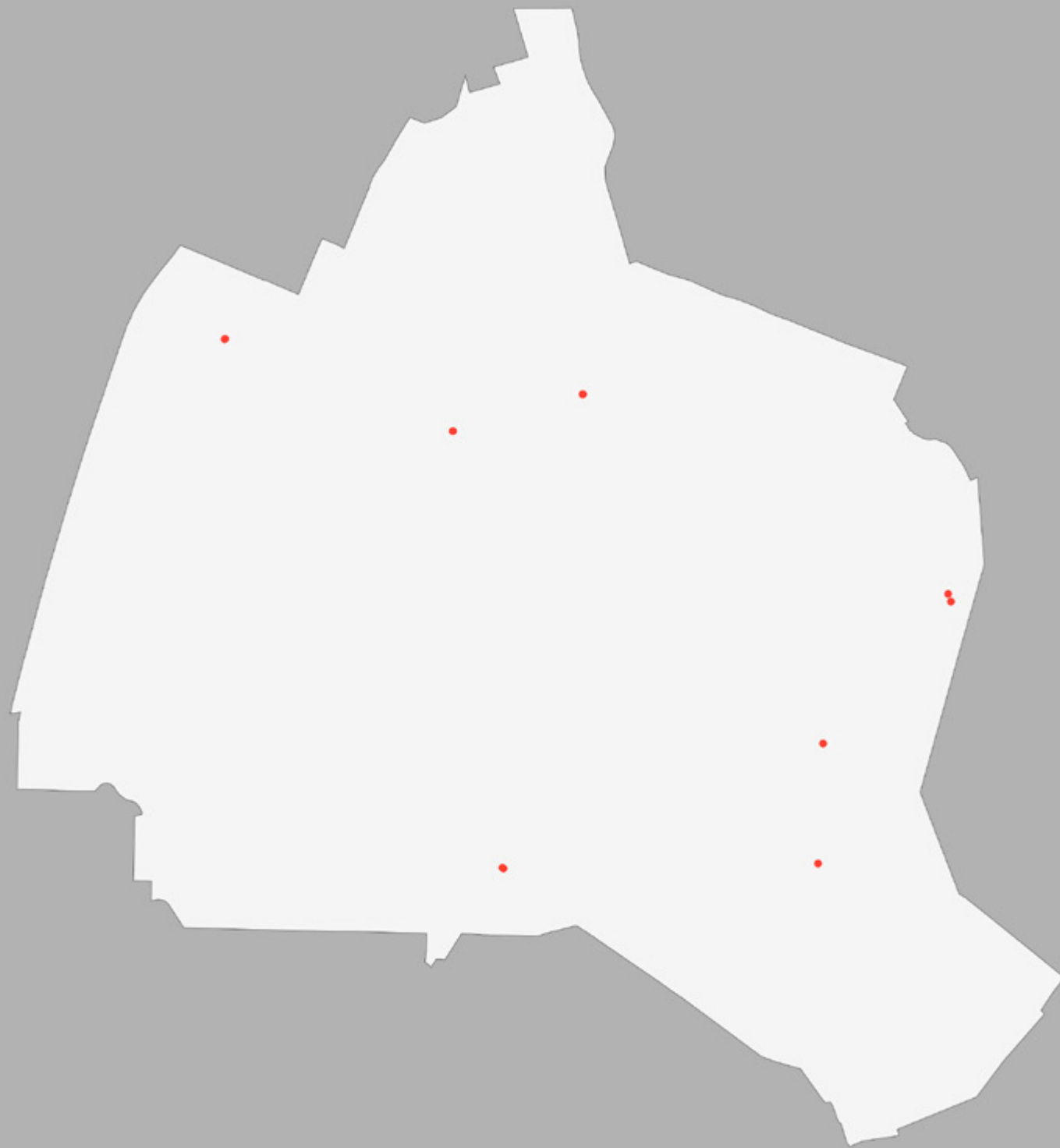
Healthy Living

Project Locations



