroad through said subway so to be constructed in accordance with the provisions of chapter 4 of the Laws of 1891, and its amendments and the provisions for the operations of said railroad lawfully made pursuant thereto, and the right at reasonable times and in reasonable manner to enter upon said premises, so far as may be necessary, for the construction, maintenance and operation of such railroad. The premises to be subject to such permanent and perpetual underground right, easement and right of way are described as follows: Beginning at the corner formed by the intersection of the easterly line of Broadway and the northerly line of Forty-second street, and running thence easterly along the northerly line of Forty-second street seventy-seven (77) feet; thence in a general northwesterly direction along a curved line drawn with a radius of four hundred (400) feet and with its convexity toward the said place of beginning, to a point on the easterly side of Broadway which is forty-six (46) feet and five (5) inches northerly, measured along the said easterly side of Broadway, from the northerly line of Forty-second street, and thence southerly along the said easterly side of Broadway to the place of beginning.

"Adopted and approved by said Board the 11th day of September, 1902."

Now, therefore, it is

Resolved, That the said maps and plans so made and prepared, and the said memorandum, be and the same hereby are approved and adopted; that a certificate of such approval and adoption, and of the approval and adoption of the said memorandum, be written upon each of the said maps or plans and signed by the members of the said Board of Rapid Transit Railroad Commissioners, and that one copy thereof, including such memorandum, shall be filed in the Chief Executive Department of The City of New York having principal charge of the streets, there to remain as a public record, and that the other two of the said maps or plans and memoranda be forthwith transmitted to the Counsel to the Corporation with a copy of this resolution, and the direction of this Board to take legal proceedings to acquire for The City of New York the said permanent and perpetual underground right, easement and right of way and other rights as aforesaid.

The Comptroller suggested that there should be a formal agreement with the Astor estate, owner of above property, as to just what must be done by the City, etc., such agreement to be made before the condemnation proceedings begin.

The Mayor inquired as to the progress of the work on Elm street. The Chief Engineer reported that the northern portion was ready for repavement.

Counsel, Mr. Boardman, reported on progress of work of obtaining consents of property owners for Lenox avenue extension. He said that the Metropolitan Street Railway Company, which owns a majority of the property, would consent, provided an agreement could be made that nothing would be done to interfere with the enjoyment by that company of its property.

The Chief Engineer reported progress in preparation of the figures asked by the Comptroller as to extra work.

The following letter of the Chief Engineer as to track was read:

Hon. A. E. ORR, President, Rapid Transit Board:

MY DEAR SIR—On April 16 the General Contractor, Mr. John B. McDonald, addressed you a letter asking officially for the permission of the Board to make a change in the track from that prescribed by the specifications. The plans and specifications describe the track as consisting of rails laid on wooden stringers resting directly upon concrete and additionally secured by steel guard rails. For the reason set forth by the contractor, he prefers to lay a track of the more ordinary type, consisting of rails spiked to an ordinary cross tie resting on a bed of ballast placed between the tie and the foundation concrete. Since the writing of that letter the contractor and his engineers have been in conference with me in regard to the details of the track. In my judgment I believe that a form of track on the lines as shown by the contract drawings would, in subway work, be superior to a ballasted track. I believe it would furnish a track with a better line and surface, one making less noise and furnishing the opportunity for the whole of the roadbed to be at all times inspected and kept clean. I appreciate the fact, however, that such a form of track is somewhat experimental, while on the other hand the track suggested by the contractor is one whose good points have been proved by many years of experience.

Inasmuch as the contractor is responsible for the operation of this road, and as the track proposed by him will provide satisfactory results, I am willing to subordinate my own belief as to what would probably provide better results and suggest to the Commission that the request of the contractor be granted.

INCREASES IN SALARY FOR ASSISTANT ENGINEERS.

Hon. A. E. ORR, President, Rapid Transit Board:

MY DEAR SIR—I hand you herewith a copy of a communication which I have received from the Division Engineers, which I think merits the attention of the Board.

Several requests have been made at different times by the junior members of the staff for increases in salary. These applications, when they have come to me, I have declined to lay them before the Board, and where they have gone before the Board I have advised against their favorable consideration. The junior members of the Board are already paid quite as well as similar positions are paid elsewhere and, moreover, have reasonable expectation of promotion.

