



The NYC CERT Standard Operating

Procedures (SOPs) provides guidance and outlines policies and procedures for you and your team to follow.



The term cybersecurity has become more common as the world moves toward a heavy dependency on utilizing the internet for communication and commerce. Common terms you may are already be familiar with are *Phising, Multi-factor Authentication (MFA)*, and *Malware*.

Here are more terms for situational awareness as you use the internet:

- Internet of Things (IoT) IoT refers to commonplace items that connect to the internet and are capable of autonomously collecting and transferring data without requiring human input.
- Distributed Denial of Service (DDoS) DDoS is a hacker tool
 that uses multiple hosts and users to bombard a website with a
 tidal wave of requests that locks up the system and forces a
 temporary shut down.
- 3. **Clickjacking c**an be used to enable the user's webcam, install malware, or access one of their online accounts by tricking the user into clicking on one object on a web page when they wanted to click on another object.
- 4. Social Engineering is a growingly popular way to access restricted resources that does not require technical hacking techniques. This strategy relies on user's trust, and works on understanding what motivates a person's actions to retrieve private information under the guise of a trusted source.




