

Sanitary Bureau.

The following is a record of the work performed in the Sanitary Bureau for the week ending February 14, 1885:

The total number of inspections made by the Sanitary Inspectors was 7,439. The number of complaints returned by the Sanitary Inspectors was 1,370.

During the past week 228 complaints were received from citizens, and referred to the Sanitary Inspectors for investigation and report.

There were issued to the consignees of vessels to discharge cargoes on vouchers from the Health Officer of the Port, 32 permits.

There were issued to consignees to discharge rags (in bulk, under bonds), 2 permits.

There were issued, under the Sanitary Code, 8 miscellaneous permits.

There were issued to scavengers to empty, clean, and disinfect privy sinks, 50 permits.

premises where contagious diseases were reported 41 visits were made, and 41 disinfections and 10 fumigations were performed.

The number of cases of contagious disease removed to Riverside Hospital was 3.

The number of vaccinations performed was 936, of which 3 were primary and 933 re-vaccinations.

There were seized and condemned 8,928 pounds of meat and 725 pounds of fish.

The number of specimens of milk examined was 72; the number of analyses of same made was I; the number of quarts of adulterated milk destroyed was 20.

The certificates of 600 births, 53 still-births, 182 marriages, and 724 deaths, reported to have taken place in this city, were received by this Bureau during the week ending Saturday, February 14, 1885. This shows a decrease of 118 births, 23 still-births, 52 marriages and 51 deaths, when compared with the number received during the preceding week, but when compared with the corresponding week of the year 1884, there was an increase of 10 births and 30 deaths, and a decrease of 16 marriages. ing week of the year 1884, there was an increase of 10 births and 30 deaths, and a decrease of 16 still-births and 39 marriages. Compared with the mortality reported during the preceding week, the deaths from measles decreased 1; whooping cough, 2; erysipelas, 1; cerebro-spinal fever, 4; puerperal diseases, 2; diarrhœal diseases, 6; phthisis pulmonalis, 28; pneumonia, 10; heart diseases, 1; aneurism, 1; marasmus, tabes mesenterica and scrofula, 6; hydrocephalus and tubercular meningitis, 1; meningitis and encephalitis, 1; convulsions, 14; apoplexy, 2; all diseases of the brain and nervous system, 8; cirrhosis and hepatitis, 5; premature and preternatural births, 5; surgical operations, 4; while the deaths from scarlatina increased 1; diphtheria, 5; croup, 7; typhoid fever, 3; rheumatism and gout, 3; bronchitis, 1; gastritis, enteritis, and peritonitis, 1; Bright's disease and nephritis, 13; cyanosis and atelectasis, 2; suicide, 1. The number of deaths from malarial fevers, inanition, alcoholism and cancer, was the same in the two successive weeks. Deaths from the principal Zymotic Diseases, Phthisis Pulmonalis, Pneumonia, Bronchitis, and Children under five years of age, reported during the week and compared with the three preceding weeks.

The ages of 141 of the persons who died during the week were reported to be under one year, 222 under two years, 290 under five years, and 57 seventy years and over, which shows that the number of deaths of children under five years of age was 22 less than the number reported during the preceding week, and represent 40.06 per cent. of the total weekly mortality.

Of the total number of deaths reported for the week, 128 were in institutions, 401 in tenement-houses, 181 in houses containing three families or less, 7 in hotels and boarding-houses, 5 in rivers, streets, boats, etc.; 16 were on the basement floor, 150 on the first, 197 on the second, 124 on the third, 82 on the fourth, 90 on the fifth, 1 on the sixth; 724 were stated to be residents of New York City, and 0 non-residents; 89 were stated to be single, 181 married, 88 widowed, and the condition of 366 was not stated; these were children who had not attained a marriageable age.

The application comes before the Commission again on a re-argument of the questions involved in the assessments. The Commission, in March, 1884, decided that no substantial injustice had been done the petitioners, and assumed that a fair valuation of the work was the price fixed by the Commission for the construction of the sewers in Sixth, Seventh and St. Nicholas avenues, decided in the Matter of Sherwood (page 107 of the minutes). In reaching this conclusion the prices assumed as correct were those given in the able brief of the Counsel for the City. On a re-examination of the questions involved, it became apparent that as the Commission had not announced in its decision the prices fixed for the various sizes of sewers on Sixth, Seventh and St. Nicholas avenues, the assumption that all were placed at \$\$ per foot (which was the price on which the Counsel for the City based his calculations) was not accurate. The average price of all the sewers was, it is true, about \$\$\$ per foot, but there were several different sizes, some of which were placed at a higher, and some at a lower price than this. As the sewers in the Bouleva

per foot throughout all the sections of the Boulevard would be as near an approximation to the prices fixed in the Sherwood case as we can reach.

The difference in price of the various sizes was entirely overlooked at the time of the original examination of the case, and our attention was not called to the fact until it became necessary to re-examine the testimony on the rehearing. As no public information was given in the decision in the matter of Sherwood as to the prices there fixed, the records being preserved only for the information of the Commission, the error in the city's brief was not unnatural.

The assumption of \$7 per foot as a fair price, is evidently much nearer the proper cost of construction, in the light of the testimony offered in these cases, than would be \$8 per foot, which we adopted in the Sherwood cases, in the assessments in which there was a large amount of the larger sized sewer.

The prices for pipe-sewer, rock and culverts, are taken at prices which we think fair to both the city and the petitioner, and we have also allowed both engineering and inspection, the former at seven per cent. on the cost of the work, and the latter at four dollars per day for the time which should have been properly consumed in the work.

The Mulholland contract, which was referred to (Matter of Thompson, page 467, Minutes), was done at a period later than the work on the Boulevard sewers, and therefore is not a fair test of value to apply in the present case. In reaching the conclusions of fair cost of the various sections, it is only proper to say that we consider that the prices in the Sherwood cases are controlling on the Commission; they were agreed upon by all the members, and should not be disturbed.

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

Sir.—There were 724 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, February 14, 1885, which is a decrease of 51, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 30 more than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1884. The actual mortality for the week ending February 7, 1885, was 736, which is 60.0 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 27.70 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,381,537.