In the cases of the men above junior grade the same is not true. This letter

points out that the senior members of the higher grades have charge of work of great value entailing great personal responsibility. The letter of the Engineers furthermore points out that men in other departments with less responsibility are getting considerably higher pay. Chances for promotion in the higher grades have, in our experience, been absolutely nil, as none of the men above the grade of Assistant Engineer have resigned or died since the work began. Some of our Assistant Engineers have resigned positions with us to accept positions in other departments of the City at higher pay with less responsibility; others have declined such offers, preferring to stay with the Commission, at least until their particular work was finished. This letter of the Engineers I therefore hand you with the recommendation on my part that the request for the increases therein outlined be granted. I have examined our payrolls and find that there are four Principal Assistant Engineers who are now receiving \$733.32 per month, who under the proposed schedule will receive together \$1,000 per month, or an increase of \$266.88. In like manner there are twenty Assistant Engineers of Grade C who now receive jointly \$3,000 per month but who would receive \$3,500 per month, or an increase of \$500; the total increased expense therefore by the proposed schedule would be \$766.68 per month, and for which twenty-four men would receive promotions to which they are fairly entitled both by the work that they have done, the services that they have rendered, the responsibility that they assume and by a comparison with similar men in other City departments.

Mr. WM. BARCLAY PARSONS, Chief Engineer:

SIR—The Division Engineers have been requested by the Senior Assistant Engineers and Assistant Engineers, Grade "C," of their various divisions to present to you an application for an increase in their present salaries. In making this request the Assistant Engineers have set forth certain reasons which seem to justify such an application, the most important of which are in substance as follows:

"The positions call for the exercise of not only a high grade of professional ability, but require unusual tact and judgment in dealing with the diverse interests of the several contractors. Assistant Engineers, Grade 'C,' at a salary of \$1,800 per annum, are in responsible charge of construction work, worth in the neighborhood of \$2,000,000, with monthly estimates of \$70,000 or more. The Senior Assistant Engineers, at \$2,200 per annum, have a similar responsibility for work worth \$7,000,000, with monthly estimates of approximately \$150,000. The amount of detail involved and the responsibility devolving on the Engineers in charge is such as to require from two to four hours' additional work each day from these men.

"A comparison of the above salaries with those paid in other municipal departments of the City will show that the Rapid Transit men are receiving considerably less money for professional services of a higher and more exacting nature, the assumption of greater responsibility, the supervision of the expenditure of much larger sums and for longer hours of service.

"An examination of the 'City Record' will show that the Bridge Department has twenty-three Assistant Engineers receiving \$2,000 or more, and twelve over \$2,500.

"The Dock Department has six Assistant Engineers receiving \$2,400 or more, the Sewer Department thirty-two Assistant Engineers at \$2,100 or more, the Water Department nine Assistant Engineers at \$2,200 or more, etc.

"It is a fact that each Assistant Engineer, Grade 'C,' who is in charge of a section has under him several Assistant Engineers, Grade 'A' and 'B,' who, though they are deserving young men and are uniformly of a high class, yet are not charged with the responsibility to which the Engineers, Grade 'C,' or Senior Assistants, are subjected, and who have before them always the opportunity and chance of securing promotion to the grade above. The difference in pay between the Grade 'C' man with the responsibility and the Grade 'B' man under him with little or no responsibility is now only \$300 a year. This does not seem to be a sufficient extra remuneration for the differences of services rendered.

"Many of the Engineers have been in the service of the City for a great number of years without adequate recognition. Two of the Senior Assistant Engineers have been in the municipal service for eighteen years, first upon the Aqueduct and since upon Divisions 2 and 3."

The Division Engineers, in transmitting to you this application, wish to heartily endorse it and the reasons above stated. We feel fortunate in the high personal and professional character of the responsible assistants with whom we are called upon to work. We would respectfully call attention to the additional fact that we have already lost a number of valuable assistants by reason of their having accepted the offer of higher salaries in other city departments, and that we have at present several men who have declined such offers merely because of professional pride in their present assignment and wish to complete their section of the subway. We do not think it just or expedient, however, to count upon such self-sacrifice too often or too long. There are several Assistant Engineers who are at present considering such offers, and who feel that in justice to themselves that they will be obliged to accept if the present scale of salaries remains unchanged.

The amount involved in the immediate future is less than \$10,000 per annum.

We therefore respectfully recommend to you that the salary of Senior Assistant Engineers upon your staff be placed at \$2,700 per annum. That the salary of Assistant Engineers, Grade "C," at present in charge of sections, be made \$2,100, and that all other Assistant Engineers, Grade "C," receive \$1,800 per year upon appointment to that grade, and their salaries shall, upon recommendation of their Division Engineers, be increased at the rate of \$100 per annum for each year served until their yearly salaries shall be \$2,100.

DEAR SIR—We think it the duty of people who live on the line of your works, or who own land near your works, to draw your attention promptly to any discomfort suffered by them that you can prevent.

