#### Report of Matters Relating to Delinquent Jurors, County of New York, for the Quarter Ended March 31, 1918.

four interior stairways, two properly enclosed with fireproof partitions; doors slide on the enclosed stairways and are self-closing; imperfect horizontal exit on 2d and 3d floors; building used as machine shop, southerly section is three stories high measures 256 x 70 feet; northerly section five stories high, measures 213 x 70 feet, except at the extreme northerly end, 40 feet of which is six stories high. The center six-story section measures 70 by 86 feet and contains two fireproof enclosed stairways with sliding doors, doors provided with fusible links and are left open continuously; from the foot of fireproof enclosed stairways it is necessary to cross the first floor workroom for a distance of 70 feet to reach exterior of building; there is an unenclosed stairway in three-story section, and an unenclosed stairway in north six-story section; there is a passageway from six-story section at north and across roof to tower stair in center six-story section.

Recommendation: While occupancy is not materially increased, accept stairway in northerly 6-story section without being enclosed fire-resisting; will accept sliding doors at openings to stairway enclosure in center 6-story section on condition that said doors be left open at all times when building is open or any one at work therein; will grant exemption from providing fireproof passage from foot of center stairs to street if a free and clear passageway be maintained at all times from foot of each stairway to exit doors.

And it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardship in complying with the strict provisions of law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code on the premises noted herein, and that in granting the variations set forth the spirit of the law and of the Code will be observed and public safety secured; and

It further appearing that each of the appellants has been advised that he would be given an opportunity to appear and be heard by the Commission at his time and place if he so desired, and such of the appellants who appeared having been given a hearing, therefore

Be it resolved by the State Industrial Commission: That the appellant in each of the cases set forth herein be and he hereby granted the variation called for in the recommendation covering his respective building, with the understanding that said variation be effective only so long as the conditions remain as of this date.

Whereas, the Division of Factory Inspection has submitted to this Commission appeals from orders issued by said Division against the premises noted below, the granting of which appeals would necessitate a variation of law; and

Whereas, the said Division of Factory Inspection has had a reinspection made in each case, and, upon the report submitted, gives the conditions existing and recommends as follows:

1. Premises affected, Buffalo, 563-565 Main st.; appellant, Walter E. Bedell, Inc. Provide exits as per section 79-b. (No orders issued.) 4-story fireproof building; no sprinklers; no combustibles; no fire alarm. Exits, one interior stairway, not properly enclosed with fire resisting partitions; doors to stairway open outwardly, but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; fire escape on side of building having fireproof openings to balconies; exits remote. Occupancy of building, 4th floor, 6 to 12 (sales people), 15 to 18 (factory employees); 3rd floor, 8; 2nd floor, 12.

Recommendation: Permission to employ 30 people on the 4th floor, said number to include the mercantile and factory employees, on condition that a horizontal exit, 44 inches wide, is provided on 4th floor, conforming to section 79-f-9, which shall give access to fireproof stairway in Washington st. building, occupied by this firm, without requiring the "stairway" to be enclosed fire-resisting. A class "B" fire alarm signal system to be installed.

2. Premises affected, Buffalo, 700-702 Main st.; appellant, James N. Byers. 1—Fireproof doors at stairway. 2—Fireproof openings in stairway enclosure. 3—Exit signs at fire escape and stairway, openings each floor. 4—Red lights after dark at stairway and fire escape, openings each floor. 8—Running hot water for use of employees. (Dec., 1917.)