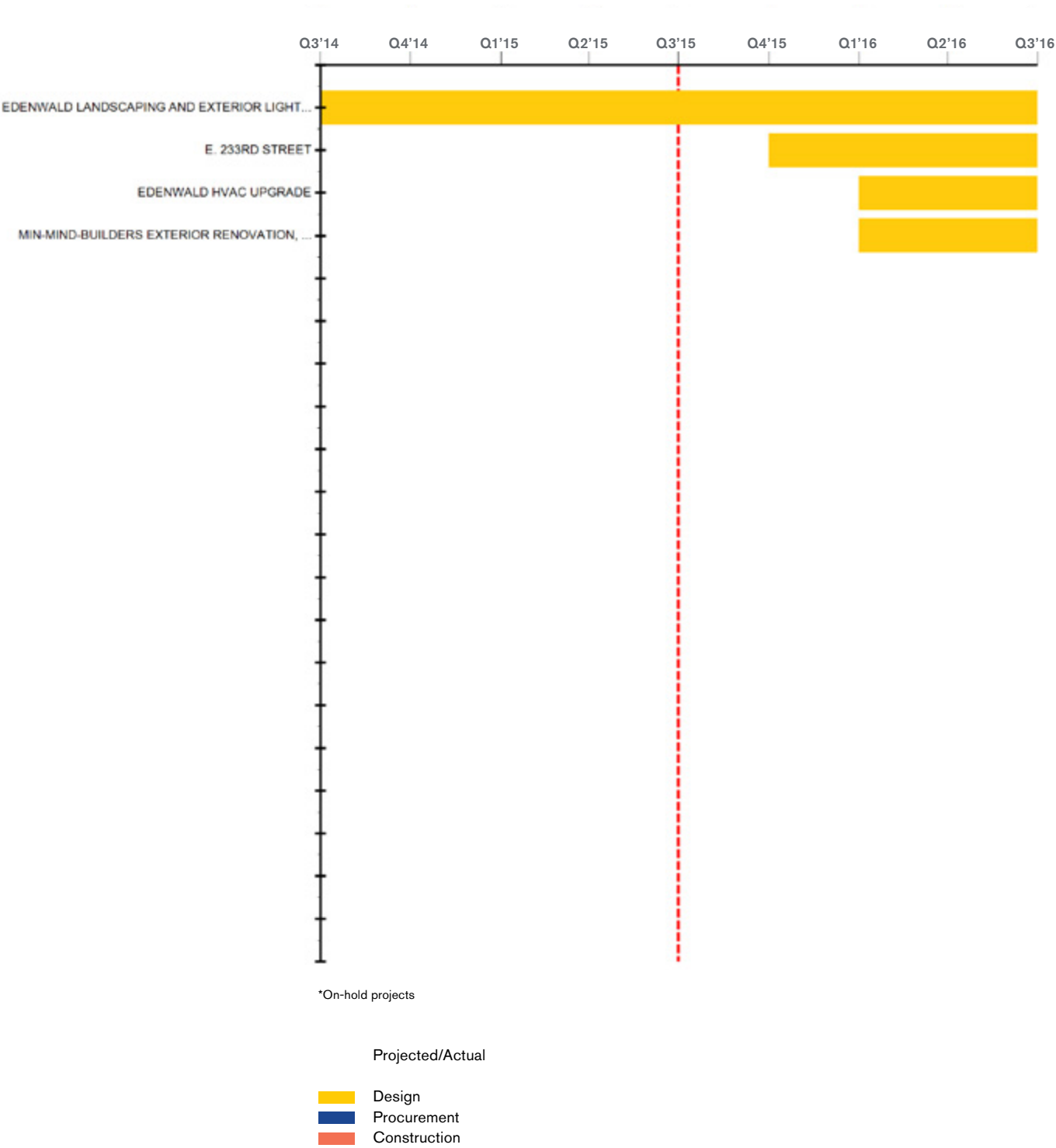

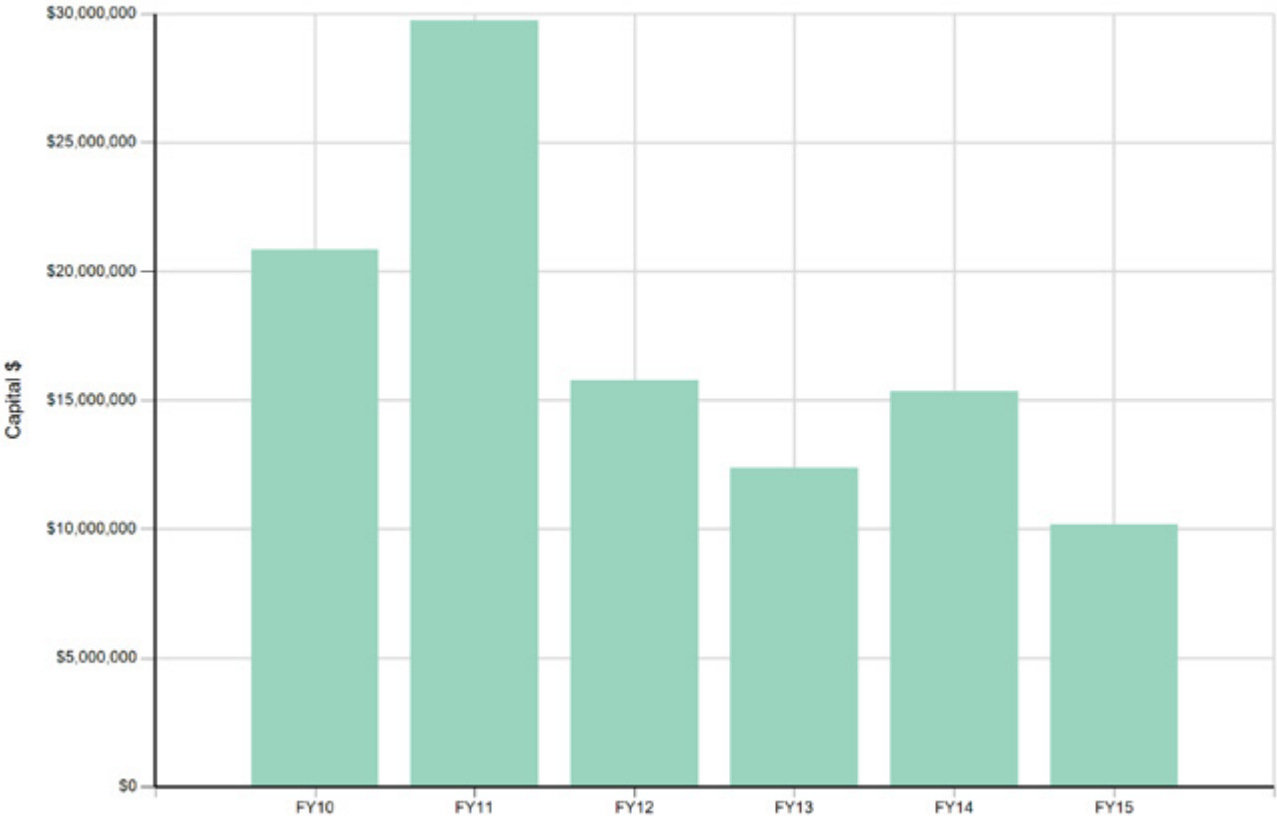