On the other hand, where the work is carried on with special consideration for our comfort, we do not wish to seem to disregard what is done for us.

We write to say that we, the undersigned, representing the owners of several hundred lots between One Hundred and Fortieth and One Hundred and Sixtieth

streets, along the line of your work on Broadway, have observed with great pleasure the diligence with which the work is carried on in our neighborhood and the great pains that you and the contractor and sub-contractor are taking to reduce as much as possible the temporary inconvenience that we, like all other people in New York, must suffer while so much is being done in the streets.

We are grateful for the thoughtfulness and practical sense and judgment shown by the Rapid Transit Commission in matters which have fallen under our personal observation, and we shall be glad if you will file this letter as a testimonial from three or four citizens who are at least disinterested, to the effect that they think the laborious work which you superintend has been conducted in a way that should be a model to everybody who has the control of any City affairs.

We have heard some complaint by other people because while your work is in progress it has been found necessary to run locomotives in some streets in front of private houses. Almost everything is true that is said against the use of locomotives in city streets; but we are delighted to have you use any such means to hasten your work, and are glad to sacrifice a little of our streets for a short time so as to have them the sooner restored to us. We are pleased to see that your contractors use two locomotives, though we would rather see them using six.

President Orr reported that the Committee of the Board appointed to confer with the Board of Aldermen and representatives of the Pennsylvania, New York and Long Island Railroad Company had held two meetings, one on 5th August, 1902, and the other on 3d September; that certain suggestions by the Aldermen had been agreed upon as modifications of the proposed franchise; and that another conference was to be held on the 17th on the suggestion to insert in the contract a clause as to the prevailing rate of wages and the Eight-hour Law.

President Orr reported that there had been some correspondence with the Board of Health on the sanitary condition of the subway excavation. The Chief Engineer reported that he had explained to Commissioner Lederle, of the Health Department, that the trouble was due to the carelessness of people in throwing refuse into the excavation. He said he had consented to the appointment by the Health Department of two Inspectors to keep watch of these matters.

President Orr reported that he had forwarded to the Mayor correspondence on the Hall of Records matter, as follows:

IN RE OLD HALL OF RECORDS BUILDING.

Hon. A. E. ORR, President, Rapid Transit Board:

MY DEAR SIR—Some time since I was directed by you to write a letter setting forth the reasons that would seem to demand the removal of the present Hall of Records as soon as the records themselves can be transferred to a safe place. I have delayed complying with these instructions owing to the fact that also under your directions I was studying additional terminal arrangements for the Brooklyn Bridge, as I at once recognized that such terminal arrangements would have a bearing upon the removal of the Hall of Records, as well as the station plans of the Rapid Transit Subway.

There are three reasons, in my judgment, why the Hall of Records should be removed:

First—The territory in the neighborhood of the Hall of Records is now one of the most congested portions of The City of New York. This congestion is about to be increased by the construction of the rapid transit station. The stairways descending to the western half of the station and also by means of a passageway to the eastern half of the station, are of necessity located directly alongside of the old building.

When this station was first designed and subsequently reconsidered under the two previous municipal administrations it was represented by the City officials that

it was their purpose to remove the old building as soon as the new building could be completed, and therefore I was left free to design the station according to the most convenient plan. Unless the building is removed the streams of travel going to and passing from the rapid transit station will be deflected by the present building and therefore inconvenienced. The experience with the present bridge shows most clearly that at the point of entering or leaving the station passageways should be as free and clear as possible, or otherwise serious congestion results. In addition, however, to the traffic of the present bridge and the traffic that will soon be created by the subway, it now appears almost certain that there will be additional traffic brought to this point by a subway connecting with the Williamsburg Bridge, and possibly by a very largely increased station for the Manhattan Elevated Railway Company in order to accommodate trains on the Second avenue system, and the traffic to be brought by that line from Long Island over the Blackwell's Island Bridge, now under course of construction. Plans for this work have been tentatively approved by the Board and by the City officials. When all this traffic comes into existence the avenues leading to the junction of Park row and Centre street must be made as free and clear as it is possible to make them. This freedom cannot be given as long as the Hall of Records is permitted to stand.

Second—Ordinarily it is not a very difficult matter to underpin a building and make an excavation beneath it. In this case, however, the building is old and so badly built that an attempt to excavate beneath it for the construction of the subway would probably result in the destruction of the building. Under date of June 24 the Hon. Perez M. Stewart, Superintendent of Buildings, Borough of Manhattan, addressed to you, as President of the Board, an official letter, in which he states:

"I respectfully report that I have re-examined the building and premises, known as Hall of Records, * * * and would like to call your attention to the construction of building, as from information I received on the premises from Engineer in charge of work, that an attempt would be made to underpin same, which in my opinion would be a very difficult undertaking."

