Adjourned Hearings on Legislative Bills.

The public hearings on the following bills were adjourned, by order of the Mayor, to Saturday, May 6, 1916, at 10 a. m., in the Board of Estimate and Apportionment Chamber, City Hall, Borough of Manhattan.

Senate No. 1670, Int. No. 1228, entitled an act to authorize the board of estimate and apportionment of the City of New York to allot certain lands to the International Garden Club for the establishment thereon of a horticultural garden.

Senate No. 1923, Int. No. 1473, entitled an act to amend the Greater New York charter, in relation to aldermanic districts, the division of the city into the same and the boundaries thereof, and to districts for home rule and local improvements.

Senate No. 1883, Int. No. 1448, entitled an act authorizing the police commissioner of the city of New York to rehear the charges upon which John H. Downs, formerly a patrolman in the police department of the said city, was dismissed from said department, and to reinstate him in the position formerly held by him.

Senate No. 1918, Int. No. 1468, entitled an act to amend the Greater New York charter, in relation to the powers of the board of estimate and apportionment to reconsider its action in the apportionment of the cost of certain public improvements.

No. 184.

An Ordinance to Amend Article 16 of Chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances, Relating to Signs and Show Bills.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York, as follows:
Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 211 of article 16 of chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances of The City of New York is hereby amended to read as follows:

3. Illuminated signs. In the case of an illuminated sign illuminated by electricity, a certificate must also be procured from the department of water supply, gas and electricity, certifying that the electric wiring and electric appliances of the proposed sign are in conformity with the rules and regulations of said department; and, in the case of an illuminated sign illuminated by gas, a certificate must also be procured from the fire commissioner approving of the arrangement, location, and piping of the said sign and certifying that the said sign is constructed of incombustible material and that there has been compliance with the provisions of subdivision c of subdivision 6 of section 215 of this article.

Section 2. Section 215 of article 16 of chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances of The City of New York is hereby amended to read as follows:

§215. Illuminated signs.

1. Application of preceding sections. Except as hereinafter specifically prescribed, all provisions of §§211 to 214, inclusive, of this article, shall apply to the continuance, construction, alteration, reconstruction, and maintenance of illuminated signs, as hereinafter defined.

2. Issue of permits. All permits for illuminated signs shall be issued by the city clerk, upon applications therefor, approved by the commissioner of water supply, gas and electricity and the superintendent of buildings in the case of electric signs, and, in the case of gas signs, by the fire commissioner and the superintendent of buildings. A permit or renewal thereof issued hereunder, upon the expiration thereof or within thirty days thereafter, may be renewed for a further period of one year; and, upon the payment by the applicant of the fee therefor and the surrender of the old permit, accompanied by satisfactory proof in the form of an affidavit that the illuminated sign is the same as when originally licensed, and that the wiring or piping of the sign is in good condition, the city clerk may issue the permit.

3. Definition. Any letter, word, model, sign, device, or representation, used in the nature of an advertisement, announcement, or direction, illuminated by electricity or gas, erected on any building and extending beyond the building line shall be deemed to be an illuminated sign. No such sign shall be illuminated otherwise than by electricity or gas.

4. Fee for permit. The applicant for a permit to construct or maintain an illuminated sign shall pay to the city clerk an annual fee of 10 cents for each square foot of sign space or part of square foot of sign space displayed on such sign, to be computed and collected by the city clerk. The square feet of sign space on one side of an illuminated sign, however, shall be deemed to constitute the entire number of square feet of sign space, for the purpose of computing the license fee referred to herein.

5. Consent of owner of adjoining residence. No permit shall be issued for the erection of an illuminated sign upon a building which adjoins another occupied exclusively as a private residence, until the applicant for the permit shall have filed the written consent of the owner of such residence to the erection of the proposed sign.

6. Restrictions. a. No illuminated sign shall extend more than 8 feet from the building line, nor shall any such sign be less than 10 feet in the clear above the level of the sidewalk beneath the same.

b. All illuminated signs shall be constructed entirely of metal or other incombustible material, except the insulation thereof if such sign is to be illuminated by electricity, including the uprights, supports, and braces for the same, and shall be properly and firmly attached to the building and so constructed as not to be or become dangerous.

c. If such sign is to be illuminated by gas, the gas burners for same shall be located entirely inside of the sign and so arranged and protected as to prevent the flame from being extinguished by the wind. A shut-off valve shall be placed on the gas piping extending from the building to the sign, and so arranged as to permit of the shutting off of the gas from the sign on the outside of the building, in case of necessity.