6-story building; no sprinklers; combustibles; fire alarm. Occupancy, 92; 62 factory employees; above 1st floor, 79; above 2nd floor, 70. Exits: One interior stairway, not properly enclosed with fire resisting partitions, doors to which open in on some floors and are sliding on 2d and 3d floors; fire escape on rear with 6-inch tread, 8-1/2 inch rise; stairs, 20 inches wide, pitched at 60 degrees; openings to balconies provided with fireproof doors, 40 inches wide by 7 feet high; balconies screened, 5 feet; exits remote; no hard egress, 13-4 inches thick; panels, 3-8 inch thick, self-closing; wired glass in doors; the glass in openings between 1st and 2d floors, 2,334 square inches; between 2d and 3d floors, 4,244 square inches; between 3d and 4th floors, 1,104 square inches; between 5th and 6th floors, 2,556 square inches. All these openings provided with wired glass; one opening to stairways on 2d and one on 3d floor has sliding door.

Recommendation: Accept pending the adoption of code rules applicable to mercantile buildings, the present stairway enclosure on condition that the lower panels of said doors be reinforced and covered with asbestos board and said doors covered with metal on each side; present wired glass transom over doors on each floor to be permanently closed. Orders 3, 4 and 8 to be complied.

3. Premises affected, Buffalo, 34 Churchill st.; appellant, Associated Manufacturers and Merchants' Association for Cutler Desk Co. 11—Mike elevator shaft fireproof. 12—Make roof of elevator shaft fireproof. 13—Provide self-closing fire doors at elevator shaft. 14—Construct elevator as per elevator code. 27—Provide eight additional wash sinks in main building. (Jan. 7, 1918, 11, 12, 13, 14, No. 95509, No. 27, No. 91514.) 2-story building connecting with main building at 2d floor by bridge, 7 feet wide; top, bottom and sides of bridge metal covered; enclosure from 1st to 2d floor of elevator complies with law; order No. 14 was issued because elevator was in process of installation when inspection was made; at time of inspection there were installed 40-inch wash sinks at 1st floor, opening to elevator supplied with fireproof door; none at 2d floor.

Recommendation: That elevator be reconstructed to meet the requirements of elevators already installed and orders 11, 12, 13 and 14 be considered complied with; No. 27 to be considered compiled with when 40-inch sinks, now installed,

have been provided with sufficient number of faucets to meet the code requirements for number of basins as per employees.

4. Premises affected, Dalton, Main st.; appellant, Wm. D. Burt. 1—Provide two exits as per section 79-a. 2—Enclose elevator fireproof. 3—Prohibit occupancy. (April 8, 1918.) 3-story non-fireproof building, portion of which was erected before Oct. 1, 1913, and portion after; open lofts; no sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm. Occupancy of building on date of inspection, 37 people; above 1st floor, 6; above 2d floor, 2. The westerly end of building measures 50x30 feet, 1,500 square feet, erected before Oct. 1, 1913; easterly end measures 3,780 square feet, or 71 per cent new construction. No plans filed; plan for elevator filed by the Warsaw Elevator Co. and approved June 1, 1917; with approval was a communication stating that elevator must be enclosed fireproof as per section 79-a. Appellant has conducted a seed packing establishment at Dalton for many years, but was not aware of the provisions of section 79-a. Building of frame construction; but one man employed at present; usual force will not be employed until September or October. Exits: Three interior stairways, one in old section parallel with north wall from 1st to 3d floors; one in easterly end of new section from 1st to 3d floors, and the third at southerly end of new section from 1st to 2d floors; westerly end of basement opens on grade; hand power elevator at easterly end of new section provided with trap doors; no fireproof enclosure; exits remote; no egress from roof. Never more than two persons on 3d floor.

Recommendation: Accept present stairways if stairway at south end be extended to 3d floor, doors at west end of basement and south end of 1st floor made to open outwardly and trap doors at elevator metal covered each side; these exits to be accepted while occupancy remains as of date of last inspection. Orders 4 and 5, relative to water closets to be complied with and dressing room to be provided at southwest end of building. Shaftway of basement elevator to be guarded by enclosing same from floor to ceiling. Elevator to be guarded on other floors with bars or other vertical enclosure, 3 feet 6 inches high; buffers to be provided in pit of new elevator; also provide wire mesh grating, No. 8 gauge, 1/2-inch mesh, on top of car and provide grating or platform under overhead sheaves.

