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DEPARTMENT OF BUILDINGS.

IN BOARD OF BUILDINGS, June 6, 1900.

Present—Commissioners Brady, Guilfoyle and Campbell.

The minutes of the meeting of May 23, 1900, were read, and on motion approved.

Petitions were submitted for approval as follows:

Plan 135, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the upper 12-inch walls to be erected 52 feet high; also to allow private fire and air hall partitions to rest on each tier of wooden floor beams, as shown on plans and as stated in petition; No. 510 East Thirtieth street, 300 feet east of Broadway. Petitioner, Henri Foushman. Approved.

Plan 413, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow building to be built with one tier of fireproof beams, as shown on plans and as stated in petition; No. 510 East Thirtieth street. Petitioners, Schaeffer & Herter. Denied.

Plan 313, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow 4-inch T-irons placed about 2 feet on centres, filled in between with 4-inch porous terra-cotta blocks and covered on the outside with galvanized iron, to be used in place of 12-inch brick wall in front of the servants' quarters on roof, as stated in petition; east side, Fifth avenue, 27 feet 2 inches north of Eighth street. Petitioners, Turner & Kilian. Approved.

Plan 183, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the inner face of column No. 9 to be covered with expanded metal lath, the same to be thoroughly plastered with a composition of mineral wool or asbestos on all stories, as stated in petition; No. 34 East Tenth street. Petitioner, Frederick C. Browne. Approved.

Plan 514, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow building to be erected with bearing walls 27 feet apart, as stated in petition; southeast corner Riverside drive and One Hundred and Sixth street. Petitioner, Robert D. Kohn. Approved.

Plan 278, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the bay window on One Hundred and Sixtieth street to be built of 2-inch by 4-inch studs, filled in with brick, lathed and plastered on the outside with galvanized iron; also to allow the air shaft to be constructed of 2-inch by 4-inch studs, and lathed and plastered with three coats of plaster, all as stated in petition; southeast corner Morris avenue and One Hundred and Sixtieth street. Petitioner, William G. Figueroa. Denied.

Plan 439, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the front and rear walls of pent house to be constructed of 4-inch T-iron uprights, 4 feet on centres, and filled in with 4-inch fireproof blocks covered on the outside with corrugated iron, as stated in petition; Nos. 100 William and Nos. 30 and 32 Platt streets. Petitioners, De Lema & Cordes. Approved.

Plan 441, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow iron girders to be used on each floor where span exceeds 26 feet, in place of building partition walls, as stated in petition; Nos. 100 and 108 West Forty-seventh street. Petitioners, Pollard & Steinhilber. Denied.

Plan 505, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the conservatory or bay of dining-room on the second floor and bay at rear of main building, from the first floor to roof, to be constructed of angles and tees, filled in with 3-inch porous terra-cotta blocks, laid in cement mortar and covered on the exterior with copper or galvanized iron, as stated in petition; east side Fifth avenue, 25 feet 6 inches south of Seventy-eighth street. Petitioners, J. A. & J. L. Farley. Approved.

Plan 4258, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow frame extension to be extended three stories high instead of two stories and basement, also extension on side, as stated in petition; southeast corner One Hundred and Forty-ninth street and Morris avenue. Petitioner, M. J. Garvin. Approved.

Plan 459, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the use of large skylight over stair hall as 1/40 of total roof area, as stated in petition; No. 311 East Thirtieth street. Petitioner, Robert W. Gibson. Approved.

Plan 481, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the rear portion of party wall to be raised one story in height, and to build the rear wall 16 inches thick in first story and 12 inches in the second, third and fourth stories, as stated in petition; No. 530 West Twenty-second street. Petitioners, Dodge & Morrison. Approved.

Plan 1187, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow extension wall to be built 8 inches instead of 12 inches, as stated in petition; Nos. 162 and 164 West Forty-fourth street. Petitioner, William Ström. Approved.