Section 3. Section 218 of article 16 of chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances of The City of New York is hereby amended to read as follows:

§218. Alteration of existing signs.

No existing fence, sign, billboard, or roof sign or sign structure shall be enlarged, rebuilt, structurally altered, or relocated, except in accordance with the provisions of this article; provided that this requirement shall not apply to the relettering of illuminated signs, except where such relettering requires a change of the wiring or piping of such signs.

Section 4. The table of section headings of article 16 of chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances of The City of New York is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

An Ordinance to Amend Section 142 of Article 13 of Chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances, Relating to Permits for Building Materials in the Streets.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of The City of New York as follows:
Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 142 of article 13 of chapter 23 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

1. Permit. The President of each borough shall have power to grant permits to builders to occupy not to exceed one-third of the carriageway of any street with building material; provided in his opinion the interests and convenience of the public will not suffer thereby. At the time of placing such material in the street, the permit so granted shall forthwith be posted in some conspicuous place on or near the material and shall be kept there so as to be readily accessible to inspection.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

Resolution Amending an Issue of Corporate Stock for the Construction of an Extension to Pier 43, North River, by Reducing the Amount from \$35,000 to \$22,000.

Resolved, That the Board of Aldermen hereby approves of and concurs in the following amended resolution adopted by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment at a stated meeting held March 17, 1916:

"Resolved, That, in accordance with the recommendation of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, by resolution adopted April 22, 1914, and subject to the concurrence herewith by the Board of Aldermen, the resolution adopted by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment March 6, 1913, and approved by the Board of Aldermen on March 25, 1913, which reads as follows:

"Resolved, That, in accordance with the recommendation of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, by resolution adopted February 26, 1913, and subject to the concurrence herewith by the Board of Aldermen, the resolution adopted by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment July 17, 1911, and approved by the Board of Aldermen on July 25, 1911, which reads as follows:

"Resolved, That, pursuant to the provisions of section 47 of the Greater New York Charter, as amended, and section 180 of the said Charter, and the recommendation of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, by resolution adopted July 12, 1911, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment hereby approves of the issue of corporate stock of The City of New York to an amount not exceeding twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) to provide means for the construction of extension to Pier 43, North River,

under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries, and that when authority therefor shall have been obtained from the Board of Aldermen, the Comptroller be and is hereby authorized to issue corporate stock of The City of New York in the manner provided by section 169 of the Greater New York Charter, the proceeds thereof to the amount of the par value of the stock to be applied to the purposes aforesaid."

"—be and the same is hereby amended to make the amount authorized read fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000)."

"—be and the same is hereby further amended to make the amount authorized read thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000).

"Provided, however, that no part of the proceeds of the corporate stock herein authorized shall be available until after the Board of Estimate and Apportionment has approved forms of contracts, plans and specifications and estimate of cost pertaining to the same and that no part of such proceeds shall be used for the payment of fees of any architect, engineer or expert until after a contract with such architect, engineer or expert has been approved by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and that no part of the proceeds of corporate stock herein authorized shall be used for the payment of any salary or wage of departmental employees, except after approval by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and in accordance with the schedules to be adopted by said Board; and be it further

"Resolved, That the Commissioner of Docks is directed to submit to this Board, for its approval, forms of contracts, plans, specifications and estimates of cost prior to the advertising for bids for work chargeable to the proceeds of the corporate stock herein authorized, and said Commissioner is also directed to submit to this Board for its approval all preliminary and final agreements with an architect or architects, engineer or engineers, expert or experts, whenever such agreements or contracts are chargeable against corporate stock herein authorized."

—be and the same is hereby further amended by striking therefrom the words and figures thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) and inserting in place thereof the words and figures twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22,000).

Cyanide used for fumigating purposes regulated.—No person shall use, or cause to be used, any hydrocyanic acid, cyanogen, or cyanide gas for the purpose of fumigating any building, vessel, or other enclosed space in the City of New York, without a permit issued therefor by the Board of Health, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of said permit, or the regulations of said Board.

All the material of the buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described areas, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street and the openings of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all openings in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days

from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portions as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting bricks, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

"No buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery sold for removal under these terms and conditions shall in any case be re-located or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, and if any such buildings, parts of buildings, fixtures or machinery, etc., shall be re-located or re-erected within the lines of any proposed street or other public improvement, title thereto shall thereupon become vested in The City of New York and a resale at public or private sale may be made in the same manner as if no prior sale thereof had been made."

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and be it further

Resolved, That while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureau or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
