### BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

#### Resolution Authorizing Heads of Departments to Grant Leaves of Absence to Certain Classes of Employees.

Whereas, The New York State Firemen's Association and the Southern New York Volunteer Firemen's Association hold their annual conventions during the months of August and June, respectively; and

Whereas, Many of the employees of the City of New York and the Counties within said City are members of these associations; and

Whereas, Many of these employees perform services as volunteer firemen for the City of New York and the Boroughs now embraced in said City and many of them at the present time are performing active service as such volunteer firemen; therefore be it

Resolved, That the heads of all departments in the City of New York and the Counties therein be and they hereby are requested to grant leaves of absence to the employees of their respective departments with pay for the three days commencing on the 11th day of June, 1918, to enable them to attend the convention of the Southern New York Volunteer Firemen's Association to be held at Brooklyn, New York, and be it further

Resolved, That similar leaves of absence be granted such employees to enable them to attend the convention of the New York State Firemen's Association at Lockport, New York, on the five days commencing on August 19th, 1918.

Provided, however, that said employees attend said conventions either as members or delegates and produce suitable certificates from the secretaries of said associations testifying to such attendance, and be it further

Resolved, That this Board approves of such leaves of absence accordingly.

**Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.**

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Thursday, April 4, 1918, at 3:30 p. m.

Present—Mr. Sachs, Trustee, in the chair; Messrs. O'Keeffe, Farley and Stern, Trustees; and Mr. Coler, Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities, Ex-officio. Excused—Dr. Brannan, the President, and Mr. Paulding and Mr. Wright, Trustees.

Dr. O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows: I am in receipt of a request from Miss Stowers that Drs. Kaplan, Kleiner and Freemark, internes at Gouverneur Hospital, be permitted to ride ambulance. These men were appointed to the staff Feb. 1, 1918. Dr. T. J. Vosburgh, who resigned as Assistant Alienist in October, makes application for reinstatement to his former position. As Drs. Taylor and Miller of the Psychopathic Service have commissions, and will be called within a few days, I recommend that Dr. Vosburgh be reinstated.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows: Drs. Kaplan, Kleiner and Freemark, internes at Gouverneur Hospital, were authorized to ride on ambulance, although they do not meet the hospital requirement of six months residence on the house staff. The reinstatement of Dr. T. J. Vosburgh as Assistant Alienist was approved.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS.**

On behalf of Dr. Brannan, who attended the openings, tabulations of bids received at the office of the Central Purchase Committee on March 28, April 1, and April 3, were presented for (a)

stock fruits and vegetables; (b) meats and poultry; (c) canned goods and groceries; (d) oils, greases and lubricants; (e) paints, oils and varnishes; (f) clothing, dry goods, notions, etc. On the recommendation of the Committee on Supplies, contracts were awarded to the low formal bidders in all cases except as hereinabove mentioned. As there was not sufficient funds in the budget code for laundry, cleaning and disinfecting supplies to permit the award of all the lines advertised, the following were rejected: Lines 9, 21, 40, 46 and 48. Bids on line No 1 were rejected on account of the high prices. On paints, oils and varnishes, bids on lines 29 to 32, inclusive, for turpentine, were rejected on account of the high prices, and purchase authorized in the open market. On canned goods and groceries, line No. 47 was rejected on account of the high price and lack of competition. Bids on line No. 50 were rejected on account of the high prices. Bids on line No. 53 were rejected as the sample submitted did not conform with the kind of tea called for in the specifications. Clothing and dry goods: bids on line No. 5 were rejected for the reason that it appeared that the low bidder did not bid on the samples submitted by the department. Bids received on line No. 18 were rejected on account of the high prices. Bids received on lines Nos. 23, 25, 27, 30 and 32 were rejected on account of the high prices and purchase authorized in the open market. The tie bids received on lines Nos. 58 and 59 were rejected. Bids received on line No. 63 were also rejected. The readvertising for bids on lines Nos. 23, 25, 27, 30, 32 and 63 was authorized.

