Whereas, the said Division of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made in each case, and in accordance with the reports submitted recommends as follows:

Premises affected, (1) Buffalo, 15 W. Eagle st.; appellant, Lenore Boasberg. 1—Additional exit. 2—Prohibit occupancy. Orders issued Oct. 15, 1917. Two- and three-story nonfireproof building; no fire alarm; occupancy of building, 18; factory, 14; above the 1st floor, 7; above the 2d floor, 8; exits, one interior stairway from 3d floor to street; from 3d floor is window opening onto roof of two-story section; from 2d story section is iron balcony and stairway to roof of one-story building adjoining; from one-story building is iron stairway to next two-story building, giving access to building on Main st., which is a safe means of exit.

Recommendation: Accept the exit to roof of two-story building with egress to street while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

Premises affected, (2) Ellensburg Depot, Burke, Brushton; appellant, (F. M. Black) Mutual McDermott Milk Co. Provide inside flush water closets for use of employees (Jan. 8, 1917). Conditions at Ellensburg plant show closet now provided to be outside privy some 75 feet distant from factory, which is half covered with snow during the cold weather; men at work inside using hot water to clean cans are exposed to atmosphere.

Recommendation: Accept installation of chemical closet to be located inside.

Premises affected, (3) Gates (Lincoln Park); appellant, T. H. Symington Co. 1—Arrange exit door, 1st floor, to open out or double swing. Issued Sept. 28, 1917. Two-story frame building 60 by 35 feet; sprinkler installed; two exit doors close to each other; open in; situated on west end of building; also opening in; sixteen windows on 1st floor equipped with balance weights; size of one-half of window is 4 feet by 3 feet 6 inches; within 24 inches of floor; 20 males on 2d floor, 14 males and 5 females employed at clerical work on 1st floor.

Recommendation: Waiver of order while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

Premises affected, (4) Little Falls, Elizabeth st.; appellant, Gilbert Knitting Co. 16—Provide additional approved means of exit (March 31, 1917). Five-story building; divided lofts; sprinkler (83-a); combustibles carried; occupancy above the 2d floor, 125; exits, fireproof enclosed stairway in five-story building, doors to which are sliding fireproof, self-closing; in addition are provided double-swing wooden doors; no egress from roof; fire escape at easterly end of building, 16-inch stair, 4½-inch tread, 10-inch rise, 33-degree pitch; balconies 40 inches wide, railed 3 feet high; openings fireproof, 27 inches wide by 6 feet high; fire escape at east end, 5th floor, to roof of three-story building with passageway over roof of three-story building, giving access to tower stairway in three-story building which extends to roof with bulkhead; this fire escape has 18-inch stair, 4½-inch tread, 9½-inch rise, 53-degree pitch; balconies 41 inches wide, railed 3 feet high; fireproof opening 27 inches wide by 6 feet high, 3d floor Building "D" (3-story building) is same floor level as 2d floor "Yarn Mill," with horizontal exits on 1st and 2d floors of "Yarn Mill" provided with one self-closing fire door.

Recommendation: Accept as additional means of exit the fire escape at west end of building and fire escape from 5th floor to roof of three-story building with passageway over roof giving access to stairway in three-story building, and horizontal exits on 1st and 2d floors, when steps have been provided over parapet if wall on "D" building, and also steps to reach entrance to tower stairway, conditioned on occupancy remaining as is.

Premises affected, (5) Mamaroneck, Mamaroneck ave.; appellant, W. E. Lyon Iron Works; New York Mackintosh Co. Reduce occupancy of 2d floor (July, 1917). Four-story building provided with one interior fireproof enclosed stairway; one exterior screened stairway; sprinkler system (83-a); occupancy of 2d floor, 185; above the 2d floor, 24. An exterior screened stairway is to be erected to take care of the excess occupancy on 2d floor. Request is made to cover the openings on the course with kalamein.

Recommendation: In view of the fact that there are two good means of exit provided and a sprinkler system having two adequate sources of water supply also installed, accept kalamein covering to openings on course of this exterior screened stairway.

Premises affected, (6) Newark North Main st.; appellant, Joseph Gilbert. 1—Substantial enclosure 3½ feet high on freight elevator car. 2—Proper safety devices on elevator car (June 11, 1917). Old-style hand-power carriage hoist suspended by four cables, used in garage for raising automobiles to 2d floor. When elevator is not in use it is left at 2d floor. Impossible to equip car with safety devices.

Recommendation: No. 1 to be complied with; No. 2 to be waived.

Premises affected, (7) Bronx, New York City, 1395-97 Sedgwick ave.; appellant, E. R. Poerschke (appearing). (Aug. 17, 1917). 1—Proper screens to obscure interior of water closet compartment from workroom. 2—Sanitary base 6 inches high around walls of water closet compartment. 3—Reconstruct outside of water closet compartment to height of 4 feet of material other than wood, same to be impervious to moisture and smooth, material to be of approved type. 4—Provide between water closet fixtures in water closets used by males, partitions extending 15 inches from fixture at least 5 feet high with space between partitions not less than 28 inches; space not less than 6 inches nor more than 14 inches from bottom and floor, and not less than 1 foot from floor; door to be provided. 5—Floor of water closet compartment to slope toward urinal drain. 6—Separate water supply system to flush each urinal bowl. Re No. 1—At time of inspection there was no screen and no enclosure, and door of water closet compartment opened directly out on floor where men were at work; since inspection owner has provided a wooden screen which does not meet requirements of law, inasmuch as "L" shape ought to be affixed to other end of screen. Re No. 2—6-inch sanitary base around sidewalk of water closet, but does not meet Code requirement in that same is not covered at angle formed by base and floor. Re No. 3—Present wooden enclosure of water closet is covered with sheet metal painted a light gray paint from floor to 6 feet 3 inches above the floor; sheet metal lapped and nailed on. Re No. 4—Does not comply with Code Rule requiring partitions between water closets seats and doors to be provided. Re No. 5—There is no slope toward the urinal drain as called for by Code. Re No. 6—One tank, supposed to flush two urinals, but takes care of but one.

Recommendation: Re No. 1—Accept present screening if same be arranged so that when the door is opened bowl will not be seen. Re No. 2—Waive No. 2 and accept present metal covering. Re No. 3—Partitions to be provided between water closets. Re No. 4—Raise floor of urinals to sufficient height and slope so that same will drain directly into drain pipe outside of water closet about 6 inches from floor. Re No. 6—If present tank be repaired so as to properly flush both urinals, same will be accepted.

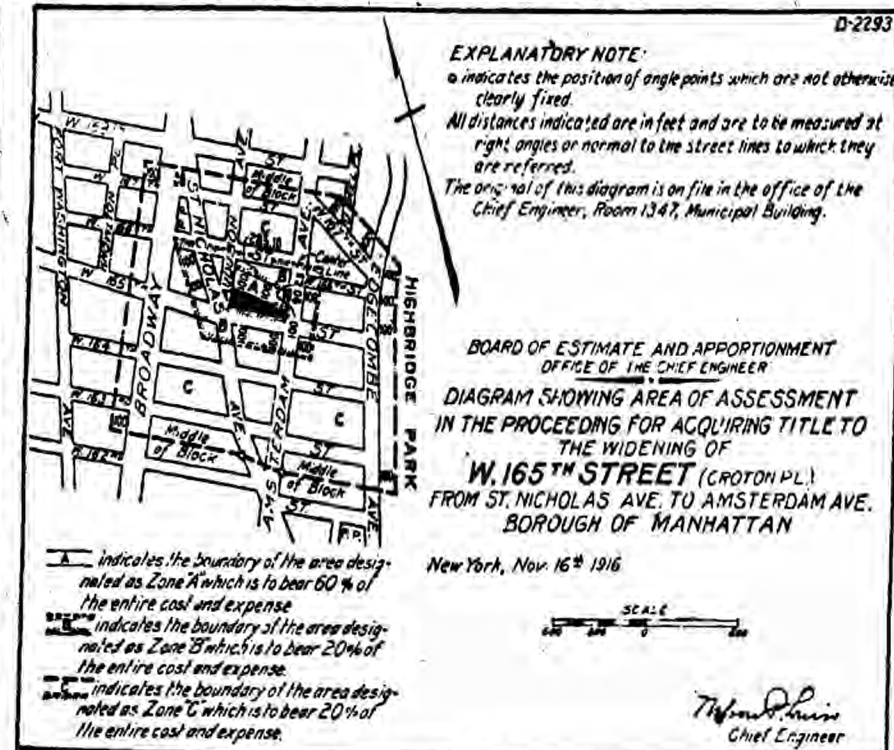

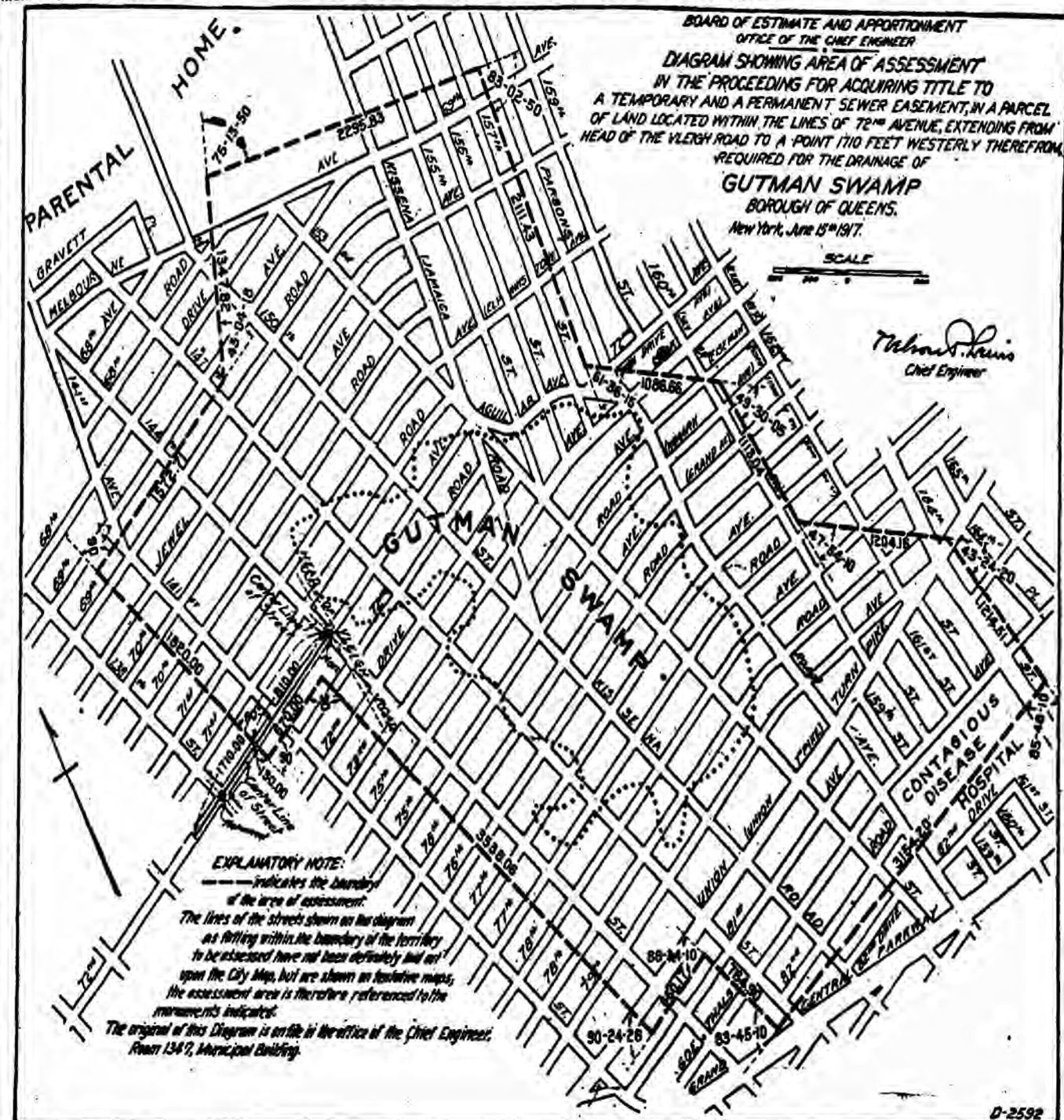

All walls, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street and the openings of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days

from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portions as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the date of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials or labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

No buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery sold for removal under these terms and conditions shall in any case be re-located or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, and if any such buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, etc., shall be re-located or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, title thereto shall thereupon become vested in The City of New York and a sale at public or private sale may be made in the same manner as if no prior sale thereof had been made.

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids, and be it further

Resolved, That while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

#### NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS ON WORK TO BE DONE FOR, OR SUPPLIES TO BE FURNISHED TO THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, or the party or parties making the bid that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.

No bid will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of such bid, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks or trust companies of The City of New York, or a check of such bank or trust company signed by a duly authorized officer thereof, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

All bids for supplies must be submitted in duplicate.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid.

For particulars as to the quantity or quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done or the supplies are to be furnished. Plans and drawings of construction work may be seen there.
