NYC Mayor's Chief of Staff Camille Joseph Varlack



Although Women's History Month has come to an end, it is important to continue to recognize achievements women have made over the course of American history and celebrate their contributions. On the latest episode of "Prep Talk" Camille Joseph Varlack, chief of staff to New York City Mayor Eric Adams, shares her story about what inspired her to pursue a career in law, challenges women still face in the workplace, and what she hopes to accomplish in her current role.

Varlack also discusses what led her to a career in public service and why she eventually started her own law practice. Throughout her career she has overseen the City and State's response to various emergencies and talks about which disaster was the most difficult to navigate, as well as the most rewarding thing about assisting New Yorkers during emergencies.

"I really believe in service, and I always wanted to be a prosecutor," said Camille Joseph Varlack, Chief of Staff to the Mayor of New York City. "The notion that you try to bring some kind of modicum of justice to those that have been hurt or harmed in some way was something

New FEMA Learning Management System



Coming Soon: Preparations underway for new interactive learning environment EMI is finalizing the process to rollout a new Learning Management System (LMS) to enhance student training. The system provides an environment tha allows for a more interactive experience for self-paced courses, progress

The rollout is on track for late Spring, All current and former students will go through a logon and verification process the first time they visit. Your current FEMS Student ID (SIDI) information must be accurate and will be transferred the new postern.

There are some things you can do right now to make sure your account

In order to improve student training, FEMA EMI is wrapping up the process of deploying a new Learning Management System (LMS). Self-paced courses, progress tracking, and a wide range of other student services can all be found in one convenient location thanks to the system's environment.

The launch is scheduled for late spring. All current and previous students will go through a logon and confirmation process whenever they first visit. Your current FEMA Student ID (SID) information must be accurate and will be transferred to the new system.

It is extremely important to complete the following steps to ensure your student information is accurate. Completing this action will help ensure a successful migration of your student data.

1) Verify Your FEMA SID Information

Sign into your FEMA SID account at:

- FEMA Student Identification (SID) System (dhs.gov)
- Click Edit Profile, and verify the accuracy of your account information (email address, personal info., etc.)
- There are Self-help actions and FAQs available to assist you on the FEMA SID site.

2) Get a Copy of Your Transcript

Request a copy of your Student Transcript (Independent Study only)

- Sign into the Student Portal and request your transcript:
- Emergency Management Institute (EMI) | Student Portal (fema.gov)

3) Verify your Transcript

- Review your transcript for accuracy
- Make inquires for any corrections with the <u>Independent</u> <u>Study Program</u> before the new system goes live.

Brooklyn Division 7