5. Premises affected, Elmira, 114 W. Water st.; appellant, Wyckoff Realty Co. 2—Additional exit. 3—Prohibit occupancy. (Jan. 4, 1918.) 3 and 4-story buildings, erected prior to Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm. Occupancy of building, 66; above 1st floor, 25; above 2d floor, 11. Exits: One interior stairway from 3d to 4th floors in 3-story building and continued from 3d to 4th floors in 4-story section; one interior stairway in center of building from 1st to 2d floors (this portion of building occupied by another firm and stairway not accessible); one interior stairway at easterly end of section occupied by Flanagan Dry Goods Co., which stairway extends from 3d to 4th floors; two imperfect fire escapes on northerly wall of 3-story section, which have non-fireproof openings; imperfect horizontal exit on 1st, 2d and 3d floors; exits remote; no egress from roof; one fire escape is of straight ladder type and the other consists of a balcony and stair from 3d to roof of 2-story building at north.

Recommendation: Accept exits as at present constructed, on condition that door be provided in northerly wall of westerly 4-story structure leading to roof of 3-story section and door from roof of 3-story section leading to stairway in 108 W. Water st., adjoining on the east. The exit to stairway into adjoining building is accepted in lieu of providing from stairway from roof with balcony, as called for in variation hereto granted. These exits to be accepted on condition that factory occupancy be restricted to 4th floor and pending the adoption of code rules governing exit facilities from mercantile buildings.

6. Premises affected, Lockport, Elm st.; appellant, Associated Manufacturers and Merchants Assn. for Harrison Radiator Corp. 9—Make bridge from 2d floor to 2d floor of office building; comply with section 79-f-9, xx, by making doors leading thereto 44 inches wide and self-closing fire door at office end of bridge. (March 12, 1918.) There is a fireproof bridge, 44 inches wide, in the form of a horizontal exit, leading to building some ten feet distant; bridge of concrete construction and windows have metal frames; door at end of bridge leading from factory is equipped with standard fireproof door, 44 inches wide; at office end of bridge a 36-inch wooden door is provided. Order refers to last mentioned door.

Recommendation: Waive order while the building to which bridge leads is not used for factory purposes.

7. Premises affected, Mt. Vernon, 458-460 S. 10th ave.; appellant, Independent Macaroni Co., Inc. 3—Enclose exit stairs, fireproof. 6—Enclose elevator shaft, fireproof. (Nov. 28, 1917.) 2-story and cellar non-fireproof brick building erected after Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinkler; no fire alarm; no combustibles. Exits: Two interior stairways, properly enclosed with fireproof partitions; doors to same open outwardly and are self-closing. Exits, remote: A stairway extending from cellar to 1st floor only. There are two employees in cellar, who have the use of a fireproof enclosed stairway in southeast corner of building and this stairway in westerly end of building; 2d floor used to store flour; one man goes to 2d floor about five times each day long enough to empty flour into dough mixer feed; from 2d floor is fireproof stairway in northwest and southeast corners.

Recommendation: While conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, waive orders.

8. Premises affected, Richland; appellant, Curtiss Brothers. 6—Provide suitable and convenient sanitary flush water closets inside of building. (March 23, 1917.) An old privy was provided at this plant and appellant removed same and put up a new privy close to building. Privy is provided with concrete vault, constructed so as to be easily cleaned; same is in good condition; there is no running water and only alternative would be a chemical closet.

Recommendation: Waive order and accept existing installation as compliance.

9. Premises affected, Tonawanda, River rd.; appellant, Acheson Graphite Co. File No. 95654. 8—Additional exit. 9—Prohibit occupancy. 10—Enclose exit stairs. 11—Make distance between landings not greater than 12 feet 6 inches. 12—Provide fire doors at entrance to stairway enclosure. 13—Construct stairs of combustible material. (April 8, 1918.) 2-story fireproof building, erected since Oct. 1, 1913, with open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm. Occupancy, 132; above 1st floor, 3. Exit: No interior stairway, but one imperfect exterior screened stairway; no safe egress from roof.

