ELECTION MINUTES.

The Board of Police met on the 5th day of May, 1897.

Present—Commissioners Andrews (in the chair), Grant, Parker and Moss.

Whereas, The Board of Police Commissioners is required, under the provisions of section 8, chapter 909, Laws of 1896, to divide the City of New York into election districts upon the basis of the registration of electors for the general election held in the year 1896. Each such election district so established shall contain, as near as may be, four hundred electors, therefore Resolved, That the election districts in the several assembly districts of the City and County of New York (as hereinafter described and bounded) be divided, bounded and described as follows:
