

# INCIDENT BRIEF - COVID-19 03/09/20

### **Incident Summary**

Recently, a novel (new) coronavirus was detected. A "novel coronavirus" is a strain that has not been previously seen in humans. The disease, called COVID-19, can be spread from person to person.

People have been diagnosed with this novel coronavirus in New York City (see <u>up-to-date case count</u>). New York City is seeing "community transmission," meaning the source of the infection is unknown. There are no specific vaccines or treatments available for this novel coronavirus, or any other coronavirus. However, medication and vaccine research is underway.

NYCEM continues to coordinate with City Hall, DOHMH, and our other agency partners in COVID-19 preparedness and planning efforts. NYCEM will be hosting a number of Interagency Critical Action Planning Task Forces which will include, among other areas, a focus on Private Sector engagement.

#### **Relief For Small Businesses**

• The City will provide relief for small businesses across the City seeing a reduction in revenue because of COVID-19. Businesses with fewer than 100 employees who have seen sales decreases of 25% or more will be eligible for zero interest loans of up to \$75,000 to help mitigate losses in profit. The City is also offering small businesses with fewer than 5 employees a grant to cover 40% of payroll costs for two months (an average of \$6,000) to help retain employees.