Recommendation: In view of the small occupancy of 2d floor, accept present exterior stairway at east end of building if same be properly screened, and also accept a similar stairway, to be located at westerly end of building.

10. Premises affected, Tonawanda, River rd.; appellant, Acheson Graphite Co. File No. 95655. 5—Additional exit. 6—Prohibit occupancy. 7—Enclose stairways, fireproof. 8—Provide fire

doors at stairway opening. 9—Construct stairs of combustible material. (April 8, 1918.) 6-story fireproof factory building, erected after Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm. Occupancy, 11; above 1st floors, 2; these men cover all of the upper floors. Exit: There is an iron interior stairway, not properly enclosed with fireproof partitions; doors to same open outwardly and are self-closing; no room for another interior stairway; no egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept as first means of exit the present interior stairway and as second means of exit an iron ladder from window at 3d floor or north end of building, extending to ground; another iron ladder to be provided, which will be accessible from 4th to 5th floors, which is to be fastened on the outside of building (west side), terminating at roof of furnace building, with ladder from westerly end of building to ground; stationary iron ladder to be provided inside of building from 6th to 5th floor. Orders 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 to be waived when work called for herein has been completed.

11. Premises affected, Tonawanda, River rd.; appellant, Acheson Graphite Co. File No. 95658. 11—Additional exit. 12—Prohibit occupancy.

14—Enclose stairs. 15—Provide self-closing fire doors at stairway. 16—Skylight at top of stairway enclosure. 17—Construct stairs of combustible material. (April 19, 1918.) 1, 3 and 5-story fireproof factory building, erected since Oct. 1, 1913; divided lofts; no sprinkler; no fire alarms; no combustibles. Occupancy, 16; above 1st floor, 7; above 2d floor, 3. Exits: Two interior stairways, enclosed with fire resisting partitions and extending to 3d floor, doors to which open outwardly and are self-closing; one interior iron stairway from 3d to 5th floors; exits remote; no safe egress from roof.

Recommendation: Accept present stairways as means of egress for first three floors; 5th floor, as second egress from upper floors, while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged, an iron ladder to be firmly secured to north wall on the outside thereof, leading from window on top floor to roof, which will give access to 3d floor and the two fireproof stairways; also an iron ladder from 4th floor, securely fastened inside of building at a point remote from interior stairway, giving access to fireproof stairways from 3d floor. When above exits have been provided, waive orders 12, 14, 15, 16 and 17.

12. Premises affected, Utica, 111-113 John st.; appellant, H. D. Dixley & Sons Co. 2—Additional exit. 3—Prohibit occupancy. (Jan. 4, 1918.) 3 and 4-story buildings, erected prior to Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm. Occupancy, 66; above 1st floor, 25; above 2d floor, 11. Exits: One interior stairway from 3d to 4th floors in 3-story building and continued from 3d to 4th floors in 4-story section; one interior stairway in center of building from 1st to 2d floors (this portion of building occupied by another firm and stairway not accessible); one interior stairway at easterly end of section occupied by Flanagan Dry Goods Co., which stairway extends from 3d to 4th floors; two imperfect fire escapes on northerly wall of 3-story section, which have non-fireproof openings; imperfect horizontal exit on 1st, 2d and 3d floors; exits remote; no egress from roof; one fire escape is of straight ladder type and the other consists of a balcony and stair from 3d to roof of 2-story building at north.

Recommendation: Accept exits as at present constructed, on condition that door be provided in northerly wall of westerly 4-story structure leading to roof of 3-story section and door from roof of 3-story section leading to stairway in 108 W. Water st., adjoining on the east. The exit to stairway into adjoining building is accepted in lieu of providing from stairway from roof with balcony, as called for in variation hereto granted. These exits to be accepted on condition that factory occupancy be restricted to 4th floor and pending the adoption of code rules governing exit facilities from mercantile buildings.