Mr. Farley reported that on that afternoon he was in conference with Murray Hulbert, Commissioner of the Department of Docks and Ferries, in regard to providing a mooring place for the camp boat "Huddleston," and reported that the Dock Commissioner has obtained the consent of the contractor for the seawall at Corlears Hook Park to moor the boat at that park as shown in detail on the blue print. Mr. Farley presented, and that he, the Dock Commissioner, would provide the necessary spikes and build the required cradle for the protection of the boat, and that he would also arrange for the towing of the boat from Bellevue to the new mooring place. All that it is necessary to do further is to obtain from the Department of Parks formal consent

to have the boat moored at that place. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried to extend a vote of thanks to the Dock Commissioner for his assistance, and request the Park Department for its consent to have the boat moored at this place. The Committee, consisting of Mr. Farley and Mr. O'Keeffe, appointed to find a proper docking place for the boat "Huddleston," was discharged, with thanks of the Board.

Mr. Farley, on behalf of the Building Committee, reported that the architect was instructed to inquire into and present estimates on the cost of one or two story hollow tile buildings at Fordham Hospital. This subject was continued with the Committee.

The Building Committee reported that they had requested Joseph H. Freedlander, the architect, to furnish an estimate and sketch plan for enlarging the nursery in connection with the maternity ward at Harlem Hospital, which subject the Building Committee has under consideration.

Mr. Farley referred to the need of providing a site for the new building for the Out Patient Department of Harlem Hospital. After discussion, this subject was referred to the Corporate Stock Budget Committee to make provision for the place in the corporate stock budget upon the receipt of an estimate of cost from the architect.

The Finance and Building Committees presented a tentative estimate of the corporate stock requirements of the department for buildings for the years 1918, 1919, 1920 and 1921, and authorized requests for such funds from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment upon the receipt of revised estimates of costs from the architects.

Under date of April 1, 1918, Dr. Brannan presented a request to the Corporation Counsel to take measures to obtain an amendment to the law regarding the payment of salaries to Internes of Bellevue and its allied hospitals, by omitting the words "without pay" from the law which sets forth that "Internes shall serve without pay." On motion, duly seconded and carried, the action of Dr. Brannan was approved.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the transfer of the following equipment to the Department of Public Charities through the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund was approved: 5 horse ambulances, 1 lot of miscellaneous harness; 1 bay horse, "Mike."

The subject of the shortage of Nurses at the present time was discussed. After consideration, the General Medical Superintendent was instructed to confer with the General Superintendent of Training Schools, with a view to adopting such measures as may be necessary to meet the situation. The following suggestions were made, with this end in view: shortening the term of general training, providing a separate short term course, arranging for a course in practical nursing, if necessary to substitute some of the nursing work by the employment of Attendants, if such can be obtained, for the tuberculosis, psychopathic, alcoholic or other services; providing rapid promotion for hard-working students or bright pupils, and, if necessary, to increase salaries, for which representations will be made to the City authorities, or provide any other proper means to obtain the required number of Nurses.

**COMMUNICATIONS.**

A letter, dated March 14, from the Director of the Tuberculosis Service of Gouverneur Hospital, transmitting the manuscript copy of the report of that Division for 1916 and 1917, which was presented at the last meeting, but action thereon deferred, was considered. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried to authorize the transmission of this report, although voluminous, to the City Record for printing, with a few modifications and exclusive of section 7, which is made up primarily of a report of a survey of the clinics made by the Bureau of Municipal Research. There is no record on file that the Department has ever given that Bureau such permission.

Three communications, dated March 26 and April 1, were presented from the

Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting copies of resolutions approving (a) franchise to maintain and use a 12-inch pipe across Gouverneur slip; (b) transfer of funds from City Fund; amendment to salary schedules; employment of measures for Bellevue and Fordham Hospitals; revision of salary sched-

ules Nos. 2026 and 2031; (c) transfer of funds to and from City Departments, which communications were ordered placed on file.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was moved, seconded and carried.

NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. The security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant, free or for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be at the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations, of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations, and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from the demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street, and the openings of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture

of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portions as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the date of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials or labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furnishings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and