Project Schedule for Council District 12

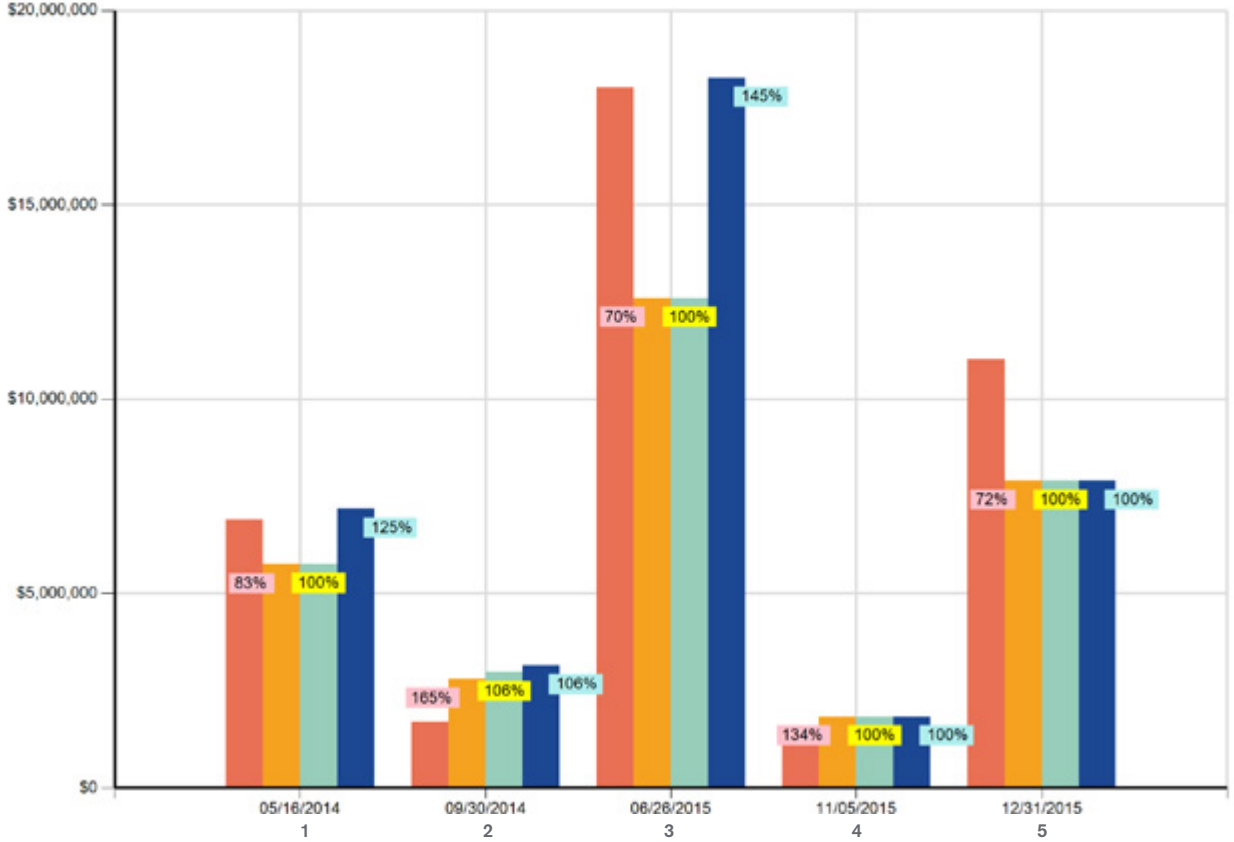