Recommendation: Enclose interior stairway, which extends from 1st to 5th floors, to be enclosed with fire resisting partitions, as per Rule 504-c of the Industrial Code, said enclosure to be properly fire stopped between floors, all openings therein to be provided with self-closing fire doors, opening outwardly, so as not to obstruct the stairways. In view of the small occupancy of the 2d floor, accept as second means of exit thereto from the present interior stairway from 1st to 3d floor, provided the doorway leading to this stairway at the 2d floor is opened and an unobstructed passageway leading thereto maintained at all times. As second means of exit from 3d floor, accept the party balcony fire escape leading to adjoining building. As second means of exit from 4th floor, accept party balcony fire escape leading to adjoining building. As second means of exit from 5th floor, accept party balcony fire escape leading to adjoining building when the window on each side of the fire wall on the 5th floor has been made into a non-fireproof door, measuring at least 2 feet wide by 6 feet high. Acceptance of said balconies, conditioned on being kept free and clear of ice and snow and to be accessible at all times to the employees in building.

13. Premises affected, Utica; appellant, The Bossert Corporation. 1—Remove stationary metal bars and wire mesh that obstruct windows on 1-story building facing West ave., or so construct same as to be readily movable or removable. (Sept. 7, 1917.) Supervising Inspector reports as follows: Many windows on 1st floor of this factory have either bars or screens. This part of building faces directly on West ave. Floor space is 31,362 square feet. There are three exits from this building to Hickory st., three on West ave. and three on Linden st. I cannot see any condition in this factory that would make it necessary for employees to use these windows as a means of escape.

Recommendation: Waive of order.

14. Premises affected, Mt. Vernon, 5-7 Prospect ave. (Washburn Realty Co., Ltd.); appellant, Automatic Sprinkler Co. of America. Requesting the acceptance of the installation of the Sypho-Chemical Sprinkler service in lieu of an approved fire alarm signal system, and enclosing the stairway with fire-resisting partitions. This is a 3-story building, now vacant, which is proposed to lease for factory purposes. Only one means of exit is now provided, consisting of an interior unenclosed stairway. The architect for the owners advised me that plans for a second means of exit are being prepared. It is probable that more than 25 persons will be employed above the 2d floor and combustibles used.

Recommendation: Accept Sypho-Chemical Sprinkler installation.

15. Premises affected, Mt. Vernon, 13-15 Prospect ave. (Washburn Realty Co., Ltd.); appellant, Automatic Sprinkler Co. of America. Requesting the acceptance of the installation of the Sypho-Chemical Sprinkler system, in lieu of providing an approved fire alarm signal system, and enclosing stairway with partitions of fire resisting material. Building is three stories high, 1st floor being used for mercantile purposes, 2d floor used for the manufacture of waists by the Victor Mfg. Co., who employ 42 females and 2 males, and the 3d floor is vacant, but will be occupied by the Victor Mfg. Co. with an approximate occupancy of 40. Present exits are one interior unenclosed stairway and a fire escape.

Recommendation: Accept installation of Sypho-Chemical Sprinkler system in lieu of fire alarm signal system and enclosure of stairway, fire resisting.

And it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardship in complying with the strict provisions of law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code in the buildings noted above, and that, in granting said variations, the spirit of the law will be observed and public safety secured; and

It further appearing that each of the appellants herein has been notified that he would be

given an opportunity to appear and be heard at this time and place if he so desired, and such of the appellants who appeared having been heard by the Commission, therefore

Be it resolved by the State Industrial Commission, That each of the appellants herein be granted the variations noted in the recommendation given in each case, with the understanding that same be effective only so long as the conditions remain as of this date.

#### NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedily removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of buildings, sheds, walls, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations, and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from the demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All w/p, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street, and the openings of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture

of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portions as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the date of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials or labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers. Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furlings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.
