

REPORT FOR THE THREE MONTHS ENDING JUNE 30, 1885.

SIR—I herewith transmit the list of pending actions which it has heretofore been the custom for the incumbents of this office to transmit each quarter. This particular list is one in which it is provided in section 206 of the Consolidation Act that the Counsel to the Corporation shall, once in three months, transmit to the Comptroller. It is a report merely of the names of parties to and the object of all suits pending in the department of the Corporation Counsel, when commenced and the number decided or ended, and in what manner, during the past three months.

A report such as this does not, of course, present any comprehensive and intelligent view of the operations of the Department during the period which it covers. It is my intention to inaugurate a system of periodical reporting by this Department to the Chief Executive of the city, so full that it will present even to persons entirely uninformed as to the details of the municipal administration an accurate representation of the manner in which the moneys appropriated for this Department are expended and the results accomplished by such expenditure.

I have decided not to attempt to present such a report to-day, however, for several reasons:

First—The new system of reporting which it is proposed to introduce should become permanent. It should be as much the duty of the head of the Department to prepare and transmit such reports as it is to discharge any other of his functions. The laws governing the city render it possible to accomplish this result. It is provided in section 49 of the Consolidation Act that the several Departments shall once in three months, and at such other times as the Mayor may direct, make to him, in accomplish this result. It is provided in section 49 of the Consolidation Act that the several Departments shall once in three months, and at such other times as the Mayor may direct, make to him, in such form and under such rules as he may prescribe, reports of the operations and action of the same, and each of them, which reports shall be published in the CITY RECORD. So far as I am advised, no Mayor has, since the passage of the Charter of 1873, which originally contained this section, prescribed to this Department any form or rules under which the report of its operations was to be made. From the circumstance that for many years a list of cases similar in form to that hereto annexed has been transmitted to the Mayor, I infer that at one time some Mayor directed that the reports should be in this form. It seems desirable, then, that before any report is made by this Department under the new system herein suggested, that such forms and rules as may be necessary should be prescribed, and it is my intention, long before the next quarter day draws near, to submit for your consideration a careful system of rules, accompanied with proper forms. This system will embody the suggestions contained in the exhaustive report of Mr. Horace E. Deming, lately made to you, detailing the operations of the Department for the last year, with such other suggestions as my own experience in different positions in this Department may enable me to add.

I have postponed the consideration of this question until now because the press of business during the last two months of the Court year has claimed the entire attention of all connected with the Department. It has been necessary, also, in order to obtain the foundations upon which these reports are to be based, to procure an additional series of books to contain records of work done, so arranged as to put the material from which the report is to be constructed in convenient shape. The

arranged as to put the material from which the report is to be constructed in convenient shape. The report of Mr. Deming was brought down to so recent a date that the necessity for a full report this quarter is not so great as it otherwise would have been, and the operation which has already been begun, of reorganizing and strengthening the working force of the office in certain directions, suggested by Mr. Deming, leaves it at the end of this month in such a transition state that it is highly desirable that no report of its internal organization should be made until that is completed on the new basis.
