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#### BOARD OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.

The Board of Public Improvements of The City of New York met at the office of the Board, No. 346 Broadway, on Wednesday, November 23, 1898, at 2 o'clock r. M., pursuant to notice.

The roll was called and the following members were present and answered to their names:

GENERAL ORDINANCE emacting rules and regulations for the construction, cars, inalitenance and operation of poles, were conducts, subways and other electronal approximation, one over or under the streets or to buildings in The City of New York. He is Orlained, by the Municipal Assembly, as follows:

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CONSTRUCTION AND DESCRIPTION OF ELECTROPIAL Ducia, CONDUTTS AND SURWAYS.

Note: —By ducts, conduits or salways referred to herein shall be understood those ducts, conduits or subways already existing, or that may be rearier be constructed, within any portion of this city. By Subway Company shall be understood the owner of said ducts, conduits or subways.

Section 1. No wires, callies or other electrical conductors shall be placed in any subways, conduits or ducts now constructed or hereafter to be constructed, without the written consent of the Commissioner of Public Buildings, Lighting and Supplies being first obtained. Whenever any duly authorized corporation or person desires, or is required to place electrical conductors underground, application must be made to the Commissioner of Public Buildings, Lighting and Supplies, on forms provided for that purpose, for such accommodation as may be desired; and if the Commissioner act upon such application favorably he will direct the Sulway Company to Fornish the required accommodation in the event that the unused facilities of existing subways are insufficient to meet legitimate requirements.

In all electric work conductors, however well invalated, should always be treated as bare, to the end that under no conditions, easing or likely to exist, can a grounding or short circuit occur, and so that all leakage from conductor to conductor, or between conductor and ground, may be reduced to the minimum.

In all wring special alterion must be paid to the mechanical execution of the work. Careful and neat running, connecting, soldering, taping of conductors and securing and attaching of fittings, are specially conductive to scarnity and efficiency, and will be strongly insisted on.

In laying out an installation, except for constant-current systems, the work should, if possible, be started from a centre of distribution, and the switches and entents, controlling and connected with the several branches, be grouped together in a safe and easily accessible place, where they can be readily got at for attention or repairs. The local should be divided as creative possible among the branches, and all complicated and unnecessary wiring avoided.

The use of wire-ways for rendering concealed wiring permanently most sible to most brantily indused and recommended; and this method of accessible concealed construction is advised for general use.

Architects are orged, when drawing places and specifications, to make provision for the channeling and producting of buildings for electric-light or power wire, and in specifications for electric gas lighting to require a two-wire circuit, whether the holiding is to be wired for electric lighting or not, so that no part of the gas fixtures or gas piping be allowed to be used to the gas-lighting circuit.

AN ORDINANCE regulating temporary incumbrances upon the streets, the removal of incumbrances, the cleaning of streets and keeping them clean, and the removal of snow and ice from streets in The City of New York.

Be it Ordained by the Municipal Assembly, as follows:

#### Temporary Incumbrances and the Removal thereof.

Section 1. No person shall incumber or obstruct any street, avenue or roadway which has been opened, regulated, graded or paved according to law in The City of New York, or permit or let remain in or upon any street or sidewalk in The City of New York any building material or appliances or implements or machinery or holating sugines without a permit theretor, in writing, from the commissioner of highways, specifying the location, and upon payment to said commissioner at the sum of five dollars for a permit of longer duration in the discretion of said commissioner, said payments to be for the benefit of the city treasury. Every person receiving such permit shall give a bond to said commissioner with one or more sufficient streties in a penal sum determined by said commissioner with one or more sufficient streties in a penal sum determined by said commissioner conditioned to remove the temporary incumbrance allowed without damage or expense to the city and for prompt compliance with the manicipal ordinances and all directions and regulations of said commissioner. Every person who violates any of the provisions of this section shall pay as a penalty ten dollars for each offense and a further penalty of five dollars for each day or part of a day such obstruction or incumbrance shall continue.

Sec. 2. Building materials in the streets shall be so placed as to occupy not more than three

Sec. 2. Building materials in the streets shall be so placed as to occupy not more than three feet of the width of the carriageway of the street or avenue, and in streets or avenues where there are railroads such materials shall not be placed mater to the track than two feet, and no material shall be placed within four feet of any city lamp-post, nor within ten feet of any city fire-hydrant.

It shall be lawful for the construction of any building over five stories in beight in spect and maintain a temporary roof structure or shall in front at said building not exceeding seven feet in height above the shiewalk, as wide as necessary, and extending the whole length of the premises, but prior to the erection of any such temporary root structure as shed, permission for such construction must be first had from the commissioner of highways and its construction and maintenance shall be under his direction and supervision.

One Hundred and Fourteenth street on this block is paved with block asphalt. It appears, from a personal visit which I made in this locality, that the only reason for the lodgment of water at this increar at this time is that the Boulevard is not paved with asphalt on this side as it is on the other side. No doubt the whole of the Boulevard will be paved with asphalt as soon as funds are available. When this is done, the asphalt pavement on that avenue will be adjusted to the paveoint on One Handred and Fourteenth street, so that the water will turn the corner and flow door One Handred and Fourteenth street.

The amount of water to reach this corner is very small in any event, being only from one-quarter of the block on either side of One Hundred and Fourteenth street, so that I see no reason why the water about don't be allowed to flow along the gutters, as provided for by the grade of the streets.

In my view, a basen at this corner is onnecessary, and to unnecessarily increme the number of hours as a waste of money in the first instance and a continuous expense to the City to maintain

The additional cost would therefore be the charge for furnishing concrete foundation, and from all the papers submitted I gather that the increase will approximate the sum of \$5,950 for the area conceiled to be covered by the said contract.