After describing the construction of the building, Mr. Stewart continues: "Owing to load concentrated upon foundation piers and the peculiar construction of foundation, I do not think it would be advisable to allow any attempt to underpin building, as same, in my opinion, cannot be properly secured, and would recommend that building be taken down to ground."

As these recommendations were made by Mr. Stewart on the result of his own examination, independent of any action by the Rapid Transit Board, there is nothing to be added except to report that I agree with Mr. Stewart.

Third—Aesthetic consideration. There has been some demand that the building should be retained on account of its associations. I believe, however, that the only part of the building which is really old is the basement, which originally constituted the foundation of another building. This basement would be removed by the construction of the subway. The building itself has no historical association, is not a very antique building, and has been rebuilt and reconstructed at a comparatively recent date.

Aesthetic considerations therefore demand, not that the building be retained, but that it be removed, as well as the other small buildings in the City Hall Park, in order that the Park itself may be restored as nearly as possible to its existing conditions, and permit the City Hall, of which the people of the City are so justly proud, to be brought in full view from all sides. With the great growth of high buildings in the lower part of the City, the small amount of park space should be preserved to the greatest extent possible.

I am informed by the contractor of the new Hall of Records that it will very shortly be possible to remove the records from the present building into the new one.

Unless some unforeseen accident occurs, it is probable that the operation of the subway will begin at the close of next year. In order that the very important station at the Brooklyn Bridge may be completed in time, we should be advised at as early a date as possible as to the action of the municipal authorities in regard to the taking down of the old building.

No. 22. PAVING THE ROADWAY OF EAST ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FIRST STREET WITH ASPHALT PAVEMENT ON A CONCRETE FOUNDATION, FROM PARK AVENUE TO WASHINGTON AVENUE, AND WITH SHEET ASPHALT ON A CONCRETE FOUNDATION, FROM WASHINGTON AVENUE TO CROTONA PARK.

The Engineer's estimate of the work is as follows, viz.:
2,475 square yards of sheet asphalt pavement, including binder course.
615 cubic yards of concrete.
2,150 linear feet of old curbstone, rejointed and reset.
1,030 square yards of asphalt block pavement.
The amount of security required is five thousand dollars (\$5,000).
The time allowed to complete the whole work is forty (40) working days.

No. 23. PAVING WITH GRANITE BLOCK PAVEMENT ON A CONCRETE FOUNDATION THE ROADWAY OF WESTCHESTER AVENUE, FROM PROSPECT AVENUE TO SOUTHERN BOULEVARD.

The Engineer's estimate of the work is as follows, viz.:
175 linear feet of new curbstone.
925 square feet of new bridgestone.
900 square feet of new flagging furnished and laid.
20,000 square yards of new granite block pavement on a concrete foundation laid with paving cement joints.
3,930 cubic yards of concrete in place.
2 double road boxes complete.
900 square feet new bridgestones and about 180 linear feet of new curbstones, cost to be included in price bid for new pavement.
The amount of security required is twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).
The time allowed to complete the whole work is seventy-five (75) working days.

No. 24. PAVING WITH GRANITE BLOCK PAVEMENT ON A SAND FOUNDATION, THE ROADWAY OF TREMONT AVENUE TO BOSTON ROAD.

The Engineer's estimate of the work is as follows, viz.:
9,250 linear feet of old curbstone rejointed and reset.
2,000 square feet of new bridgestone.
7,800 square feet of old bridgestone rejointed and relaid.
23,800 square yards of new granite block pavement on a sand foundation laid with sand joints.
100 square yards of old stone block pavement, relaid in approaches.
36,000 square feet of old flagging relaid.
100 cubic yards of dry rubble masonry for bringing retaining walls to proper grade.
13 receiving basins to be rebuilt in accordance with specifications in use in Bureau of Sewers, Bronx.
The amount of security required is twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000).
The time allowed to complete the whole work is one hundred and twenty-five (125) working days.

No. 25. CONSTRUCTING GUTTERS IN EAST ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THIRD STREET, FROM ARTHUR AVENUE TO SOUTHERN BOULEVARD.

The Engineer's estimate of the work is as follows, viz.:
7,205 square yards of macadam pavement on Telford foundation.
The amount of security required is three thousand dollars (\$3,000).
The time allowed to complete the whole work is seventy-five (75) working days.