Trending Data for Council District 12

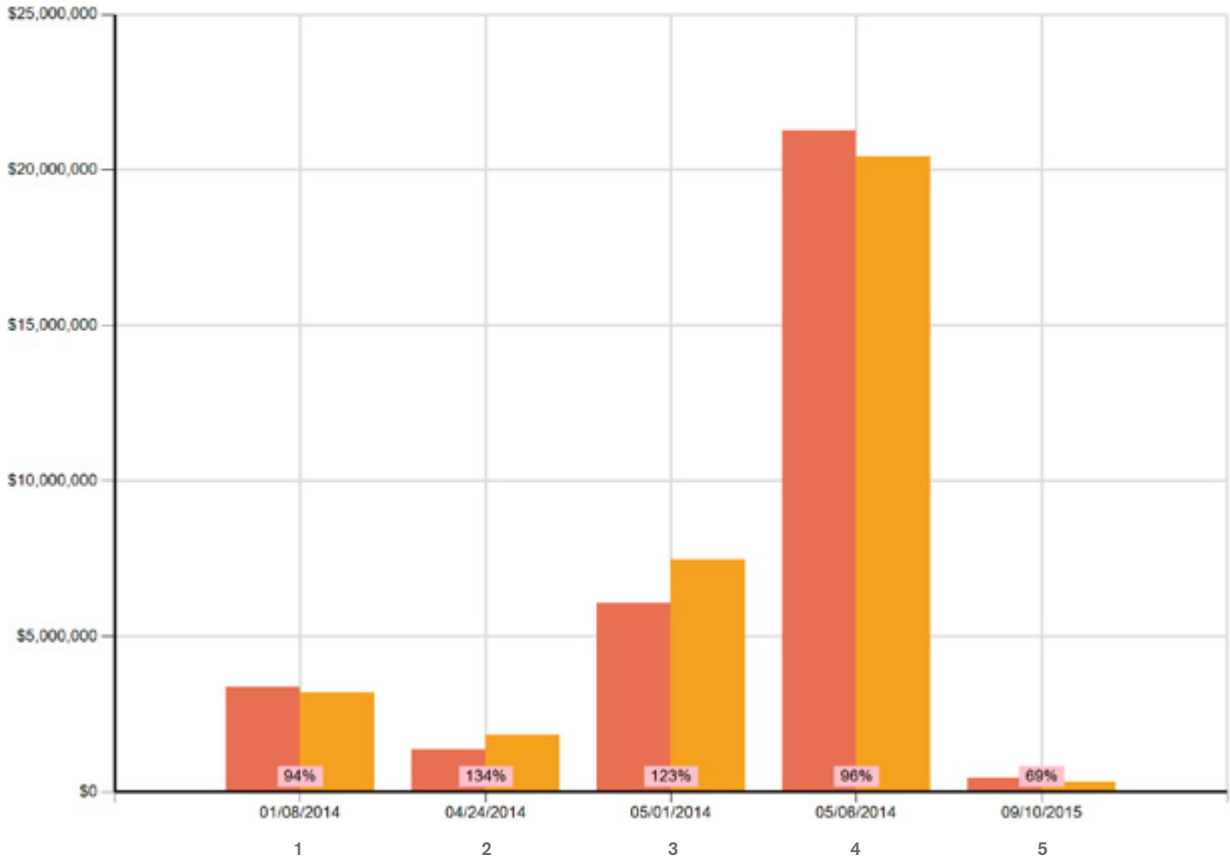
