

In a remarkable display of dedication and commitment, CERT accumulated a total of 824.57 service hours in March, with nearly 300 hours dedicated to field deployments alone. From assisting the 34th Precinct's Auxiliary Washington Heights Race to supporting Asylum Seekers and participating in St. Patrick's Day Parades in Bensonhurst and Gerritsen Beach, CERT members showcased their unwavering commitment to community service. The highlight of the month was the significant support provided during the Good Friday Procession in Bensonhurst, totaling 75 hours.

Not only did CERT members actively engage in field activities, but they also prioritized advanced training, with over 200 hours dedicated to enhancing their skills. They reported over 100 hours of independent study sessions. Spent 36 hours of learning proper communication procedures and operating a 450mHZ radio at the Bronx Point to Point Radio training.

Additionally, the time spent in planning division meetings, deployments, and other administrative duties underscored their professionalism and organizational skills, totaling 117 hours. Communication within the team was also a priority for the divisions, with 100 hours dedicated to monthly team meetings and 33 hours for buddy checks.

2024 Total Solar Eclipse



A solar eclipse will be visible over New York State on Monday, April 8th, 2024.

Various parts of New York State will see a total solar eclipse between 3:15 PM and 3:30 PM. New York City will see a partial solar eclipse at around 3:25 PM.

When watching a total or partial solar eclipse, make sure to protect your eyes by using ISO-certified solar viewing glasses ("eclipse glasses") or a safe handheld solar viewer at all times.

Keep Your Eyes Protected

- Do not look directly at the sun during the eclipse (except during the limited time of totality when the sun is completely covered by the moon—and even then, with caution).
- Sunglasses will NOT protect your eyes.
- If your eyes are exposed to the sun without the appropriate protection, it can cause "eclipse blindness," which can temporarily or permanently damage your eyes.
- One of the best ways to view a solar eclipse is through a<u>pinhole projector</u> where you look at a projected image made through a pinhole in cardboard paper. Or even easier, grab a colander from the kitchen (not the mesh kind, the one with holes in plastic or metal)!
- Another way to view a solar eclipse without harming your eyes is by using International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 12312-2 certified eclipse glasses from <u>a trusted source</u>. Further information about safe viewing, including <u>a list of eclipse glasses suppliers</u>, can be found on the <u>American Astronomical Society website</u>.