Plan 1042, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the outside walls of third story bay window on rear and outside wall of light court in basement and first story to be constructed of 4 inches by 4 inches by 3-16-inch steel tees and angles, filled in with 4-inch hollow terra-cotta blocks laid in cement mortar, plastered on inside with terra-cotta furring and covered on outside with 16-ounce copper, as stated in petition; No. 25 West Fifty-fourth street. Petitioner, Grosvener Albery. Approved.

Plan 1086, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the erection of frame extension two stories in height above the present new brick first story, as stated in petition; south side One Hundred and Forty-ninth street, 150 feet west of Morris avenue. Petitioner, Louis Falk. Denied.

Plan 1174, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the proposed extension of first story to be built up in steel tees and angles with fireproof block filling and galvanized-iron covering, supported on one 16-inch and one 8-inch steel beam, resting on two 12-inch by 16-inch brick piers; rear wall of extension above first story to be supported on girders formed of two 10-inch steel beams, as stated in petition; No. 42 East Seventy-fifth street. Petitioner, E. Lowenhein. Approved.

Plan 1183, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the stairs, basement extension, second and third story bath-rooms and the south and west walls of bulkhead on roof to be built up in iron; the stairs and basement extension to be built up in wrought iron and wire glass, and two bath-rooms and bulkheads to be built up in steel tees and angles with fireproof block filling and galvanized-iron covering, as stated in petition; No. 27 West Fifty-first street. Petitioner, John H. Duncan. Approved.

Plan 803, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow an 8-inch brick wall 6 feet high to be built on top of present 8-inch brick foundation wall; also to allow an 8-inch brick centre wall to be built on an 18-inch thick and 4-inch deep foundation; bottom stones are 2 feet by 3 feet by 8 inches thick, as shown on plans and as stated in petition; east side Marion avenue, 50 feet south of One Hundred and Ninety-fifth street. Petitioner, F. E. Albrecht. Approved.

Plan 1087, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow frame building to be raised about 10 feet above curb level and build under same a brick story, as shown on plans and as stated in petition; south side One Hundred and Forty-ninth street, 175 feet west of Morris avenue. Petitioner, Louis Falk. Denied.

Plan 1130, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow pent house to be constructed on roof of angle iron and filled in with hollow brick, instead of brick walls, all ironwork to be covered with at least 2 inches of fireproofing, as stated in petition; No. 115 East Thirty-ninth street. Petitioner, W. E. Stone. Approved.

Application 2032, New Buildings, 1900, Brooklyn—Petition to modify the provisions of section 75 of the Building Code, Laws of 1899, so as to allow the erection of a building without the legal number of stairs; premises, one building, southeast corner of Jay and Johnson streets, Borough of Brooklyn, New York City. Petitioner, William Haedrich. Approved.

Application 2270, New Buildings, 1900, Brooklyn—Petition to modify the provisions of section 53 of the Building Code, Laws of 1899, so as to allow the use of spruce beams on first tier instead of iron; premises, one building, east side of Morrell street, 25 feet south of Varet street, in the Borough of Brooklyn, New York City. Petitioner, Julius C. Halpen. Denied.

Application 2023, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Brooklyn—Petition to modify the provisions of sections 8 and 31 of the Building Code, Laws of 1899, so as to allow the erection of one story, using an 8-inch party wall, said building covering the entire lot; premises, one building, centre of lot east side of Graham avenue, southeast corner of Grand street, in the Borough of Brooklyn, New York City. Petitioner, Rushwick Savings Bank. Approved.

Application 2222, Alterations to Buildings, 1900, Brooklyn—Petition to modify the provisions of section 142 of the Building Code, Laws of 1899, so as to allow the erection of frame extension to frame building in the fire limits; premises, one building, southeast corner of Russell place and Herkimer street, in the Borough of Brooklyn, New York City. A communication was received from Messrs. J. L. Mott & Co., of Nos. 84 to 90 Hickman street, requesting approval of Paracelain Urinal, which was referred to the President.

The Secretary was directed to forward to each Commissioner one set of drawings showing mixture and depth of concrete and general manner of constructing the Bailey and Ralph fireproof floor system, as tested and approved by the Board of Buildings.
