William A. Prendergast, Comptroller, and George T. Keyes, Secretary of the Civil Service Reform Association, addressed the Commission in the matter. There was no opposition and the Chair declared the hearing closed.

A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by striking from the exempt class, under the heading "Department of Parks," the following: 2 Assistant Superintendents of Parks, Bronx. George T. Keyes, Secretary of the Civil Service Reform Association, appeared in favor of the proposed amendment. A public hearing was had on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by striking from the exempt class, under the heading "Department of Public Charities," the following: General Inspector.

John T. Kingsbury, Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities, appeared in opposition to the proposed amendment. George T. Keyes, Secretary of the Civil Service Reform Association, appeared in favor thereof. There were no other appearances. The Commission decided to allow the position of General Inspector to remain in the exempt class and instructed the Secretary to advertise a public hearing for Friday, Jan. 12, 1917, on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by striking from the exempt class, under the heading "Department of Public Charities," the position of Confidential Inspector.

The Commission then went into regular session.

On motion, the Secretary was instructed to advertise a public hearing on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification for Monday, Jan. 12, 1917, by striking from the exempt class, under the heading "Finance Department," the following:

Chief of the Bureau of Law and Adjustment.
Collector of Assessments and Arrears.
Deputy Collector of Assessments and Arrears.

Two Deputy Receivers of Taxes in each borough.

The Commission then took up the matter of the proposed amendment of the Municipal Civil Service Classification by including in the exempt class, under the heading "Law Department," the title "Medical Consultant." On motion, the request of the Corporation Counsel for the classification in the exempt class of the position of Medical Consultant was denied, and it was

Resolved, That the Secretary be and he hereby is instructed to proceed with an open competitive examination for the position of Medical Consultant under the provisions of clause 6 of Rule VI., it being a position requiring unusual qualifications and one to which no classified title is applicable.


