

"The commissioner of public works shall, from time to time, establish scales of rents for the supplying of water, which rents shall be collected in the manner now provided by law, and which shall be apportioned to different classes of buildings in said city in reference to their dimensions, values, exposure to fires, ordinary ness for dwellings, stores, shops, private stables and other common purposes, number of families or occupants, or consumption of water, as increase such scale from time to time, and extend it to other descriptions of buildings and establishments. All extra charges for water shall be deemed to be included in the regular rents, and shall become a charge and lien upon the buildings which they are respectively imposed, and, if not paid, shall be returned as arrears to the clerk of arrears. Such regular rents, including the extra charges about mentioned, shall be collected from the owners or occupants of all such buildings may street or are or may be laid, and from which they can be supplied with water. Such fixtures must be kept in good order and the water not allowed to drip or waste by overrunning the sidewalk or street, or to become dangerous in winter by freezing in and about such troughs or fixtures.

No hydrant will be permitted on the sidewalk or in the front area, and any hydrant standing in a yard or alley, attached to any dwelling or building, must not be left running and hydrant freezes and becomes dangerous in winter, the supply will be shut off in addition to the penalty of five dollars imposed.

Taps at wash-bassins, water-closets, baths and mrinals must not be left running, under the penalty of five dollars for each offense, which will be strictly enforced.

Fountams or jets in hotels, porter-houses, eating-aloons, confectioneries or other buildings are strictly prohibited.

The use of hose for washing sidewalks, stoops, areas,

saloons, confectioneries or other bundings are servery prohibited.

The use of hose for washing sidewalks, stoops, areas, house-fronts, yards, court-yards, gardens, and about stables, is prohibited. Where premises are provided with wells, special permits will be issued for the use of hose, in order that the police or inspectors of this department may understand that the permission is not for the use of Croton water.

Opening fire-hydrants to fill hand sprinklers or other vessels will not be allowed.

The penalty for a valuation of any of the preceding rules and regulations will be five dollars for each offense, and if not pad when imposed will become a lien on the premises in like manner as all other charges for unpaid water rates.
